

Community Recovery Project Proposal Guiding Principles Revisions Guide

To prepare for the final round of Community Recovery Project Proposals and the future closure of the Greater Dayton Disaster Relief Fund #8834, the following amendments to the Community Recovery Project Proposals Guiding Principles are recommended for approval from the Disaster Recovery Leadership Board.

Guiding Principle	Current Language	Proposed Language
13	The GDDRF remains open for donations and the DRLB shall assist with fundraising, communications and ongoing policy and protocols to aid the community in rebuilding and recovering post-disaster	The GDDR Fund will close for donations on December 31, 2022.
15	After the final distribution from the GDDR the fund will close and any donation made to the fund, post-closure, will be distributed by The Dayton Foundation's Governing Board to the Dayton Foundation Tornado Survivors' Pathway to Home Ownership Fund #8561 or non-profits working to advance affordable housing in our community.	Any donation made to the GDDR fund after December 31, 2022, will be deposited by The Dayton Foundation's Governing Board to the Dayton Foundation Tornado Survivors' Pathway to Home Ownership Fund #8561 or non-profits working to advance affordable housing in our community.
16	New addition	All awards made by the DLRB must be applied for and funded from the GDDR Fund #8334 by 12/31/2023. Funds remaining in the GDDR Fund #8334 after that date will be transferred to the Dayton Foundation Tornado Survivors' Pathway to Home Ownership Fund #8561 and the GDDR Fund #8334 will close.
17	New addition	Jurisdictions that are unable to utilize their award in full, for the identified purpose of the grant, may apply to the Foundaiton to have the funds redirected to another DLRB approved project within their jurisdiction, or if none, must return the remaining grant funds to the Foundation. All returned grant funds will be deposited into the Dayton Foundation Tornado Survivors' Pathway to Home Ownership Fund #8561
