**The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Technical Advisory Committee met on August 21, 2025 at 9:30 a.m. at Dayton Realtors, 1515 S. Main Street, Dayton, OH 45409. All members and news media were notified of the meeting pursuant to the Sunshine Law.**

**I. INTRODUCTION**

Chairperson Huelskamp called the meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. Self-introductions were made.

**II. APPROVAL OF JULY 17, 2025 MEETING MINUTES**

Mr. Keith Smith made a motion to approve the meeting minutes. Mr. Hankins seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

### **III. Public Comment Period on Action Items**

None

### **IV. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS**

#### **A. Resolution 25-22: Recommended Adoption of Amendment #3 to MVRPC's SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)**

Mr. Daniel referred to the third amendment to the SFY 2026-2029 TIP and the numerous project changes made by MVRPC and ODOT. He reviewed key project details for all local jurisdiction projects and tables by county. He paused for any questions about the statewide line-item project tables or any projects. Afterwards, Mr. Daniel noted staff recommends forwarding Amendment #3 to the SFY 2026- 2029 Transportation Improvement Program to the Board of Directors.

Ms. Goff made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for adoption. Mr. Nick Smith seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **B. IJJA Funds Availability Report and Project Solicitation Request**

Mr. Daniel presented the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IJJA) Funds Availability Report, noting an anticipated short-range balance of \$19.7 million (\$16.4 M STP, \$1.6 M of TA funds and \$1.7 M CR.) He explained that CMAQ funds are now allocated through a statewide process with solicitations held biennially, so no local CMAQ solicitation will occur this year. Lastly, Mr. Daniel stated that based upon the financial report, staff formally requests MVRPC Board authorization to solicit member jurisdictions for new projects.

Mr. Norton made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for approval. Mr. Kiser seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **C. Resolution 25-23: Updating MVRPC's Suballocated Funding Policy**

Mr. Daniel presented information on the most recent updates to the MVRPC Suballocated Funding Policy. He explained that MVRPC's suballocated funding policies and procedures were last updated in 2024 to include minor edits to reflect the availability of a resurfacing set aside, CMAQ funding. MVRPC staff has since determined that additional updates are necessary. He then referred to the updates made in red text or strikethroughs in the policy document. Next, he opened the floor for questions. Lastly, Mr. Daniel stated staff recommends forwarding the updated policy to the Board of Directors for final approval.

Mr. Escobar made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for approval. Mr. Norton seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

#### **D. Resolution 25-24: Adopting a Goal to Eliminate Deaths and Serious Injuries on Miami Valley Roadways**

Ms. Whitaker presented an update on the Safe Streets for All (SS4A) Safety Action Plan, noting that MVRPC received federal funding to develop a regional plan aimed at eliminating roadway deaths and serious injuries. She highlighted crash data trends, high injury networks, and public engagement efforts, and presented a proposed vision and goal of reducing fatalities and serious injuries by 50% by 2040 with an eventual goal of zero. Next, she opened the floor for questions. Lastly, Ms. Whitaker stated that staff recommend forwarding the resolution adopting a goal to eliminate deaths and serious injuries on Miami Valley roadways to the Board of Directors for approval.

Ms. Kellum made a motion to recommend forwarding to the Board of Directors for approval. Mr. Escobar seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## **V. INFORMATION ITEMS**

### **A. Ohio Commuter Challenge**

Ms. Dent presented on the upcoming Ohio Commuter Challenge, hosted by MVRPC's Rideshare Program and Gohio Commute partners, taking place September 8–21, 2025. She explained that the challenge encourages commuters to log sustainable trips such as carpooling, biking, walking, transit, or telework on DriveLessLiveMore.org or GohioCommute.com to be entered for prizes. She then stated that the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) secured a \$500 donation from Commute with Enterprise to fund this year's cash prizes. Ms. Dent also highlighted outreach efforts, including newsletters, social media, and workplace posters, and then provided information on the newly developed Gohio Commute App. Lastly, she opened the floor for questions.

### **B. FY2027 Dayton Development Coalition's Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Process**

Mr. Daniel presented information on the FY2027 Dayton Development Coalition Priority Development and Advocacy Committee (PDAC) process. He explained that the PDAC process is used to evaluate and prioritize projects across the Miami Valley for federal and state funding opportunities, ensuring the region speaks with one voice. Solicitation for new projects will begin September 2, 2025, with submissions due October 24, 2025. MVRPC will lead the review of Transportation and Government Services projects, with priorities forwarded to the MVRPC Board of Directors in December for final review and adoption before submittal to the Dayton Regional PDAC. The floor was then opened for questions.

