The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on February 4, 2021 at 9:00 a.m. via Zoom Video Conference (<https://02web.zoom.us/j/87647642836>). All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

**I. INTRODUCTIONS**

Chairperson Chris Mucher, Miami Township – Greene Co., called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Ms. Teresa Lombardelli, MVRPC, did a roll call by jurisdiction.

Ms. Georgeann Godsey, Harrison Township, thanked everyone for their condolences in regards to the unexpected passing of Mr. Ron Casey, Harrison Township Trustee. Ms. Godsey said this was a shock and tremendous loss to the Harrison Township community. Ms. Godsey requested a moment of silence in memory of Mr. Casey.

## **II. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by our Chairperson Chris Mucher.

## **III. APPROVAL OF DECEMBER 3, 2020 MEETING MINUTES**

Mr. John Bruns, City of Union, made a motion to approve the minutes from the December 3, 2020 Board meeting. Mr. Greg Simmons, Miami County, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **V. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS**

### **A. Recommended Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY 2021-2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)**

Mr. Paul Arnold, MVRPC, referred to the amendment #7 to the SFY 2021-2024 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC, ODOT and GDRTA. He referenced the packet showing the tables broken down by county, as well as the statewide line item project tables. Mr. Arnold stated the TAC recommends the Board of Directors approving the resolution on page 27.

Mr. Dale Berry, Washington Township, made a motion to approve amending the SFY2021-SFY2024 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Mr. Paul Gruner, Montgomery County Engineer, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

### **B. Recommend Approval of FY2022 Transportation and Government Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects**

Mr. Brad Daniel, MVRPC, referred to the request of approval for the FY2022 Transportation and Government Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC Projects). He referenced the packet showing the list of projects requesting funding for the Transportation and Government Services.

Mr. Matt Joseph, City of Dayton, thanked Ms. Amy Schrimpf and her colleagues at the Dayton Development Coalition for keeping this process going for these many years. With the impending return of earmarks, Mr. Joseph stated the community will have a bigger chance of having a 'say' again in what projects gets done. He knows keeping the process together has not been easy, but wanted Ms. Schrimpf to know and to take it back to her colleagues for having to keep this process together through these years.

Ms. Schrimpf thanked Mr. Joseph for his comments. Ms. Schrimpf stated they are hearing that the earmarks may be coming back and this process will have a more significant this year, so she thanked Mr. Joseph for that. Also, Ms. Schrimpf thanked Mr. Brad Daniel and Mr. Brian O. Martin for leading the side of the Transportation and Government Services.

Mr. Daniel thanked Mr. Joseph for his comment. Also, he thanked Ms. Schrimpf for all that the Dayton Development Coalition do.

Mr. Daniel stated MVRPC staff and TAC recommends the Board of Directors adopt the list of categorized Transportation and Government Service Projects listed in Exhibit 1 on page 31 and the resolution on page 35.

Mr. Tony Klepacz, City of Kettering, made a motion to approve adopting the Review Panel Categorization for the FY2022 Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Transportation and Government Services Projects. Mr. Matt Joseph, City of Dayton, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**C. Recommend Approval of MVRPC's Title VI Program**

Mr. Carlton Eley, MVRPC, referenced the packet and discussed modifications, including recent edits following ODOT's review of the program plan. The Federal Transportation Funds (grant funding) passes through ODOT to MVRPC. MVRPC has established policies and procedures to be in compliance with the Title VI requirements for receiving and spending Federal and State transportation funding. A change to Federal Transit Administration (FTA) regulations requires an approval by the Metropolitan Planning Organization Board prior to submission. Mr. Eley stated MVRPC recommends the Board of Directors approving the resolution on page 67.

Mr. Bill Serr, City of Centerville, made a motion to adopt the MVRPC's Title VI Program. Ms. Judy Dodge, Montgomery County, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**VI. INFORMATION ITEMS**

**A. Long Term Disaster Recovery Update**

Ms. Stacy Schweikhart, MVRPC, provided an update in regards to Long Term Disaster Recovery. MVRPC is the designated leader of the Long Term Community Disaster Recovery Network and helping the communities impacted by the devastating 2019 Memorial Day tornadoes, and creating a plan for recovery and resiliency. Because the tornadoes crossed over three counties and so many jurisdictions, within those counties, a Regional perspective on recovery was needed and this was part of the role for MVRPC.

