The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on December 4, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

**I. INTRODUCTIONS**

Chairperson Lommatzsch called the meeting to order at 9:03 a.m. Self-introductions were made and a quorum was confirmed for the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board of Directors meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

## **II. APPROVAL OF NOVEMBER 6, 2025 MEETING MINUTES**

Mr. Barhorst made a motion to approve the minutes from the November 6, 2025 Board meeting. Mr. Housh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION ITEMS**

No public comments were made.

## **IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS**

### **A. Resolution 25-32: Authorizing MVRPC to Apply for Ohio Department of Transportation Funding**

Ms. Anderson provided an overview of the resolution for MVRPC to apply for Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) funding. She explained that the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) funding requires inclusion in a locally developed coordinated transportation plan. Since 2007, MVRPC has led these planning efforts, expanding in 2018 to include surrounding rural counties through ODOT support. Ms. Anderson then stated that the Greater Region Mobility Initiative (GRMI) covers eight counties and was one of two regions across the state to pilot coordinated transportation planning in a larger region. The GRMI Plan was recently renewed and adopted in September 2024 and will be implemented in the coming years.

To sustain GRMI and maintain access to Section 5310 funding, MVRPC will apply for ODOT funding for State Fiscal Year 2027. As the program transitions from state to federal funding, additional assurances may be required. Ms. Anderson stated that MVRPC must submit an Authorizing Resolution to ODOT to meet federal requirements and execute a contract upon project approval. Afterwards, Ms. Anderson noted that staff, and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend Board approval to apply for ODOT funding.

Mr. Stroud made a motion to authorize MVRPC to apply for ODOT funding. Mr. Bales seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

### **B. Resolution 25-33: Amending the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan to Update Boundaries for the Piqua and Troy Facility Planning Areas**

Mr. Lindsay presented an amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan (AWQMP) proposing a boundary adjustment between the Piqua and Troy Planning Areas (FPAs). The amendment addresses a request from the City of Piqua related to recently annexed areas zoned for industrial development that will require centralized wastewater service. Following coordination with the City of Troy and other interested parties, a compromise boundary map was developed and agreed upon. The proposal completed the required review process, including a public comment period and virtual public meeting, during which no comments were received. Lastly, Mr. Lindsay stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommended approval of the proposed amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan.

Mr. Lindsay then opened the floor for questions or comments. A discussion followed regarding annexation requirements and a recommendation was made to address annexation requirements for services at a future meeting. Chairperson Lommatzsch accepted the recommendation for the record.

Mr. Bruns made a motion to amend the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan. Ms. Oda seconded the motion. The motion was adopted by the majority of the Board of Directors with one nay.

After the vote, the following statement was made by Mr. Hinkelman from the City of Piqua:

*“The City of Piqua is grateful to the representatives of the member communities within MVRPC for the approval of our FPA boundary change request. In accordance with the Water Pollution Control Act amendments of 1972, MVRPC serves as the Designated Water Quality Planning Agency for the five county Miami Valley Region. In this role, MVRPC prepared and continually maintains the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan (AWQMP). A major element of the plan is the individual wastewater treatment facility plans that are developed and maintained by the wastewater treatment providers in the Miami Valley Region. These plans outline protocols for providing centralized wastewater treatment in efficient manners that also protect valuable water resources.*

*To ensure “efficient manners that also protect valuable water resources”, MVRPC created an initial FPA map in 2005, along with guidelines to allow modification to that map. Although many areas on the initial map were well defined with data and justification for which jurisdictions could serve the area most efficiently, there were also many areas that were assigned to jurisdictions arbitrarily based on geographical designations without justification for when or if the provider would be able to serve an area. When looking at the FPA map today, it is easy to find straight lines that use road or township boundaries instead of watersheds, even though those markers are clearly not the most efficient manner to protect water resources in an area. We know many of these lines were created to meet political desires of the time.*

*The City of Piqua requests that MVRPC move away from the current process which requires individual communities to negotiate agreement with neighboring jurisdictions and instead implement a fair, non-biased process utilizing clear metrics for who can most efficiently serve a property and protect water resources at the present time. Having standardized metrics for review of similar situations in the future reduces political decision-making and best meets the intent of providing wastewater treatment in an efficient manner. As development continues to occur in many communities in the Dayton area in 2025 and beyond, clear, fair, and metric-based standards should be created so FPA boundary decisions can be made that allow the most efficient, cost-effective and timely service to a property at the present time.*

