The Opportunity


Each ton we move from landfill to recycle/reuse saves the city about \$100

- Landfill tipping fees Cost now \$25.99 per ton
- Residential Recycling Incentive (RRI) Average \$28 per ton (Earned \$411,418 in 2014, \$400,031 in 2015)
- Garbage hauling cost Reduced 3 routes (labor, trucks, gas) with last enhancement (moved from bins to carts)
- Revenue sharing?



The Textile Opportunity:

Exhibit 5.City of Cincinnati Waste Composition - May 2012



Cincinnati landfilled 62,517 tons in 2015. 10.5% = 6564 tons



The Textile Opportunity:

Cincinnati landfilled 62,517 tons of garbage in 2015. 10.5% = 6564 tons was textiles

Potential savings

- Avoided landfill tip fees:
 \$25.99 X 6564 = \$170,598
- Avoided waste hauling cost /route reduction (labor, truck gas):
 \$100 X 6564 = \$656,400
- Extra RRI income:\$28 X 6564 = \$183,792





Textile Reuse/Recycling Out With the Old Message... In With the New

- Overcoming old message.... Only want 'Gently Used' VS. anything 'Clean and Dry'
- Identify secondary market partners who will help with diversion goals and use new message 'Damaged, stained, ripped, torn' textiles are wanted for recycling
- Hold 'Damaged textiles' recycle drives

The City of Cincinnati, in partnership with St. Vincent de Paul and The Kroger Company, is holding a textiles recycling drive to collect worn, torn or otherwise damaged clothing or household items to be recycled.

- Old ClothingShoes
- PillowsSheets
- Curtains & drapes
- Stuffed ToysFabric scraps

Textiles in any condition (worn, torn or stained). All items should be clean and dry.

Enhanced Recycling Benefits

For each 10,000 tons of waste diverted to recycling...

- Job Creation:
 - If recycled: 25 jobs created
 - If land-filled: 5 jobs created
 - If incinerated: 1 job created
- •Saves Energy: It take 90% less energy to make a 'can' from recycled aluminum, rather than virgin material
- •Reduces Pollution: Equivalent to taking 8,000 cars off the road a year