Each month, the MVRPC convenes the leaders from the impacted communities and Ms. Schweikhart meets regularly with the non-profit and faith-based organizations that are providing services and outreach to those individuals impacted by the tornadoes to ensure that recovery assistance is well-coordinated.

During the 2020 year, the MVRPC and the Dayton Foundation formed a Disaster Recovery Leadership Board (a list of members is located on page 71), which meets quarterly to think strategically; craft a vision and align resources to figure out where they need to do some advocacy or fund raising or other partnership collaboration efforts to support the recovery going on in all of those communities.

For the last eighteen months, we have a total of \$34.7 million in Federal Investments to date and \$37.5 million dollars in pending awards.

- \$14 million in FEMA Public Assistance;
- \$12.5 million in HUD CDBG-DR Program Funds;
- \$8.2 million in EDA Economic Recovery Projects and
- \$2.8 million in EDA Economic Recovery Projects pending awards

- Due to the changeover in the Federal Administration, the changing leadership of the Department of Commerce has a few things on hold.

The Long Term Recovery Operations Group is comprised of leaders from community, nonprofit and faith-based organizations committed to helping those impacted by the tornadoes piece their lives back together. Sinclair Community has loaned out Ms. Laura Mercer for two and half years to manage and run the Individual Recovery Team. Ms. Schweikhart displayed pictures of the extraordinary work that is underway on houses impacted by the tornadoes.

Ms. Schweikhart gave an update on the Disaster Recovery Dashboards. Ms. Schweikhart stated this is an amazing project done by the MVRPC Staff (Mr. Martin Kim, Mr. Tom Harner and Mr. Milo Simpson). During our last meeting, Mr. Martin Kim talked about the work that he and his team has done here at MVRPC in regards to the Disaster Recovery Dashboards. Ms. Schweikhart stated an article about the Dashboards was listed in the Dayton Daily Newspaper last weekend. Ms. Schweikhart provided a link (<https://arcg.is/qSqDj>) to access the Dashboards.

She discussed the Individual Recovery Dashboard, which is the data that is provided by the case managers (Red Cross and Catholic Social Services) for the status of individual survivor recovery. The overall survivor recovery rate across all three counties is 77.46%. The Property Recovery Dashboard is the data provided by the impacted jurisdictions. Ms. Schweikhart gave a huge thanks to those jurisdictions that actually went out and put eyes on every property that was on the Auditor's list of having disaster damage and to let us know where things were.

RETREET is a national organization that is supported nationally by Home Depot Foundation and Keep America Beautiful and they focus on repairing the tree canopy damaged as a result of the storm. In October, the CEO of RETREET visited us from Texas and met with the leaders of the impacted jurisdictions in Beavercreek, Dayton, Trotwood and Harrison Township to talk about RETREET coming to our community likely this fall. RETREET will work with the impacted communities on a process that they have refined to help those residents that would like new trees on their properties.

The Individual Recovery Group led by Ms. Laura Mercer, Sinclair Community College, was built to be in existence for two to three years to help the survivors get back on their feet and to go through the bulk of the repair and rebuild work. They have done a great job in helping the survivors recover and they are wrapping up in October 2021.

The Pathways Project is a unique project that grew up from the conversations for the repair and rebuild to help the needs of our survivors. They worked with the impacted jurisdictions, the VOAD Teams and the local resources to do a project empowering survivors to become qualified to own a home for the first time. They will have the opportunity to purchase a home in the disaster impacted communities where they were renters at the time of the storm. A unique stack of funding made this possible.

In 2021, we will be launching a Regional Resiliency Planning Effort. All of our emergency management-county level emergency management agencies have an Emergency Management and Disaster Response Plan. We will be working on documenting the lessons learned from this series of tornadoes for the entire Region by creating a tool kit and best practices that all jurisdictions in our Region build in resiliency before another disaster strikes.