*Thank you again for your approval of this request today. We look forward to continued discussion to build a process for future changes that is objective and metric-driven.”*

**C. Resolution 25-34: Recommended Approval of FY2027 Transportation and Government Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects**

Mr. Daniel presented information regarding the projects submitted to the FY2027 Transportation and Governmental Services Priority Development and Advocacy Committee

(PDAC). He stated that MVRPC serves as the lead agency for transportation projects, which include surface, air, rail, transit, and pedestrian transportation-related projects. A total of seven FY2027 PDAC transportation project applications were received, requesting \$75.9 million. Mr. Daniel also highlighted MVRPC's leadership role in government services projects, which include emergency services, criminal justice, first responders, community infrastructure, and K-12 education-related projects. Thirteen government services project applications, totaling \$50.3 million, were submitted. Both transportation and government services projects were evaluated by a review panel and categorized into "Priority," "Recommended," and "Reviewed." The final list of projects will be forwarded to the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee for funding consideration.

Mr. Daniel concluded by stating that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approval of FY2027 Transportation and Government Services PDAC projects.

Mr. Barhorst made a motion to approve the FY2027 Transportation and Government Services PDAC Projects. Mr. Bales seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **V. RTPO (REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS**

### **A. Resolution 25-38: Approving the Recommended CY2025 Regional Surface Transportation Program Projects**

Ms. Ramirez presented information on the Regional Surface Transportation Program (RSTP) projects proposed for funding with MVRPC's regionally controlled funds. She referred to the recommended RSTP Project Summary List outlining the scope of each project. She then stated that upon Board approval, the project sponsors will be notified and then asked to meet with MVRPC staff and ODOT District Office staff to determine a detailed project scope and an anticipated project development schedule. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that staff and the Regional Transportation Planning Organization Steering Committee recommend approval of the CY2025 RSTP projects.

Mr. Barhorst made a motion to approve the recommended CY2025 Regional Surface Transportation Program Projects. Mr. Bowers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **VI. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS**

### **A. Resolution 25-35: Recommended Adoption Supporting the IIJA Safety Performance Management Targets**

Ms. Ramirez provided information regarding the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) Safety Management Targets. She explained that after a state DOT adopts targets for a particular rule, MPO's have 180 days from the date targets are established to adopt their own targets or support the state targets. The MPO deadline for adopting safety performance measure targets is February 27, 2026. MVRPC recommends supporting the State's targets for the safety measures. Ms. Ramirez then summarized the safety measures and targets including the impact that a 2% annual reduction goal would have in the MVRPC area. The 2% reduction for CY 2026 maintains the rate adopted in CY 2025 due to Governor DeWine's focus on safety.

Mr. Housh made a motion to support the IIJA Safety Performance Management Targets. Mr. Hankins seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**B. Resolution 25-36: Proposed List of 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Congestion Management Projects; Summary of Public Participation Meetings; and Financial Analysis**

Ms. Ramirez and Mr. Arnold presented an overview of the financial analysis and proposed projects for the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan. The presentation summarized projected transportation revenues over the next 25 years, totaling approximately \$5.4 billion from federal, state, and local sources, and explained how these funds are expected to be allocated between maintenance/reconstruction needs and capacity, operational, and safety improvements. They also reviewed the development of the proposed Congestion Management Project List, including public participation efforts, project evaluation criteria, and financial feasibility, and outlined next steps such as required technical analyses and conformity reviews. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approval of the proposed 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Congestion Management Projects.

Mr. Bruns made a motion to approve the proposed list of 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan Congestion Management Projects. Mr. Bales seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**C. Resolution 25-37: Recommended Adoption of Revision #6 to MVRPC's SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)**

Mr. Arnold referred to the sixth revision to the SFY 2026-2029 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He reviewed key project details for all local jurisdiction projects and tables by county. He paused for any questions about the statewide line-item project tables or any projects. Afterwards, Mr. Arnold stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approving revision #6 to MVRPC's SFY2026-2029 TIP.

Mr. Stroud made a motion to approve the amendment to MVRPC's SFY 2026-2029 TIP. Mr. Housh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

**VII. INFORMATION ITEMS**

**A. Proposed New Projects Requesting MVRPC's STP, TA & CR Funds**

Mr. Arnold shared the proposed new projects received as part of the solicitation for MVRPC regionally controlled funding under the Surface Transportation Program (STP), Transportation Alternatives (TA) and Carbon Reduction (CR) programs. He then explained that a public involvement meeting to present the proposed new projects was held on November 6, 2025 and no comments were received during the public comment period. Lastly, Mr. Arnold announced that the next step in the process is to evaluate each proposed project based on the criteria established in MVRPC's suballocated funding policies and procedures. Once each project is ranked, a final list of recommended projects will be reviewed by the TAC in February 2026 and then forwarded to the Board of Directors for final approval in March 2026. He then opened the floor for questions.

