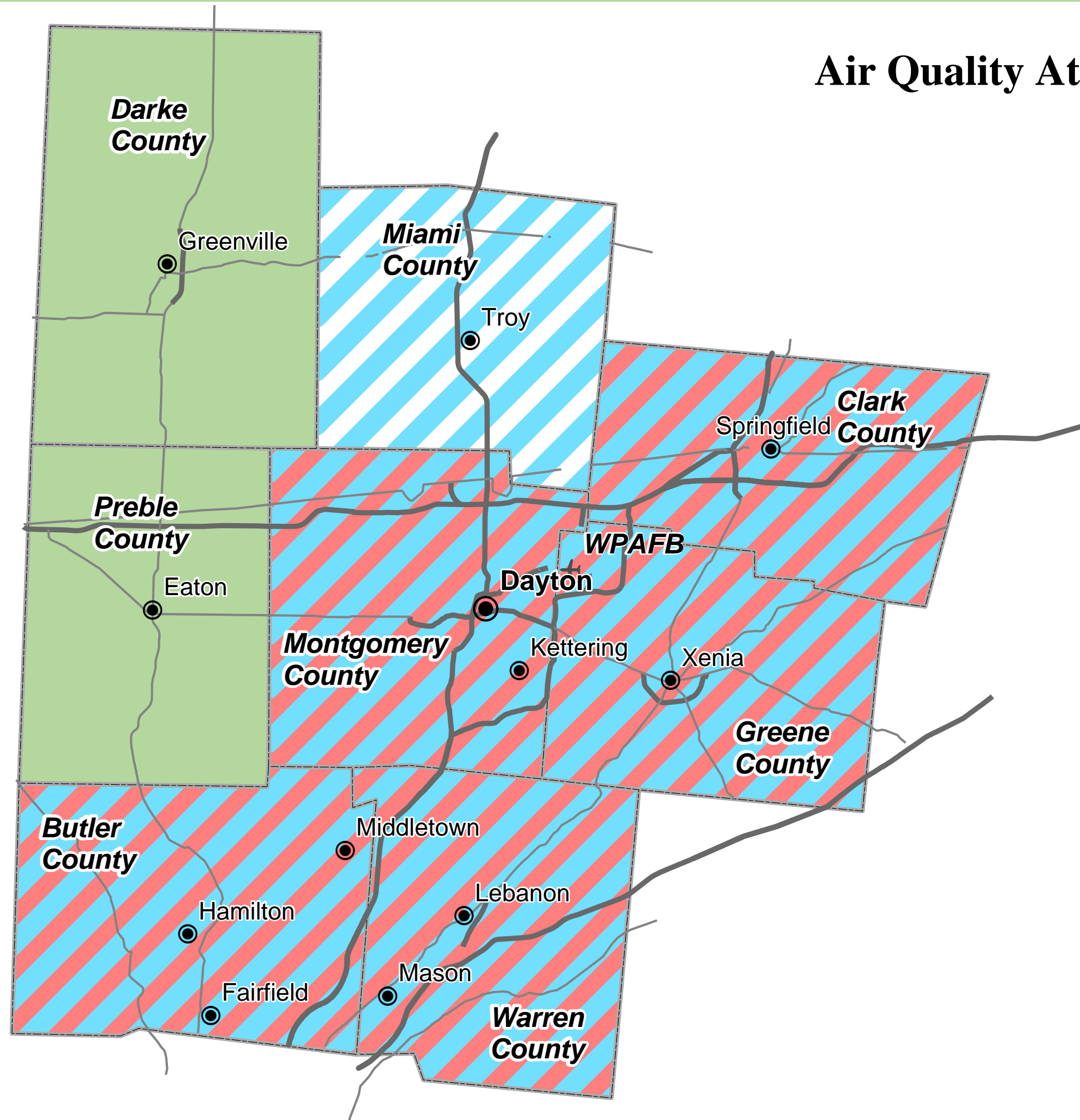


# Air Quality Attainment Status






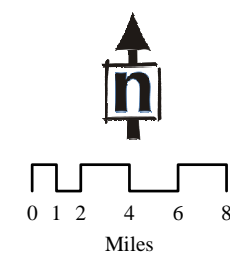
In 2004, the US EPA designated Miami, Montgomery, Clark and Greene counties as Basic Non-Attainment for ozone, and Montgomery, Clark and Greene as Basic Non-Attainment for particle pollution.

EPA designates an area as nonattainment if it has violated, or has contributed to violations of the national 8-hour ozone standard over a three-year period. EPA also may designate an area as attainment/unclassifiable, if it has 1) monitored air quality data show that area is has not violated the ozone standard over a three-year period; or if 2) there is not enough information to determine the air quality in the area.

Shown on the map are the areas in the Miami Valley Region that have been designated areas of 8-hour Ozone and PM 2.5 (particle pollution) nonattainment, as of April 2004