## VII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Brian O. Martin, MVRPC, noted we are kicking off 2021 so well with such great attendance. Today is his 8th anniversary with MVRPC. He said it is his joy and pleasure to be here to serve you. Hopefully, he can continue to serve you for another eight years.

### A. Executive Director's Update

Mr. Martin reviewed the ED Update:

- **2021 MVRPC Climate Change Seminar to Focus on Climate Justice**  
The MVRPC invites you to participate in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Miami Valley Climate Change Seminar on Wednesday, February 24, 2021 at 10:00 a.m. Our guest speaker will be Ms. Jacqueline Patterson, Director of the NAACP Environmental and Climate Justice Program. This is a free virtual event and will feature a focused conversation on Climate Justice.
- **Regional Equity Initiative Manager Assists Members with Equity Planning**  
The City of Huber Heights has a new group called the Culture and Diversity Citizen Action Commission. Mr. Carlton Eley, MVRPC, attended their meeting and shared some background and resources relevant to their interest in a community needs assessment.

If you have resolutions passed or committees being formed, please let MVRPC know, so that we can have a calendar of all the meetings and provide support as you may need it.

- **Dayton Rotary Club**  
Mr. Martin is the president of the Dayton Rotary Club. Mr. Gary Golden, Futurist, will be the guest speaker on Monday, February 8, 2021. Mr. Martin invited this group to participate. He provided a link (<https://us02web.zoom.us/j/84802876662>; Meeting ID: 848 0287 6662 and Passcode: 207103) to register for this free event.
- **MVRPC Staff**  
Mr. Martin stated Ms. Teresa Lombardelli will be out of the office for six weeks. He asked everyone to keep Ms. Lombardelli and her family in your prayers. While Ms. Lombardelli is out of the office, the MVRPC staff will be pitching in to make sure the operation continues.

Mr. Martin informed the group of Ms. Savannah Diamond being hired as the new Administrative Assistant and plans to begin employment in March.

Mr. Martin reviewed the rest of the ED Update and Upcoming MVRPC Meetings.

Mr. Martin thanked the staff for continuing the work of the Agency.

### B. March 2021 Caucus

- In regards to the Caucus for March 2021, MVRPC will send a memo that discusses the slate of officers. Our current officers (Chris Mucher, Chairperson, Greg Simmons, Vice First Chair, and Sara Lommatzsch, Second Vice Chair) are eligible to serve one more year. Mr. Martin believes as long as they are running they will be our slate of officers. Mr. Martin stated we have a committee set up thanks to Ms. Kathelyn Berbach, City of Tipp City, Ms. Judy Dodge, Montgomery County, and Mr. Woody Stroud, Greene County Transit for serving in this capacity to make sure we have a great slate.

- On page 97 in the packet, is the notice regarding the format and guidelines of the Caucus scheduled on Thursday, March 4, 2021, which will be held immediately following the Board Meeting via the Zoom Chat Room.

To ensure eligibility for those interested in serving on the Board of Directors or Executive Committee, your delegate forms must be received in our office by **Friday, February 26, 2021**. Alternates to the Board of Directors are not eligible to serve as an Executive Committee member and the County Commissioners are automatically seated for the Executive Committee for the upcoming year.

Ms. Nancy Byrge, City of Huber Heights, thanked Mr. Carlton Eley, MVRPC, for coming to Huber Heights to assist their group. Ms. Byrge stated Mr. Eley helped focus their Culture and Diversity Citizen Action Commission on what is necessary to do a community needs assessment. She told the group of there being spirited discussions between their City Staff and City Commission, and they are on the right road and they are issuing an RFP for a vendor to help with their community needs assessment. Ms. Byrge does not think they would have gotten there if they had not invited Mr. Eley in. Ms. Byrge suggested to Board Members that are looking to do a similar effort to reach out to Mr. Eley, because he got them on the right track.