**B. MVRPC Website User Survey**

Ms. Davis provided information regarding a user survey for the MVRPC Website. She explained that MVRPC will be releasing an RFP to find a consultant to update mvrpc.org. The goals of the website update include: improved ADA compliance, improved user experience, navigation and search capability, new platform to replace outdated platform, and improved content management. Lastly, Ms. Davis invited Board members to complete the

survey and provide their feedback on user experience and navigation. The survey will end December 31, 2025.

## VIII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

### A. Executive Director's Update

Mr. Martin thanked MVRPC Chairperson, Ms. Sara Lommatzsch for her service as an MVRPC Officer, as she prepares to retire at the end of the month. He stated for more than 40 years, Chairperson Lommatzsch has exemplified a commitment to regional collaboration across the Miami Valley through her active participation in MVRPC.

**Subject:** Resolution Delegating Conformity Determinations for Neighboring MPOs (CCSTCC and OKI) Conformity Actions to MVRPC Staff.

The MVRPC MPO is comprised of the counties of Greene, Miami, and Montgomery as well as the Cities of Franklin, Carlisle, and Springboro, and Franklin Township in northern Warren County. Warren County is located in the Cincinnati air quality Region (Cincinnati Region), with the remainder counties in the MPO located in the Dayton/Springfield air quality Region (D/S Region). The D/S Region also includes Clark County, which is represented by a different MPO, the Clark County Springfield Transportation Coordinating Committee (CCSTCC). Due to multiple air quality regions and MPOs, conformity is closely coordinated with neighboring MPOs. The figure below illustrates this complex situation.



Based on recent guidance by FHWA staff, **it is now required that when one of the MPOs in a multi-jurisdictional area wants to make an amendment to its Plan or TIP that includes non-exempt projects, all the MPOs in the multi-jurisdictional area must make a conformity determination on their Plan or TIP.** To address conformity actions in neighboring MPOs, the FHWA staff has offered the following two options for the MPOs that are not amending their Plans/TIPs to make the necessary conformity determination:

- via a new policy board resolution every time a conformity determination is needed or,
- by having the MPO policy board delegate their authority for making a conformity determination for the above scenario to MPO staff. (This option requires an MPO policy board resolution delegating this authority.)

MVRPC staff is proposing that the Board of Directors delegate this authority to the MVRPC staff (in particular to the current member of the interagency consultation process), in order to avoid unnecessary delays such as not having a board meeting when a neighboring MPO needs a conformity action that could lead to projects being delayed, not being sold on time, etc...

Upon concurrence by the MPO members of the Board of Directors, the attached resolution will be forwarded to our state (ODOT) and federal (U.S. DOT and U.S. EPA) partners to formalize the MVRPC conformity determination process when conformity actions only affect non-exempt projects in neighboring MPOs.

At the request of the Technical Advisory Committee, staff will add information to the subsequent TIP Revision memo whenever MVRPC staff makes a conformity action in response to a Plan or TIP revision for a neighboring MPO.

The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC) adopted its 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) on May 2021 and a conformity determination was received with an effective date of June 26, 2021. A second conformity determination was requested in May 2025, to comply with 40 CFR 93.104 (b) (3), and received on July 25, 2026. Since then, there has been no changes to the 2050 LRTP.

MVRPC adopted its latest update to the Transportation Improvement Program for SFY 2026-2029 on May 2025, a conformity determination was received with an effective date of July 1, 2025. Since July 1, there has been no changes to the MVRPC TIP to warrant a new conformity action.

In response to Amendment No 5 to OKI FY2026-2029 TIP, MVRPC can affirm that the MVRPC SFY2026-2029 TIP conforms to the applicable state implementation plan in accordance with the provisions of U.S EPA's Transportation Conformity Rule (40 CFR Parts 51 and 93).

