The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Board of Directors met on September 4, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.

I. INTRODUCTIONS

Chairperson Lommatzsch called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m. Self-introductions were made and a quorum was confirmed for the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's Board of Directors meeting. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

II. APPROVAL OF AUGUST 7, 2025 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Hankins made a motion to approve the minutes from the August 7, 2025 Board meeting. Mr. Moeller seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

III. PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD ON ACTION ITEMS

No public comments were made.

IV. RPC (REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 25-25: Recommended Adoption of SFY 2025 Transportation Work Program Completion Report

Mr. Kim provided information on the SFY 2025 Transportation Work Program Completion Report. He stated that the completion report summarizes the highlights of the MPO's and RTPPO's transportation planning efforts for the preceding fiscal year (July 1 to June 30th). After Board approval, the report and the resolution are forwarded to the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT). Mr. Kim then referred to the progress of each program. Lastly, Mr. Kim stated that staff recommends approval of the SFY 2025 Transportation Work Program Completion Report.

Mr. Stroud made a motion to approve the SFY 2025 Transportation Work Program Completion Report. Mr. Joseph seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. RTPO (REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Endorsement of District 8 – Pre I-70 Widening Project TRAC Application

Ms. Ramirez presented information regarding the endorsement of the District 8, Preble County I-70 Widening Project. She explained that District 8 is applying for TRAC construction funding for the segment from the Indiana State Line to Oxford Gettysburg Road. Last year's application was unsuccessful, so the project has now been divided into smaller segments for the 2025 cycle.

The widening project is expected to improve pavement conditions, reduce congestion, and enhance freight movement along the I-70 corridor, which is vital to the Miami Valley's large manufacturing base and growing logistics industry. Ms. Ramirez noted that staff and the RTPO Steering Committee recommend endorsement of the project, and upon Board approval, a formal letter of support will be forwarded to ODOT TRAC members for consideration.

Mr. Barhorst made a motion to endorse the ODOT District 8 TRAC Application for the Pre I-70 Widening Project. Mr. Bowers seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VI. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Resolution 25-22: Recommended Adoption of Revision #3 to MVRPC's SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to the third revision to the SFY 2026-2029 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He reviewed key project details for all local jurisdiction projects and tables by county. He paused for any questions about the statewide line-item project tables or any projects. Afterwards, Mr. Arnold stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approving revision #3 to MVRPC's SFY2026-2029 TIP.

Mr. Bruns made a motion to approve the amendment to MVRPC's SFY 2026-2029 TIP. Mr. Housh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. IJJA Funds Availability Report and Project Solicitation

Mr. Arnold presented the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IJJA) Funds Availability Report, noting an anticipated short-range balance of \$19.7 million (\$16.4 M STP, \$1.6 M of TA funds and \$1.7 M CR.) He explained that CMAQ funds are now allocated through a statewide process with solicitations held biennially, so no local CMAQ solicitation will occur this year. Lastly, Mr. Arnold stated that based upon the financial report, staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend MVRPC Board authorization to solicit member jurisdictions for new projects.

Mr. Hankins made a motion to authorize to solicit member jurisdictions for new projects. Ms. Page seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

C. Resolution 25-23: Updating MVRPC's Suballocated Funding Policy

Mr. Arnold presented information on the most recent updates to the MVRPC Suballocated Funding Policy. He explained that MVRPC's suballocated funding policies and procedures were last updated in 2024 to include minor edits to reflect the availability of a resurfacing set aside and to remove CMAQ funding from this year's solicitation. MVRPC staff has since determined that additional updates are necessary. He then referred to the updates made in red text or strikethroughs in the policy document. Next, he opened the floor for questions. Lastly, Mr. Arnold stated staff recommends and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend approval for the updated policy to the Board of Directors.

