- Nearly \$2.1M in FHLB/DRP funds leveraged for our region's recovery!

Pathways to Homeownership Project



- Opportunity for synergy as a result of tornado recovery efforts and engagement
- Affordable Housing + Neighborhood Stabilization
- Provide qualified tornado-impacted renters with opportunities to become homeowners

Survivors – Affordable Housing Impact

- More than 2,100 families have been served through case management
- 53% of them are renters
- There was a lack of affordable rental housing pre-tornadoes
- Secondary to predatory lending/foreclosure crisis there are many substandard rental units

- More than 1,500 apartment units were condemned as a result of the tornadoes
- These include several large (300-400 unit complexes)
- Several still lie in complete disrepair
- Some are not being rebuilt

Pathway Project Applicants

31 families, all tornadoimpacted renters have applied so far

- 27 are African American
- 25 Female Head of Household
- 22 Have children in the home
- Most are currently spending between 36-40% of their income on rent



Survivor Process Overview

Interested Survivor

- Verified tornadoimpacted
- Non-homeowner
- Ability to become mortgage-ready



- 1. Survivor Applies for Program
- 2. Survivor Meets with HomeOwnership Center Counselor
 - Identifies barriers to mortgage readiness
 - Determines affordability
 - Receives Coaching and Classes
- 3. Survivor Works to Become Homeownership/Mortgage Ready
- 4. County Corp Shares Available Home Information
- Survivor Can Select and Execute a Purchase Option for a Particular Property
- 6. Home Construction is Completed
- 7. Survivor Executes Purchase
 - Survivor Secures Mortgage and Receives Down Payment Assistance to Ensure Affordability


