The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on May 1, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

I. INTRODUCTIONS

Chairperson Lommatzsch called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. Self-introductions were made and a quorum was confirmed for the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board of Directors meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. APPROVAL OF APRIL 3, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Bruns made a motion to approve the minutes from the April 3, 2025 Board meeting. Mr. Stroud seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION ITEMS

None.

IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 25-15: Approving the SFY 2026 Budget and Work Program

Mr. Lucas presented the Final SFY 2026 Budget and Work Program. He discussed Schedules A-G, giving a brief summary of each table. Mr. Lucas then highlighted key changes and updates and noted the Agency's overall budget for FY26 is smaller than FY25, primarily due to the completion of the EDA Disaster Recovery and Resiliency grants, which reduced Federal grant revenue. He also stated that personnel costs are slightly higher as the Agency is nearly fully staffed, and there are slight increases in fringe benefits and indirect cost rates. He then stated that the Transportation budget remains stable, with CPG revenue returning to IIJA levels and new federal funding for SS4A plan development. IT equipment costs continue to rise, but the Capital Budget is lower due to the completion of the office move to 6 N. Main Street. Lastly, he opened the floor for questions and stated that staff recommend approval of the SFY 2026 Final Budget and Work Program and authorize its submission to grantor agencies.

Mr. Bruns made the motion to approve the submission of the SFY 2026 Final Budget and Work Program. Mr. Ruzinsky seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Resolution 25-14: Approving the Recommendation to The Dayton Foundation to Fund the 2025 Livable, Age-Friendly Communities Grant

Ms. King presented the grant proposals from three communities as part of the Regional Livable and Age-Friendly Communities Cohort. The City of Brookville requested \$10,000 to enhance social participation programs including Age-Friendly Lunch and Learn events and facility improvements. The City of Centerville requested \$6,500 to improve digital accessibility of its new city website and provide accessibility training for staff. The City of Huber Heights requested \$10,000 to expand its Strength and Longevity Scholarship at the Senior Center, providing YMCA memberships for seniors not eligible for Silver Sneakers. Lastly, Ms. King stated that staff and the Institute for Livable and Equitable Communities Steering Committee (ISC) recommend approval to forward the 2025 Livable, Age-Friendly Communities grant award recommendations to The Dayton Foundation.

Mr. Housh made the motion to forward the 2025 Livable, Age-Friendly Communities grant award recommendations to The Dayton Foundation. Ms. Page seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. RTPO (REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGRANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 25-09: Adopting the Darke-Preble-Shelby SFY 2026-2029 Regional Transportation Improvement Program

Ms. Ramirez presented the Final SFY2026-2029 Regional Transportation Improvement Program (RTIP) for Board review. She explained that the RTIP is a comprehensive,

financially-constrained list of regional transportation projects and services to be implemented within the four-year STIP period. It was developed through a coordinated planning process involving the Darke-Preble-Shelby RTPO, the State of Ohio, and local jurisdictions, aligning with the goals of the DPS 2050 Regional Transportation Plan. The RTIP covers projects across all modes of transportation, including highways, public transit, bikeways, and pedestrian facilities. Staff held a public involvement meeting on March 25th, and no public comments were received. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that staff and the Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RTPO) recommend approving MVRPC's Final SFY 2026-2029 RTIP.

Mr. Barhorst made a motion to approve MVRPC's Final SFY 2026-2029 RTIP. Mr. Bowers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VI. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 25-11: Requesting a New Conformity Finding for the Existing 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan

Ms. Ramirez presented the SFY 2025 conformity finding request for the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP). She explained that MVRPC is preparing for a full update of the 2050 LRTP in SFY 2026 as required by federal regulations, ensuring alignment with current and forecasted transportation and land use conditions. She then stated that socio-economic data has been adjusted to 2020 Census values, and no significant changes to regional travel forecasts are expected. All regionally significant projects in the SFY 2026-2029 TIP are accounted for in the 2050 LRTP, with 2050 remaining the horizon year. Lastly, Ms. Ramirez stated that to comply with federal air quality regulations, a conformity determination is being advanced for the existing plan. Upon Board approval, the resolution will be sent to U.S. DOT and U.S. EPA for formal review.