Mr. Bruns made a motion to approve updating MVRPC's Suballocated Funding Policy. Mr. Housh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

D. Resolution 25-24: Adopting a Goal to Eliminate Deaths and Serious Injuries on Miami Valley Roadways

Ms. Whitaker presented an update on the Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan, noting that MVRPC received federal funding to develop a regional plan aimed at eliminating roadway deaths and serious injuries. She highlighted crash data trends, high injury networks, and public engagement efforts, and presented a proposed vision and goal of reducing fatalities and serious injuries by 50% by 2040 with an eventual goal of zero. Lastly, Ms. Whitaker stated that staff and the Technical Advisory Committee recommend adopting a goal to eliminate deaths and serious injuries on Miami Valley roadways. Next, she opened the floor for questions.

Mr. Miller discussed the need to expand data to include public safety personnel. The Board agreed and suggested including "road maintenance and public safety" to the resolution.

Mr. Miller made a motion to amend Resolution 25-24 to include road maintenance and public safety. Mr. Housh seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Bruns made a motion to adopt Resolution 25-24. Mr. Gould seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

VII. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Ohio Commuter Challenge

Ms. Dent presented on the upcoming Ohio Commuter Challenge, hosted by MVRPC's Rideshare Program and Gohio Commute partners, taking place September 8–21, 2025. She explained that the challenge encourages commuters to log sustainable trips such as carpooling, biking, walking, transit, or telework on DriveLessLiveMore.org or GohioCommute.com to be entered for prizes. She then stated that the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) secured a \$500 donation from Commute with Enterprise to fund this year's cash prizes. Ms. Dent also highlighted outreach efforts, including newsletters, social media, and workplace posters, and then provided information on the newly developed Gohio Commute App. Lastly, she opened the floor for questions.

B. FY 2027 Dayton Development Coalition's Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Process

Mr. Daniel presented information on the FY 2027 Dayton Development Coalition Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) process. He explained that the PDAC process is used to evaluate and prioritize projects across the Miami Valley for federal and state funding opportunities, ensuring the region speaks with one voice. Solicitation for new projects will begin September 2, 2025, with submissions due October 24, 2025. MVRPC will lead the review of Transportation and Government Services projects, with priorities forwarded to the MVRPC Board of Directors in December for final review and adoption before submittal to the Dayton Regional PDAC. The floor was then opened for questions.

VIII. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

A. Executive Director's Update

Mr. Martin reviewed the [September ED's Update](#):

SUBJECT: Economic Development Administration Request for Support to Update the Region's Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS)

MVRPC is seeking funding from the U.S. Economic Development Administration to revise the regional [CEDS](#) to ensure the CEDS is in compliance with EDA regulations. The CEDS for our Region was last updated in 2022. A current and compliant CEDS is necessary as a pre-requisite for many critical [funding opportunities](#) available to our Region through the U.S. Department of Commerce.

MVRPC is requesting funding from the Economic Development Administration to assist in the revision of the CEDS with the Dayton Development Coalition (DDC) as a partner on the award request.

MVRPC and DDC have committed technical expertise from their respective professional staff to collaborate in the leadership of the CEDS revision, contributing in-kind hours equal to satisfy the required 40% local match for the project.

