RETREET PROGRAM



The Miami Valley TREEcovery Campaign, led by Keep America Beautiful through their RETREET program, is a multi-year disaster recovery effort to heal the landscape devastated by the tornadoes.

Held planting October 30th planting trees at more than 75 homesites in Trotwood, Harrison Township and Old North Dayton

Next large scale planting will be April 29, 2023

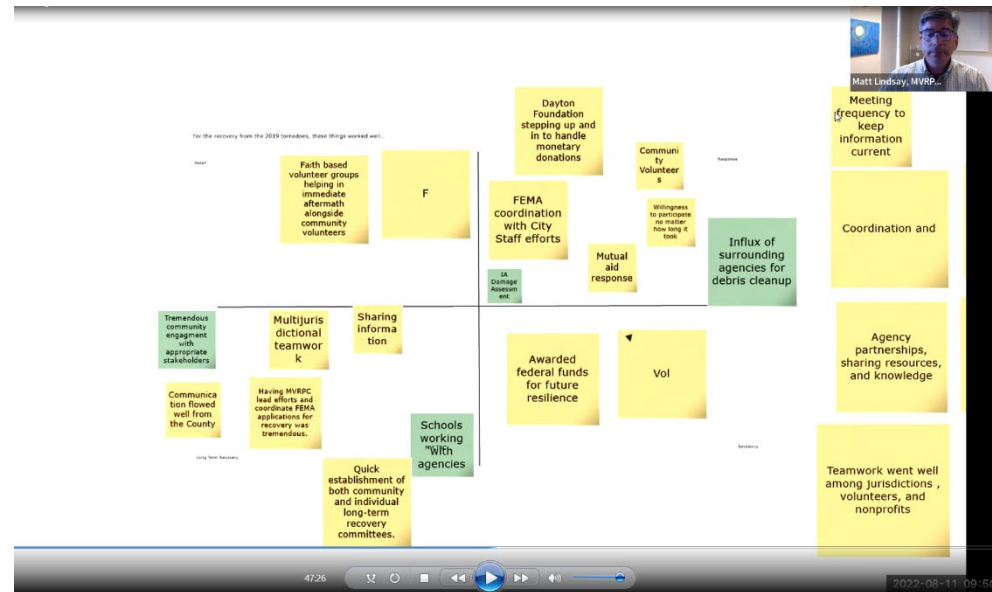
COMMUNITY RECOVERY PROJECTS

- The Greater Dayton Disaster Relief Fund at the conclusion of the Individual Recovery phase had a remaining balance of over \$800,000.
- MVRPC and The Dayton Foundation established well-defined eligibility criteria, funding parameters and a proposal process for funding of Long-Term Community Recovery projects to expend the remaining funds.
- The Disaster Recovery Leadership Board is the body that established priorities and authorize disbursement of funding.
- Projects have been awarded on a quarterly basis with three funding cycles thus far awarding over \$660,000, plus funding was made available to the RETREET program from tree removal.
- Applications were submitted for the final funding round on November 1st. A review committee will meet and provide recommendations to the full Leadership Board for project funding.



REGIONAL RESILIENCY PLANNING

- In August MVRPC hosted the first Regional Resiliency Plan Stakeholder Workshop capturing best practices and lessons learned from the region's response to the 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes.
- The Regional Resiliency Plan will unite all communities from our six county jurisdiction, emergency management professionals, first-responders, volunteer organizations and social service agencies in a common approach to preparedness and disaster response.



REGIONAL RESILIENCY PLANNING

- Establish committees based on Recovery Support Functions outlined in the Department of Homeland Security's National Disaster Recovery Framework.
- To date the Health & Social Services, Community Planning & Capacity Building, and Natural & Cultural Resources committees have met.

Recovery Support Functions

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| Community Planning & Capacity Building | Unifies and coordinates expertise and assistance programs between both governmental as well as non-government partners to ensure engagement of the whole community in planning and managing recovery. |
| Economic Recovery | Helps levels of government and the private sector sustain or rebuild businesses and employment. |
| Health & Social Services | Supports recovery in public health, health care facilities and coalitions, and essential social services. |
| Housing | Coordinates resources for adequate, affordable, equitable, and accessible housing to support the whole community. |
| Infrastructure Systems | Helps restore infrastructure systems and services, and improves resilience for future hazards. |
| Natural & Cultural Resources | Works to protect and restore natural and cultural resources and historic properties. |

Disaster Recovery Leadership Board Transition

- In October the DRLB meet to discuss status of recovery and develop a transition plan
- At the time of the board's institution it was thought recovery would take an additional 6-8 years after individual recovery was completed.
- Community recovery sits at over 93% and funding requests through the GDDRF have decreased.
- The board was presented a transition plan which will restructure the remaining two recovery phases into one final phase a board leadership.
- The recovery timeline and phases of board leadership will be reviewed on an annual basis and adjusted accordingly.
