The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on June 4, 2026 at 9:00 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

I. INTRODUCTIONS

Chairperson Oda called the meeting to order at 9:15 a.m. Self-introductions were made and a quorum was confirmed for the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board of Directors meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. APPROVAL OF MAY 7, 2026 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Stroud moved to approve the minutes from the May 7, 2026 Board meeting. Ms. Vonderhaar seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION ITEMS

Ms. Godsey made a comment inquiring about the source funding for recent electric charger installations and operation. Mr. Martin shared that the funding came from a federal grant that covers all related costs, and that the responsibility shifts to the land/property owner after five years. Mr. Hankins also provided insight from the Electric Vehicle Association of Ohio.

An additional comment was made inquiring about how sites are selected for electric vehicle charger installation. Mr. Martin shared that the chargers had to be installed on public land, and that all chargers installed were requested by the respective land/property owners through a solicitation process.

IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 26-17: Approving the Recommendation to the Dayton Foundation to Fund the 2026 Livable, Age-Friendly Communities Grant

Mr. Juin presented the 2026 Livable Age-Friendly Communities Grant, and expressed gratitude to the Dayton Foundation and Institute Steering Committee. Staff recommendation is to award 5 grants within this cycle: the City of Piqua, the City of Clayton, the City of Brookville, the Village of Yellow Springs and the City of Huber Heights. Mr. Martin shared that these are funds from a private donor as an age-friendly initiative.

Mr. Joseph moved to approve the recommendation. Mr. Hankins seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 26-16: Recommended Adoption of Revision #10 to MVRPC's SFY 2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to the tenth revision to the SFY 2026-2029 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He reviewed key project details for all local jurisdiction projects and tables by county. He paused for any questions about the statewide line-item project tables or any projects. Afterwards, Mr. Arnold noted staff recommends forwarding Revision #10 to the SFY 2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program to the Board of Directors.

Ms. Byrge moved to approve the recommendation. Mr. Hankins seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VI. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Air Quality Awareness Program Update

Ms. Davis provided an update regarding the Public Education and Program Outreach for the Air Quality Awareness Program, as funded by the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ). Ms. Davis expressed that MVRPC uses a mix of advertising opportunities, community partnerships, and customer service to support these programs. When air pollution is forecasted to be high, MVRPC coordinates air quality alerts using press releases, digital billboards, social media, and partnerships with WDTN and WHIO. She also shared a new MVRPC marketing opportunity featuring air quality advertisements placed on electric micro-transit "GEST" carts in downtown Dayton.

Ms. Davis then opened the floor for questions and comments.

B. Regional Air Pollution Control Agency (RAPCA) Air Quality Forecasting

Mr. Huxtable provided information regarding RAPCA's air quality forecasting operations and regional ozone monitors for 2026-2027. He noted that RAPCA currently operates 8 monitoring sites in our jurisdiction, and explained that data is shared publicly through a data acquisition system via the airnow.gov website. Specific insight was provided on the Clean Air Act, National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS), air quality monitoring, design values, and forecasting.

Mr. Huxtable presented technical details on the Regional Air Pollution Control Agency's (RAPCA) air quality forecasting. Operating as an arm of the Ohio EPA under Public Health Dayton & Montgomery County, RAPCA monitors air quality across a six-county region. Out of its 8 permanent regional monitoring sites, 6 are dedicated to measuring ozone. Under the Clean Air Act standards, Ozone and Fine Particulate Matter remain the only two regional pollutants that pose ongoing compliance challenges. Real-time monitoring data is shared with the public through airnow.gov.

Mr. Huxtable then opened the floor for questions and comments. Discussion focused on recent use of the current forecasting models, the impact of wildfires on air quality, pollution generated by mulch, and local data centers.

C. Dark Sky Ohio

Mr. Hildenbrandt addressed artificial light as a pollutant: glare, sky glow, light trespass and clutter, disrupting wildlife, adversely impacting human health, wastes money, energy, contributes to climate change and blocks our view of the universe. According to the Chicago Alley Lighting Project, there is a correlation between brightly lit alleyways and increased crime. Mr. Hildenbrandt stated that by adopting responsible lighting practices for our residences, business, roads & communities, we can provide beautiful, functional lighting and experience the awe that our natural night sky inspires.

Ms. Hildenbrandt then opened the floor for questions and comments.

