

Distribution of Disabled Population

This map was part of a larger effort to identify concentrations of disadvantaged populations in the region, in order to assess their travel times.

Three scenarios were developed: 2000 Base conditions depict the existing transportation network; 2030 Existing plus Committed (2030 E+C) includes all projects currently funded in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP); and 2030 Plan includes all projects currently in the Congestion Management System (CMS) list.

A person was considered as having a disability if he/she met any of the following conditions: (1) the person was 16 years old or over and had a response of "yes" to a sensory, physical, mental, self-care, or going outside the home disability or (2) the person was 16 to 64 years old and had a response of "yes" to employment disability. A brief description of each disability category is as follows:

Sensory Disability: Blindness, deafness, or a severe vision or hearing impairment.

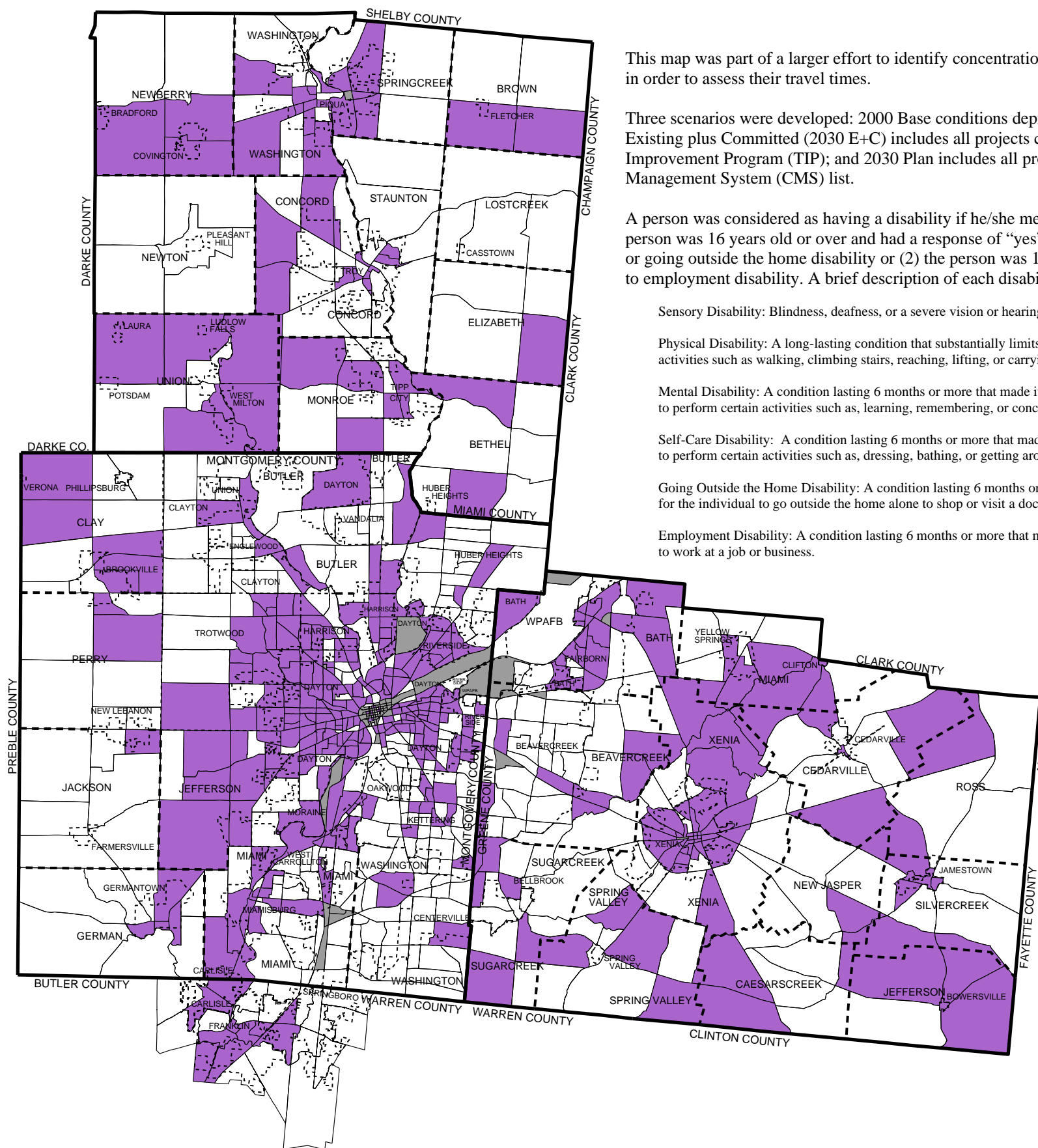
Physical Disability: A long-lasting condition that substantially limits one or more physical activities such as walking, climbing stairs, reaching, lifting, or carrying.