**RESOLUTION 26-01  
DELEGATING CONFORMITY DETERMINATIONS FOR NEIGHBORING  
MPOS (CCSTCC and OKI) CONFORMITY ACTIONS TO MVRPC STAFF**

**WHEREAS**, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami, and Montgomery Counties including the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro, and Franklin Township in Warren County; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC has a conforming Long Range Transportation Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC has a conforming Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) that is consistent with the existing Long Range Transportation Plan; and

**WHEREAS**, the Long Range Transportation Plan is fiscally constrained; and

**WHEREAS**, the conformity process completed for Greene, Miami, and Montgomery Counties in the Dayton/Springfield Air Quality Region meet the Clean Air Act and Transportation Conformity rule requirements for the 1997 ozone standard; and

**WHEREAS**, significant TIP projects in Franklin, Carlisle, Springboro, and Franklin Township have been included in the regional emissions analysis for the Cincinnati Region and found to conform to the 2008 and 2015 8-hour ozone standards; and

**WHEREAS**, Federal Transportation Conformity Regulations, require that when one MPO in a multi-jurisdictional air quality area makes an amendment to its Plan or TIP for non-exempt projects or adopts a new Plan, all MPOs in the multi-jurisdictional air quality area must make a new conformity determination on their current Plan or TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC is not making a corresponding amendment or update to its TIP and/or Plan.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the MPO Members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby delegate conformity determinations as a result of conformity actions (Plan and/or TIP amendments of non-exempt projects or new Plan adoptions) in a neighboring MPO to the MVRPC staff interagency consultation member, currently the Director of Transportation Planning and Funding.

Over the last few months MVRPC, ODOT, Greene CATS, Miami County Transit and GDRTA have made numerous changes to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP revision. The attached TIP Tables 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4, 4.5, 5.1, 5.2, 5.3 and 5.4 reflect the updated information for each specific project. Modifications to Statewide Line Item projects are shown on Table 4.6 and are provided for information only. A TIP terminology explanation chart of key abbreviations used in the highway/bikeway tables precedes Table 4.1. A resolution adopting the proposed TIP revision is attached for your review and consideration. The MVRPC staff recommends your approval.

**WHEREAS**, the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 1, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC, ODOT, Greene CATS, Miami County Transit and GDRTA have made numerous changes to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP revision; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed revision is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, this TIP revision is consistent with the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP revisions such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, this revision will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopt **Revision #7** to the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.





## History & Leadership

**2016** Del Mar Encore Fellows Initiative created by The Dayton Foundation placing recently retired professionals in community-oriented work.

**2016** MVRPC hired the Kirwan Institute for the Study of Race and Ethnicity at the Ohio State University to examine the historical context of equity and inequity in the Miami Valley through data, maps, and other infographics.

**2017** MVRPC created the Miami Valley Equity Initiative to promote and receive feedback on the Miami Valley Equity Regional Profile.

**2018** The Dayton Foundation convened the Equity Design Team which worked over the course of 18 months to define critical next steps for the future of equity work in the Miami Valley.

**2019** MVRPC launched the Regional Equity Initiative under the newly formed Institute for Livable and Equitable Communities.

**2020** A large advisory group comprised of leaders from the community and a wide range of agencies and organizations in the Region began to define the Mission, Vision and Core Strategies for the Regional Equity Initiative.

**2021** The MVRPC Executive Committee and Board of Directors modified its Bylaws and Constitution to create the Institute for Livable and Equitable Communities Steering Committee (ISC).

The Institute for Livable & Equitable Communities (ILEC) places an intentional focus on livability and equity, launching programs and transforming systems that create a community where all people can thrive.

## **MISSION:**

## Southwest Ohio Water Study

MVRPC is partnering with Ohio EPA to understand the current availability, current demand and projected future demand of water use and reuse opportunities across southwest Ohio to support local decision making and future economic opportunities. Ohio EPA as the project sponsor is expecting to study water resources and usage statewide with one study already completed in central Ohio.

The southwest Ohio study is in the early phases of project work being facilitated by consultant support from CDM Smith. The work proposes to identify zones of economic opportunity based on water resource feasibility and availability, will strive to maintain water quality in rivers and streams, and identify innovative approaches to manage the resource while considering future growth.

The SW Ohio project boundaries are identified below. Please note that Fayette and Logan counties were included in the Central Ohio Water Study.

MVRPC along with OKI Regional Council of governments have been identified as regional partners in this project to support data collection needs and assist the consultant with engagement opportunities. The Water Environment Subcommittee (WESC) at MVRPC will serve as the water resource technical expertise for the engagement process with additional engagement opportunities for local economic development practitioners and industry partners to also inform this work. The project is expected to be completed in November 2026 with a comprehensive dashboard as the outcome to help support a common vision between the agencies charged with protecting the environment, those focused on attracting economic development, and the local political entities and community stakeholders that help inform decisions.