VII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A. Executive Director's Update

Mr. Martin informed that the Board of Directors would not be meeting in July 2026. Mr. Martin expressed that he was thankful for his positive annual evaluation, and that he was proud to be with MVRPC for 13 years.

WHEREAS, the proposed revision is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP revision is consistent with the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP revisions such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this revision will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopt **Revision #11** to the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

Subject: Adoption of Resolution Supporting the IIJA Performance Management Targets

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) continues to place emphasis on the performance management approach first specified in the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21). It requires state DOTs, transit agencies, and MPOs to establish performance and outcome-based programs in several national priority areas.

While the various rules have different deadlines, generally, after a State DOT adopts targets for a particular rule, MPOs have 180 days from the date targets are established by a State to adopt their own targets or support the State's. The MPO deadline for adopting targets for the performance period (2026-2029) regarding pavement, bridges, travel time reliability, freight travel time reliability, emission reductions, peak hour excessive delay, and non-single occupancy travel is September 12, 2026. MVRPC has decided to support the State's targets for all applicable measures.

Exhibit 1 summarizes measures and targets regarding pavement, bridges, travel time reliability, freight travel time reliability, emission reductions, peak hour excessive delay, and non-single occupancy travel. Measures described in Exhibit 1 generally apply to the National Highway System only and are adopted every four years.

A resolution to support the IIJA performance management targets as established by ODOT is attached and staff recommends its adoption.

WHEREAS, MPOs have 180 days to set targets following the above mentioned deadlines; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC working with the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) has chosen to support ODOT's targets.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the MPO Members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby support ODOT's performance management targets as outlined in Exhibit 1 and agree to plan and program projects that contribute to the achievement of such targets.

We have Bryce Gullett who serves as our Agency Operations Technician for everything building, IT and operations support services. For Office of the Executive Director, we have hired Michele Allen to fill the reception and Administrative Assistant role. Michele has been a quick study on MVRPC and our work and has been contributing right away. Please take some time to meet Tiffany, Shannetta, and Michele when you have the opportunity.

MVRPC Releases a New Equity Analysis Results on the Comprehensive Health Condition

Recognizing that neighborhood conditions are not equal, particularly related to the underlying environmental factors and resulting health outcomes, MVRPC has conducted [the Composite Health Score Equity Analysis](#) to examine if and to what degree disparities exist among different population groups. This equity analysis was conducted similarly to the two previous ones namely the [Health Environment Assessment Equity Analysis](#) and [Built Environment Assessment Equity Analysis](#) from the PLAN4Health – Miami Valley Initiative.

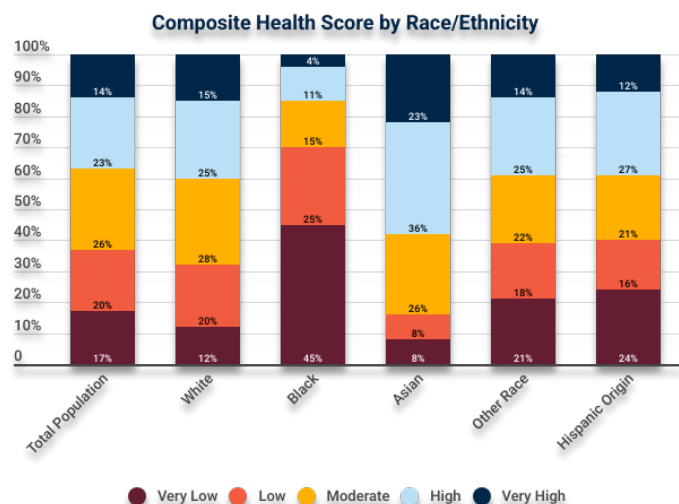


The [Composite Health Score](#) is the basis for this equity analysis, which uses MVRPC's previously published information from the Health Environment Assessment and Built Environment Assessment, as well as three health measure data from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The comprehensive “healthy” composite score, therefore, represents conditions of social determinants of health (such as education and socioeconomic status), the built environment, physical activity, physical health, and mental health.

The [Composite Health Score Equity Analysis](#) presents key findings and insights on the level of disparities by racial / ethnic groups, poverty status, and levels of urbanization (rural, suburban, urban). The chart included here is one example illustrating the distribution of Composite Health Scores among population of different race / ethnic groups.