Mr. Ruzinsky made a motion to approve the request for a new conformity finding for the existing 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan. Mr. Stroud seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Resolution 25-12: Adopting the Final SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold presented the Final SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) as required by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA) planning regulations. He explained that the TIP was developed through coordination with local jurisdictions, transit operators, and ODOT, and includes projects covering highway, bikeway, transit, and other infrastructure across Greene, Miami, and Montgomery counties, as well as certain jurisdictions in Warren County. A public involvement meeting was held on March 27, 2025, with no public comments received. Mr. Arnold then outlined the project tables for each section. Lastly, Mr. Arnold stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approving MVRPC's Final SFY 2026-2029 TIP.

Mr. Housh made a motion to approve MVRPC's Final SFY 2026-2029 TIP. Mr. Bales seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

C. Resolution 25-13: Recommended Adoption of the Annual Self Certification of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process

Mr. Arnold provided information regarding the annual self-certification of the metropolitan transportation planning process. He explained that concurrent with the submittal of the

Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), MPOs are required to adopt a resolution of self-certification of the metropolitan transportation planning process and that the resolution states that MVRPC is following the processes and procedures that are set forth by the Federal and State Governments. He then stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approval to adopt the annual self-certification of the metropolitan transportation planning process.

Mr. Bruns made a motion to adopt the Annual Self-Certification of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process. Mr. Moeller seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. TRAC Solicitation Update for Considering Major New Capacity Projects

Mr. Daniel provided information regarding the upcoming TRAC project solicitation. He stated that the solicitation will begin May 1, 2025 and applications are due to MVRPC by May 30th. MVRPC will work in coordination with ODOT to acknowledge and review all TRAC applications for the current solicitation cycle. Lastly, Mr. Daniel shared information regarding the policies and procedures for considering major new capacity projects.

B. Going Places Implementation Tools Progress Update

Mr. Kim provided a progress update on the PLAN4Health Miami Valley initiative, highlighting its alignment with four of the eleven <u>Going Places Implementation Tools</u>. He stated that MVRPC's PLAN4Health – Miami Valley Initiative, was launched in spring of 2021, and aims to explore how planning can impact health outcomes across the Region. The goals of the program are to: promote and advocate for health in all plans and policies, convene and engage partners to improve conditions that are known to be key determinants of health, and advance planning efforts aimed at creating conditions for healthy people and communities.

Mr. Kim explained the importance of healthy food options and provided an overview of the Regional Food System. He then shared data from the food systems, food assets, food security and food access noting that our development choices impact our food environment and health outcomes. Mr. Kim then provided reference links to the materials presented and then opened the floor for questions. He discussed that the short-term next steps are to provide more healthy options such as a farmers' market and community gardens. Long-term next steps are to discuss, encourage, and prepare plans with health included in the planning process. He explained that health has not been a part of the planning process for comprehensive land use plans and this is a great enhancement.

Mr. Kim announced a new service for MVRPC members "<u>Advancing Active Living Workshop Series</u>", a free workshop tailored to each member communities' unique needs.


MVRPC staff worked with ODOT and local jurisdictions in February and March to review and update the functional classification of roads. The results can be seen in the attached map.

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RESOLUTION 25-10 ENDORSING REVISIONS TO THE 2020 FEDERAL-AID ROADWAY FUNCTIONAL CLASSIFICATION IN THE DPS RTPO

WHEREAS, the Darke-Preble-Shelby Regional Transportation Planning Organization (DPS RTPO) is designated as the Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RTPO) by the Governor for Darke, Preble, and Shelby counties; and

WHEREAS, the DPS RTPO Policy Board serves as the policy and decision-making body through which local governments conduct the DPS RTPO transportation planning process; and

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) requires the revision of the Functional Classification System; and

WHEREAS, the 2020 Census delineation of urban area boundaries necessitated certain revisions to the Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundaries within the DPS RTPO planning area; and

WHEREAS, the update of existing Federal-Aid Urbanized Area Boundary is the first step in the process to update the Functional Classification System; and

WHEREAS, the designation of revised Federal-Aid Roadway Functional Classification is a cooperative effort of the State and locally elected officials and/or designated agencies.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the RTPO members of the MVRPC Board of Directors endorse revisions to the 2020 Federal Aid Roadway Functional Classification as shown on the attached map and authorize the Ohio Department of Transportation to submit the same to the Federal Highway Administration for approval.



WHEREAS, MVRPC, ODOT, Miami County Transit and GDRTA have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment is consistent with the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopt **Amendment #1** to the <u>SFY2026-SFY2029</u> <u>Transportation Improvement Program</u> as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

SUBJECT: Water Quality Plan Amendment to Update Boundaries for Tri-Cities and Bethel FPAs

Resulting from MVRPC's State Fiscal Year 2025 contract with Ohio EPA for water quality planning assistance and from requests by MVRPC member jurisdictions, this staff-proposed amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan (AWQMP) includes one FPA boundary update affecting two facility planning areas: Tri-Cities and Bethel.

