I. INTRODUCTION

Chair O'Brien called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were made. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. APPROVAL OF MARCH 1, 2018 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Mucher made a motion to approve the minutes. Ms. Lommatzsch seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

IV. REGIONAL STEWARD AWARD

Mr. Haddad gave appreciation for receiving the Regional Steward Award. Mr. Haddad said it was a great honor, very meaningful and thanked everyone.

V. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution of Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission to:

- 1. Adopt the MVRPC State Fiscal Year 2019 Budget
- 2. Establish the Calendar Year 2019 MVRPC Membership Assessment Rate
- 3. Adopt the MVRPC State Fiscal Year 2019 Work Program

Mr. Gilliland stated the Budget for Fiscal Year 2019 includes a narrative of the Work Program and the Membership Dues Assessment. The Work Program was presented for approval to the Executive Committee in March and sent to ODOT and other agencies for comments in April. Mr. Gilliland stated the work program is basically the same with the exception of inflation, updates and the new nine region county transit study. The membership dues assessment will remain the same. Mr. Gilliland stated these will be implemented and effective July 1, 2018.

Mr. Gilliland recommended the Board adopt the Resolution on page 91, approving the SFY 2019 MVRPC Budget, the Membership Assessment Rate and the 2019 MVRPC Work Program.

Mr. Vogt made a motion to adopt the resolution. Mr. Mann seconded. The motion passed.

VI. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to the 7th amendment to the SFY 2018-2021 TIP and the numerous changes made by MVRPC, ODOT, GDRTA and Greene CATS. He referred to the packet showing the tables broken down by county as well as the statewide line item project tables. Mr. Arnold stated FHWA and FTA are now requiring new Air Quality Analysis completions before any capacity projects can be amended. Therefore, there are 3 projects that cannot be amended: the Greene County project on page 97; the County Line Road joint project with cities Beavercreek and Centerville on page 101; and US 40 project on page 107.

Mr. Arnold stated TAC recommended the Board adopt the resolution with the exception of the three projects. Mr. Arnold stated once the Air Quality Analysis is complete for these projects they will be amended. Mr. Arnold also stated this should not delay any other projects.

Mr. Keller made a motion to recommend adoption of the resolution with amendments. Mr. Stroud seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. State FY 2018 Regional Safety Analysis Update

Mr. Lee noted the purpose of the safety analysis is to monitor crash trends during the 3-year period of 2014-2016. The goals of the crash analysis are (1) determine if the number of crashes has

increased or decreased; (2) locate high crash areas with the higher number and greater severity of crashes; and (3) identify ways of making road improvements to improve safety.

Mr. Lee stated there are approximately 58,581 total crashes in the 3-year period of 2014-2016. Out of the total number, around 42,700 were damage only or PDO with at least \$1,000 minimum damage. Mr. Lee stated 15,700 were injury causing crashes and 205 were fatal. Thirty-five percent of the 205 fatal crashes involved alcohol. A crash occurs every 27 minutes on average in our region and a fatal crash occurs every five days.

Mr. Lee referenced a graph that showed a 24% increase in fatal crashes from 2013 to 2016, highlighting how the numbers were lowest in 2013 and increased to 20,800 by 2016. Other interesting findings were included in his presentation.

Mr. Lee stated MVRPC will continue to complete the crash data analysis every three years. The next will be 2017-2019 and will also provide assistance to jurisdictions applying to safety programs such as the states Safe Routes to School. Numerous questions about the data were received & answers provided by staff.

B. Miami Valley Trails Survey Results

Mr. Lindsay talked about last year's Trails User Survey and that this is the third survey since 2009. It was initiated to meet a goal for the bikeways plan in 2008. It's also used as an objective to get a better sense of trail use, behavior and trail activity.

Mr. Lindsay stated an online survey was attempted in order for trail users to use while on a trail. The paper survey was still available but the hope was to cut down on data entry needed and data entry errors. The total online surveys were 305 while paper was 865 showing the public preferred paper surveys.

Mr. Lindsay stated handouts were given (survey infographics) to place in offices for the public. His presentation and the full report is downloadable from the MVRPC website.

VIII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin thanked all for the great presentations and reviewed his report containing articles on AccessOhio, grants and funding resources. Mr. Martin spoke about the MVRPC staff outing at Montgomery County Environmental Services to learn and encourage recycling in our building and throughout the region. Mr. Martin talked about the updates to the MVRPC website: Regional profiles, GIS Training sessions and today's presentations are now available. Mr. Martin spoke briefly on the staff changes at MVRPC. Ms. Lahman stated the Sustainability webpage is now on the MVRPC website. Mr. Beals asked for assistance with identifying markets for recyclable materials. Ms. Wallace added that "pop tops" should also be recycled to benefit the Ronald McDonald House. Ms. Schrimpf stated the DDC had their fly-in and thanked Mr. Martin for his assistance with scheduling excellent speakers for that event. Mr. Gruner commented on the future Transportation Construction Coalition fly-in. Mr. Haddad commented on businesses recycling in Amish communities in Indiana. Ms. Whitt commented on how and what churches recycle. Mr. Martin was pleased the board is very interested in recycling and the agency will continue to bring more information to them.

Subject: SFY2018-SFY2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendment #8

Over the last few months MVRPC and ODOT have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for an SFY2018-SFY2021 TIP amendment. The attached TIP Tables 4.1, 4.3 and 4.4 reflect the updated information for each specific project. Modifications to Statewide Line Item projects are shown on Table 4.6 and are provided for information only. A TIP terminology explanation chart of key abbreviations used in the highway/bikeway tables precedes Table 4.1.

Starting on May 27, 2018, TIP amendments must be developed in compliance with the transportation performance measure requirements of the FAST Act for safety measures. In November 2017 MVRPC's Board of Directors adopted a resolution supporting ODOT's safety performance management targets for the five performance measures outlined in the Fast Act. Ohio's targets infer a 1% annual reduction goal for each of the five safety performance measures. To aid in meeting those targets in the MVRPC Region, MVRPC continues to plan, program, and fund projects that have a positive impact in achieving the targets outlined in the State's HSIP report. WHEREAS, MVRPC and ODOT have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2018-SFY2021 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2018-SFY2021 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #8** to the <u>SFY2018-SFY2021 Transportation Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

Transportation Review Advisory Council (TRAC) Solicitation Update

Due to limited funds for capacity additions, TRAC decided not to accept a new round of applications at this time. However, TRAC will consider unanticipated engineering and right-of-way needs on a case-by-case basis for existing TRAC projects as they arise. Additionally, TRAC will conduct regional public hearings allowing project sponsors to provide an update about project status, development and future funding needs. ODOT Staff will adjust the TRAC calendar accordingly.

Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles (OBMV) Permissive License Plate Fees Update

The vehicle registration permissive tax is an optional tax that can be levied by counties, municipalities, and/or townships on vehicle registrations. There are nine \$5.00 levies that are available to be enacted, but only five can be in effect at any one time in any single taxing district.

Permissive tax revenue is to be used by the counties and taxing districts for planning, constructing, improving, maintaining and repairing public roads, highways, streets, and for the maintaining and repair of bridges and viaducts. A statewide map was assembled by MORPC, the Central Ohio MPO and it is included in the packet.