Mr. Martin thanked Ms. Byrge, because it is great to have our members say great things about MVRPC. We are happy to help anyone that needs it. If we are unable to do the work, we will let you know and we will give ideas so that you may hire a consultant or another organization to help you. Mr. Martin stated we are happy to be a part of the process, so that your concerns and questions are answered.

- The Chair, First Vice-Chair and Second Vice-Chair are **automatically** members of the Executive Committee. They will be elected at the March Board Meeting prior to the Caucuses.
- One member represents the largest populated city in the Region (City of Dayton)
- The Member representing each member County (Commission) is also **automatically** a member of the Executive Committee.

**The caucusing guidelines are as follows:**

- All representatives selected as Executive Committee members must be **MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS. ALTERNATES** to the Board of Directors **ARE NOT ELIGIBLE** to serve as Executive Committee members.
- Representatives are selected for a one year term.

Staff will provide a list of Board Members eligible for selection in each category. Representatives in each category listed below are chosen by Board Members in attendance who are also members of that category. The selection will be made either by a collective decision of the caucus or by a paper ballot vote of the caucus members.

In cases where a group of three representatives is being selected (i.e., the categories of Non-governmental Members or Additional Members under Cities and Villages), paper ballots are often preferred. In this case, the standard ballot and voting procedure used in regular public elections will apply, with all three votes cast at the same time, on the same ballot.

## RESOLUTION AMENDING THE SFY2021-SFY2024 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

**WHEREAS**, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties including the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS**, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the SFY2021-SFY2024 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 7, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC, ODOT, Greene CATS, Miami County Transit and GDRTA have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2021-SFY2024 TIP amendment; and

## **CRRSAA Funding to be Available for MVRPC Transportation Solicitation**

On December 21, 2020, Congress passed the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) which included an additional \$10 billion for highway infrastructure programs. The highway CRRSAA funding eligibility is the same as the current Surface Transportation Program and the funds are available at 100 percent federal share until September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

A portion of the funds is available for sub-allocation to urbanized areas with a population greater than 200,000 and MVRPC's share is \$5,199,864. MVRPC intends to implement a large resurfacing program with the CY 2021 Fall application cycle using the Region's CRRSAA funds.

## **State Transportation Biennium Budget Request**

The Ohio Transportation Budget was officially dropped as [HB 74](#). Before we go into the specific provisions, we wanted to highlight that Director Marchbanks announced during his testimony in front of House Finance Committee that **\$54 million of \$333 million in one-time federal stimulus money** from the last two federal relief bills are directed to MPOs and RTPOs. The \$54 million is included in the \$126 million that will be given to "local governments" to help cover costs associated with the pandemic. The remaining \$72 million of the local government money will be directed to county engineers.

Upon review of the language, here are the policy provisions in the transportation budget:

- Sets up an alternate process applying to counties with over 400k Ohioans for additional political subdivisions to join a regional transit authority, if a majority of the subdivisions approve and there is no time limit for the subdivision's participation
- Clarifies that all bridge inspections will be made on a schedule established by the Director, which is at least once every 2 years for its highest rated bridges and annually for others.
- Allows electronic vehicle ownership confirmation for vehicle registration purposes
- Increases by \$10 the registration and renewal fees for all vehicles
- Allows for an electronic certificate of title for vehicles with certain checks and under certain conditions
- Increases by \$2 to \$17 the clerk of court fee for certificate of title to pay for increased OHP presence
- Allows for online renewal of drivers licenses for individuals who meet certain criteria
- Adds language on the state-to-state verification services/digital image access/exchange program for identity verification purposes
- Requires vehicles to stop for pedestrians waiting to cross at a crosswalk or in the crosswalk, if traffic control signals are not in place or operation and the pedestrian is on the same side of the street as the vehicle
- Aligns Ohio law with federal law allowing certain oversized fire engines on interstates but requires them to go through a permitting process



- The Turnpike Commission has committed to partnering with Eastgate to investigate the feasibility, of a pilot project for in-lane electric vehicle charging (wireless charging while driving) in Mahoning County
- Appropriates \$15.2 million in each FY for road improvements (Fund 4W00 195629) associated, with economic development opportunities to retain or attract businesses in Ohio around airports

We will continue to inform you on the progress of the bill.