Mental Disability: A condition lasting 6 months or more that made it difficult for the individual to perform certain activities such as, learning, remembering, or concentrating.

Self-Care Disability: A condition lasting 6 months or more that made it difficult for the individual to perform certain activities such as, dressing, bathing, or getting around inside the home.

Going Outside the Home Disability: A condition lasting 6 months or more that made it difficult for the individual to go outside the home alone to shop or visit a doctor.

Employment Disability: A condition lasting 6 months or more that made it difficult for the individual to work at a job or business.



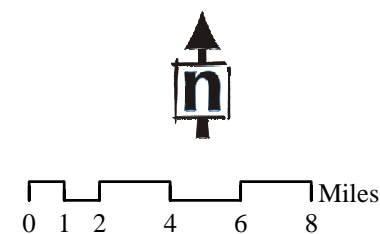
Disabled Population by County

- No Population/No Data

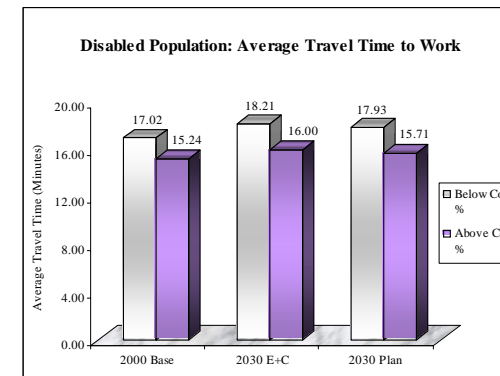
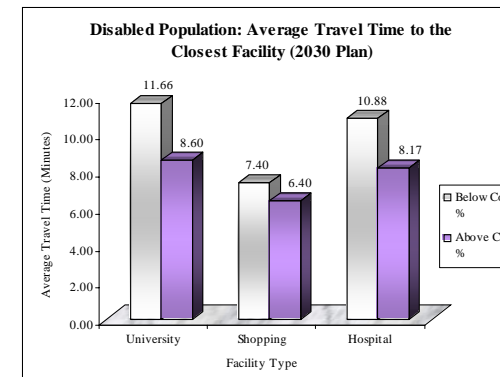
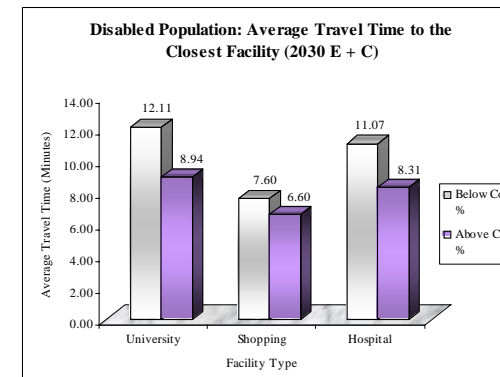
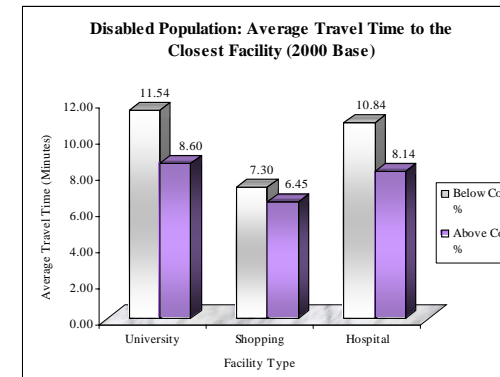
Disabled Population Percentage by County