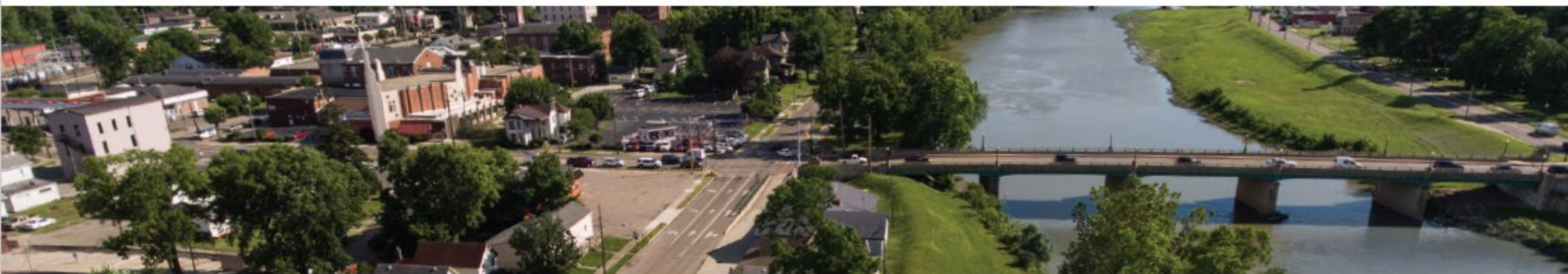

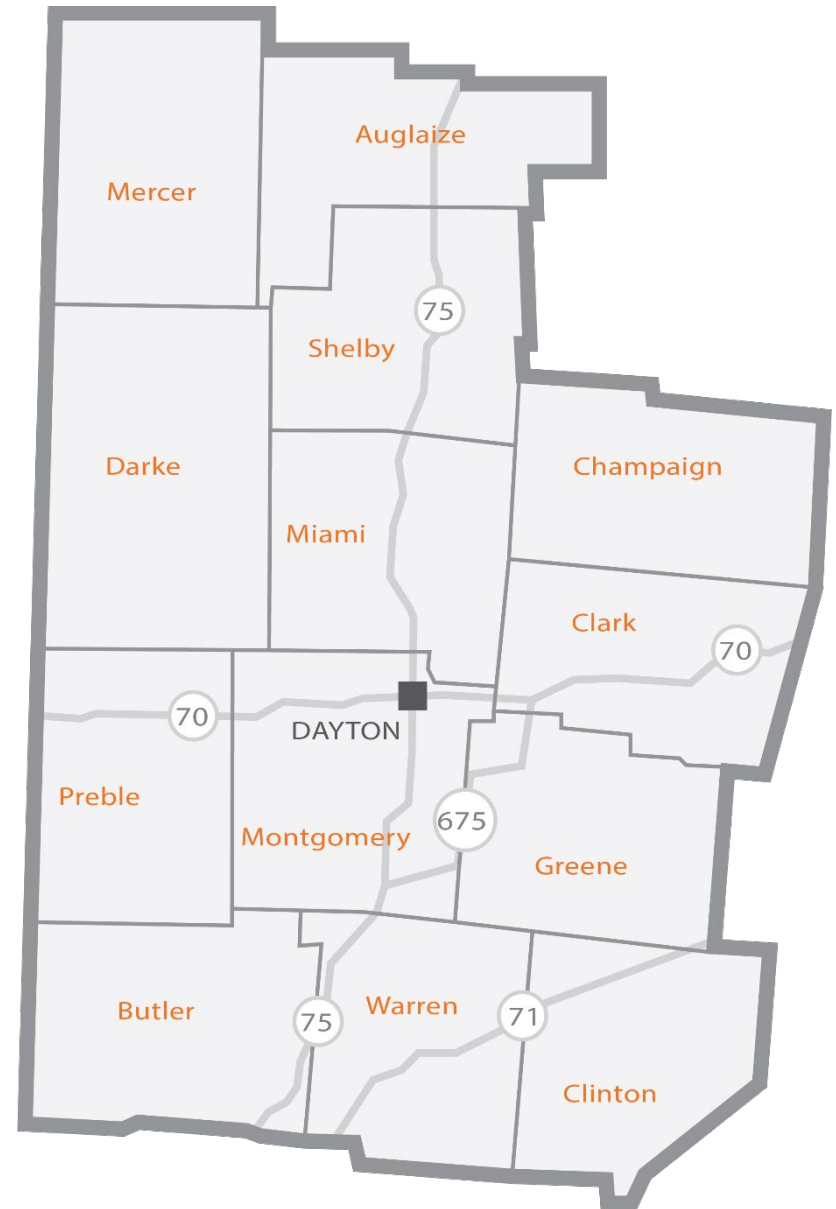

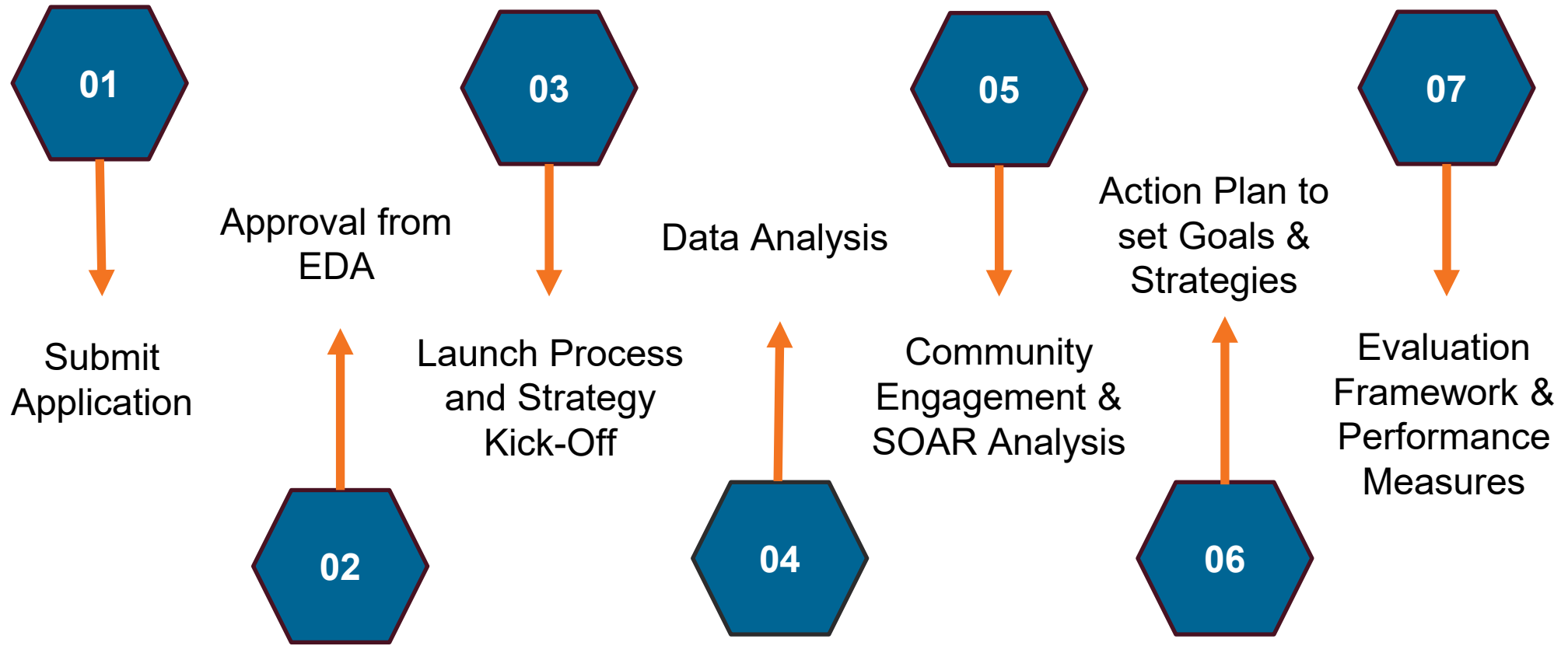

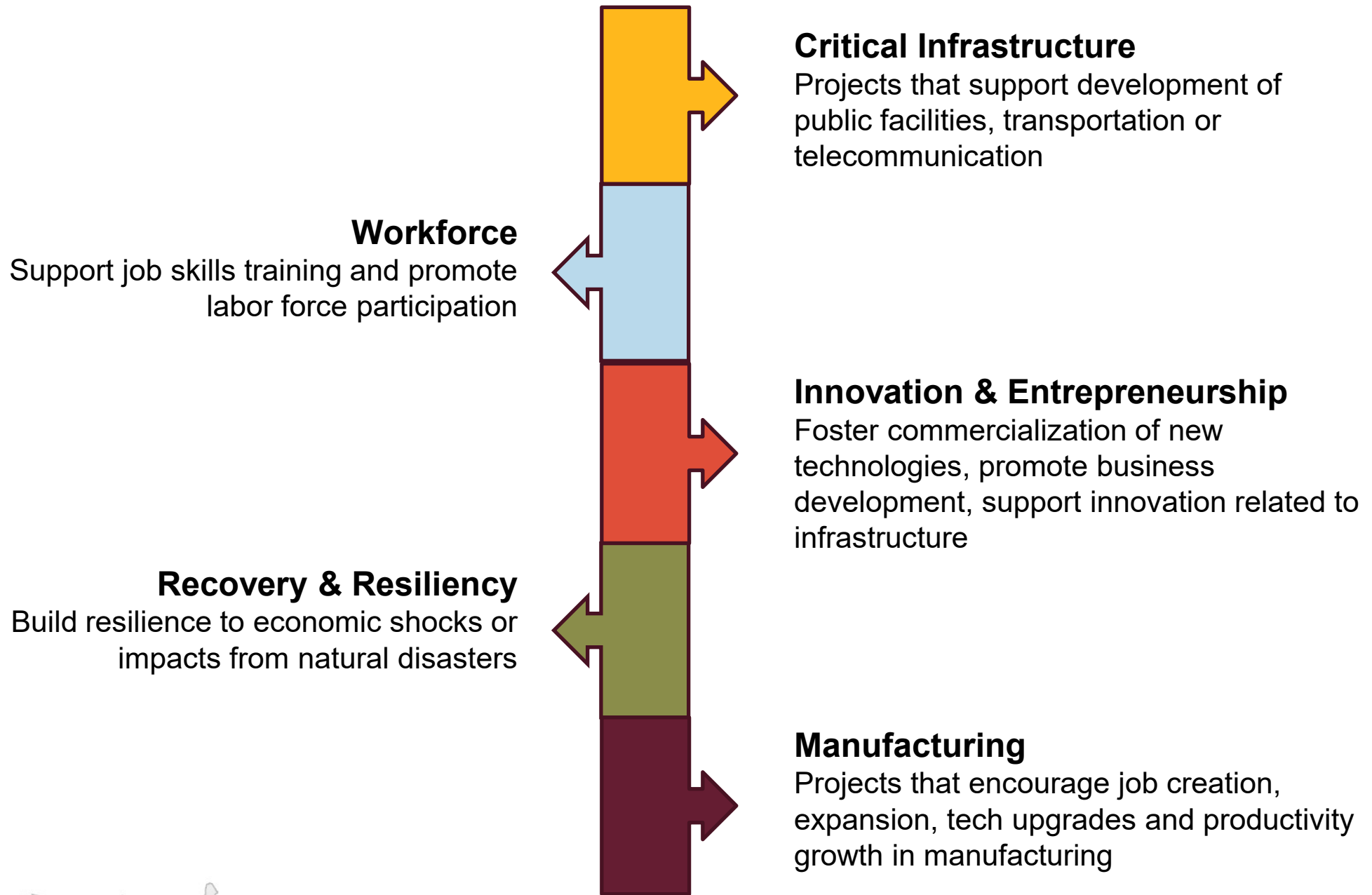

WHEREAS, MVRPC is seeking funding from the U.S. Economic Development Administration to revise the regional CEDS to ensure the CEDS is in compliance with EDA regulations; and

WHEREAS, the CEDS for our Region was last updated in 2022; and

WHEREAS, a current and compliant CEDS is a pre-requisite for many funding opportunities available to our Region through the U.S. Department of Commerce; and

WHEREAS, the CEDS revision process will include regional partners in the business community and economic development organizations to mitigate unemployment impacts and workforce challenges through job skill development and training, industry diversification, business expansion, employment alternatives and synergy between retention and outside investment strategies; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC is requesting funding from the Economic Development Administration to assist in the revision of the CEDS in collaboration with The Dayton Development Coalition (DDC) as a partner on the award request; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC and DDC have committed technical expertise from their respective professional staff to collaborate in the leadership of the CEDS revision, contributing in-kind hours to satisfy the required 40% local match, with these resources not conditioned or encumbered in any way that would preclude their use consistent with the requirements of the award; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC Executive Director is the authorized representative to sign the EDA award application, sign award documents and commit matching share funds; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's request to the U.S. Economic Development Administration has the full support and cooperation of the MVRPC Board of Directors and that the local contribution required for the revised scope of work will be committed to the project for the period of performance.

RESOLUTION 25-28
REVISING THE SFY2026-SFY2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties including the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 1, 2025; and

WHEREAS, MVRPC, ODOT and GDRTA have made numerous changes to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP revision; and

WHEREAS, the proposed revision is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP revision is consistent with the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP revisions such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this revision will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopt **Revision #4** to the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.