Updates to the AWQMP are subject to review by the Water & Environment Subcommittee, the MVRPC Technical Advisory Committee, and the review and approval of the MVRPC Board of Directors.

The Tri-Cities Regional Wastewater Authority serves as the Designated Management Agency for the Tri-Cities Facility Planning Area (FPA). Tri-Cities provides wastewater collection and treatment services for Huber Heights, Tipp City, and Vandalia. This requested boundary change addresses the need for wastewater services in a location annexed from Bethel Township to the City of Huber Heights in 2024. The area in question is shown in the image, below, and will be the next section of residential construction in the Carriage Trails development. Development plans provided in Spring 2025 to MVRPC indicate a planned build out of over 1,400 homes in the area annexed. The density of development will require sanitary sewer and treatment at a centralized waste treatment facility.

The specific property in question is outlined in the image in orange. This area is currently in the Bethel FPA, which is managed by Miami County Sanitary Engineering (MCSE). In the course of development planning a request for sanitary sewer service was made to MCSE, and the county declined to provide such service. As a result, this area is proposed to be switched to the Tri-Cities FPA, which is prepared and willing to provide such service.

The timeline for review of this proposal was as follows:

- Request for FPA Boundary update received and confirmed complete on February 14, 2025
- Presentation to the MVRPC Water & Environment Subcommittee on March 12, 2025
- Public Comment period held between April 3 and May 2, 2025. The Public was invited to submit
 a comment through the MVRPC website or in person at the MVRPC offices.
- Virtual Public Meeting held on April 17, 2025

Only one comments received during the public comment period. The comment, from the online meeting, was related to the annexation process for this property, rather than planning for treatment of wastewater expected from development. It was suggested that this FPA change should not be approved until the procedure for removing the property fully from the Township was complete. That process has no critical connection to environmental protection, and staff sees no reason to link these processes. No comments were received through the online or the in-person comment forms.



Area subject to this proposed update is outlined in orange.

RECOMMENDATION

MVRPC staff recommends the amendment be approved as presented for the protection of water resources.

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is the Designated Planning Agency (DPA) for Water Quality Management Planning within the Miami Valley Region pursuant to Section 208 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972 (P.L. 92-500) and 1977 (P.L. 95-217); and

WHEREAS, in fulfillment of its responsibilities as the DPA, MVRPC has prepared the 208 Areawide Water Quality Management Plan, and administers said Plan within its designated five-county water planning jurisdiction, including Greene, Montgomery, Miami, Preble, and Darke Counties, Ohio; and

WHEREAS, it is periodically necessary to amend said Plan to incorporate pertinent and appropriate modifications; and

WHEREAS, the following amendments, hereafter known as the 2025 AWQMP Amendment, have been proposed for the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan:

1. FPA Boundary modifications for the Tri-Cities and Bethel FPAs

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Commission hereby adopts the above-referenced 2025 Amendment to the Areawide Water Quality Management Plan and recommends its certification by the State of Ohio.







Spatial Distribution of Emissions





Programs Funded by CMAQ

The Air Quality Awareness Program and Rideshare Program are both funded by CMAQ. As outlined in the guidelines, the goal of CMAQ-funded public education and outreach programs is to educate the public, community leaders, and potential project sponsors about trip planning and transportation mode choices, traffic congestion, and air quality.

The Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program or CMAQ supports two important goals of the U.S. Department of Transportation: improving air quality and relieving congestion as outlined in the Clean Air Act.

MVRPC uses a mix of advertising opportunities, community partnerships, and customer service to support these programs.



Rideshare Program

The **Rideshare Program** promotes shared sustainable commute options through the statewide platform, GohioCommute.com.

GohioCommute.com allows users to form a carpool, vanpool or bikepool, transit and bike routes using ride matching. It is FREE to anyone who lives, works or attends college in Montgomery, Greene, Miami, Preble, Darke, Shelby and Clinton Counties.

In support of the Rideshare Program goals, MVRPC provide updates on major construction projects in Region that may impact commutes and encourage visitors to the site to find alternate routes or transportation options **MiamiValleyRoads.org**

The Air Quality Awareness Program provides information about air quality in the Region and promotes actions to take to reduce air pollution.


When air quality is expected to be poor, MVRPC in conjunction with RAPCA (Regional Air Pollution Control Agency), activate air quality alerts to notify residents.