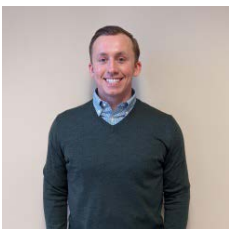
## 2020 Census Updates

2020 Census operations have been impacted by delays related to the COVID-19 pandemic. These delays continue to effect the delivery of 2020 Census data. The first major deliverable will be apportionment counts which are expected to be available by April 30, 2021. Following apportionment counts, redistricting data is expected to be available by September 30, 2021. The data delivery schedule is fluid and additional delays are possible. MVRPC will continue to monitor developments related to the 2020 Census and provide updates as needed. MVRPC is a Census Affiliate Organization and provides assistance to U.S. Census Bureau's various programs. In the lead up to and during the 2020 Census, MVRPC assisted the U.S. Census Bureau in numerous ways. MVRPC served as the regional lead to update census reporting geographies through the Participant Statistical Areas Program (PSAP). MVRPC staff served on and provided technical support to several countywide Complete Count Committees in the Region. Likewise, MVRPC assisted U.S. Census Bureau personnel with data, mapping, and outreach activities. The U.S. Census Bureau recently recognized MVRPC for its role as a Community Partner during the 2020 Census. ## Memorial Day Tornadoes 2019 Disaster Recovery Update



This week MVRPC welcomed full-time Disaster Recovery Planner, James Metz. Mr. Metz joins MVRPC from the Council of Development Finance Agencies where he helped local and state government organizations tackle their financing gaps for major projects through technical assistance and education. Originally, from West Alexandria, James served in the United States Army and then attended OSU where he earned his degree in City & Regional Planning. Mr. Metz will provide direct assistance to all tornado impacted communities in the Miami Valley and will lead the Regional Resiliency planning process.

MVRPC continues to provide leadership for our Region's disaster recovery efforts, helping our communities rebuild from the 2019 Memorial Day Tornadoes. To date, we have helped to leverage more than \$35.2 Million in federal investment in to the hardest hit areas and we will continue to assist our member communities in the years to come. The latest federal investment is from the Economic Development Administration to the Miami Conservancy District for the reconstruction of the levees surrounding the heavily impacted area of Old North Dayton.

During our February Impacted Jurisdictions meeting, we were pleased to announce partnership with a national disaster recovery organization to help restore the tree canopy in disaster impacted neighborhoods. The CEO of RETREET, Grady McGahan, joined our meeting from Texas to share the exciting news. Over the next 18-24 months, RETREET will host events each fall and spring during which volunteers will plant hundreds on 8-10 foot tall trees for residential properties impacted by the tornadoes. So long as the pandemic eases as is expected,



the first event will take place this fall. Residential property owners will be able to request trees using an online form later this spring. To learn more about RETREET visit [www.retreet.org](http://www.retreet.org).

## MiamiValleyRoads.org

MVRPC created this website to provide all of the latest updates on construction projects that could impact commutes throughout the Region. It also provides user-friendly access to route planning tools, commute solutions and other ideas to reduce congestion and prevent air pollution for the areas under construction.



The first phase of construction work on the US 40 Improvements Project is underway. The project will widen a portion of US 40 (National Rd.) from just west of Union Airpark Blvd. to Airport Access Rd., as well as improve the interchange at US 40 and Airport Access Rd. Crews are on-site and preliminary work will take place throughout the winter as weather allows. All lanes of travel will remain open on US 40, between Dog Leg Rd. and Peters Pk. while crews begin work outside the existing roadway.

When completed, the improvements on US 40 will address roadway design issues while adding capacity. They include:

- Constructing a new, continuous five-lane section of US 40 from just west of Union Airpark Blvd. to Airport Access Rd., with two through lanes in each direction and a center left turn lane.
- Tapering the roadway from Union Airpark Blvd. back to two lanes to the west.
- Reconstructing the ramps to Airport Access Rd. to meet modern design standards and improve the interchange's safety.
- Upgrading traffic signals at the interchange of US 40 and Airport Access Rd.