MVRPC is seeking funding from the U.S. Economic Development Administration to revise the regional [CEDS](#) to ensure the CEDS is in compliance with EDA regulations. The CEDS for our Region was last updated in 2022. A current and compliant CEDS is necessary as a pre-requisite for many critical [funding opportunities](#) available to our Region through the U.S. Department of Commerce.

MVRPC is requesting funding from the Economic Development Administration to assist in the revision of the CEDS with the Dayton Development Coalition (DDC) as a partner on the award request.

MVRPC and DDC have committed technical expertise from their respective professional staff to collaborate in the leadership of the CEDS revision, contributing in-kind hours equal to satisfy the required 40% local match for the project.

A resolution supporting MVRPC's application to the EDA is attached for your review and consideration.

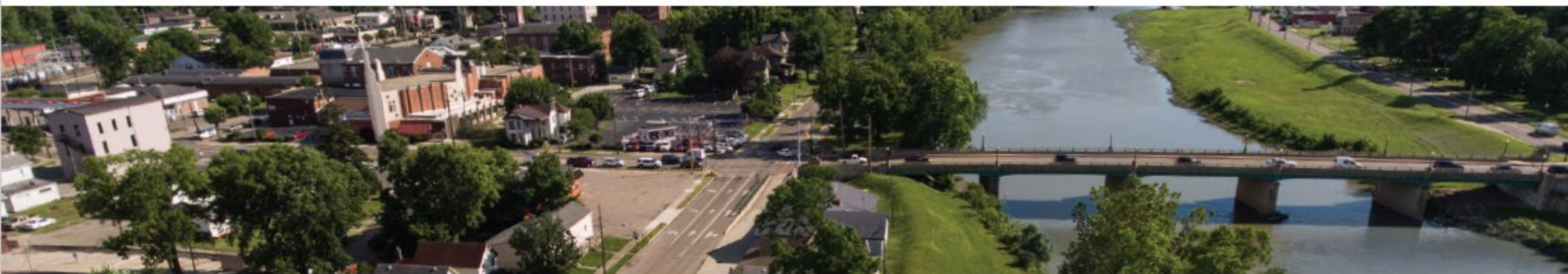

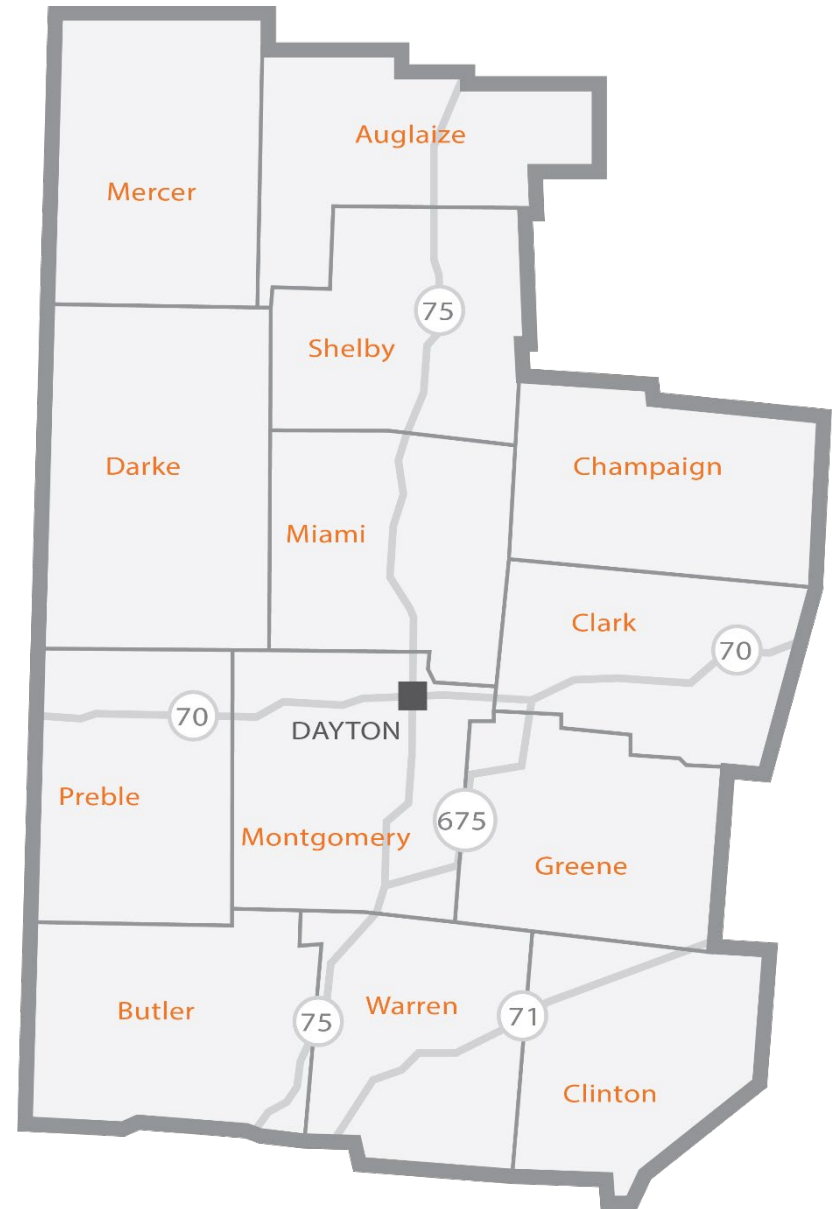

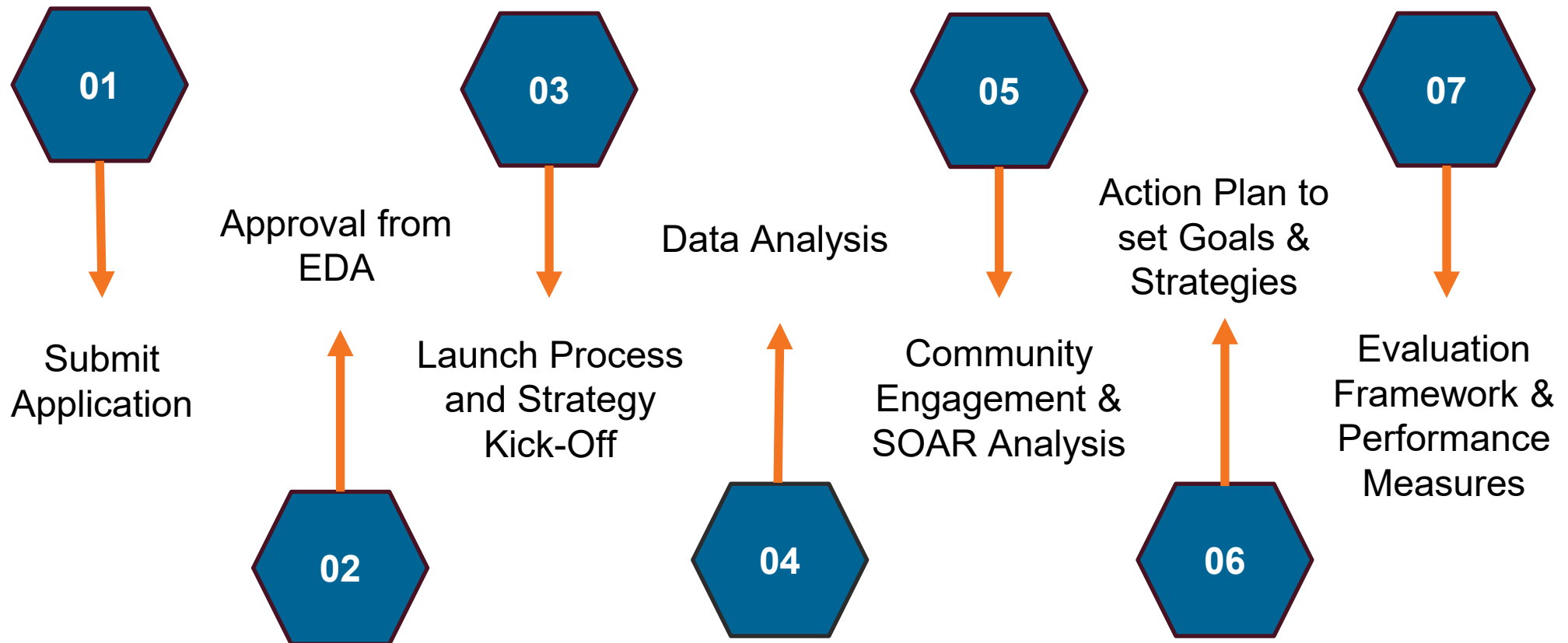

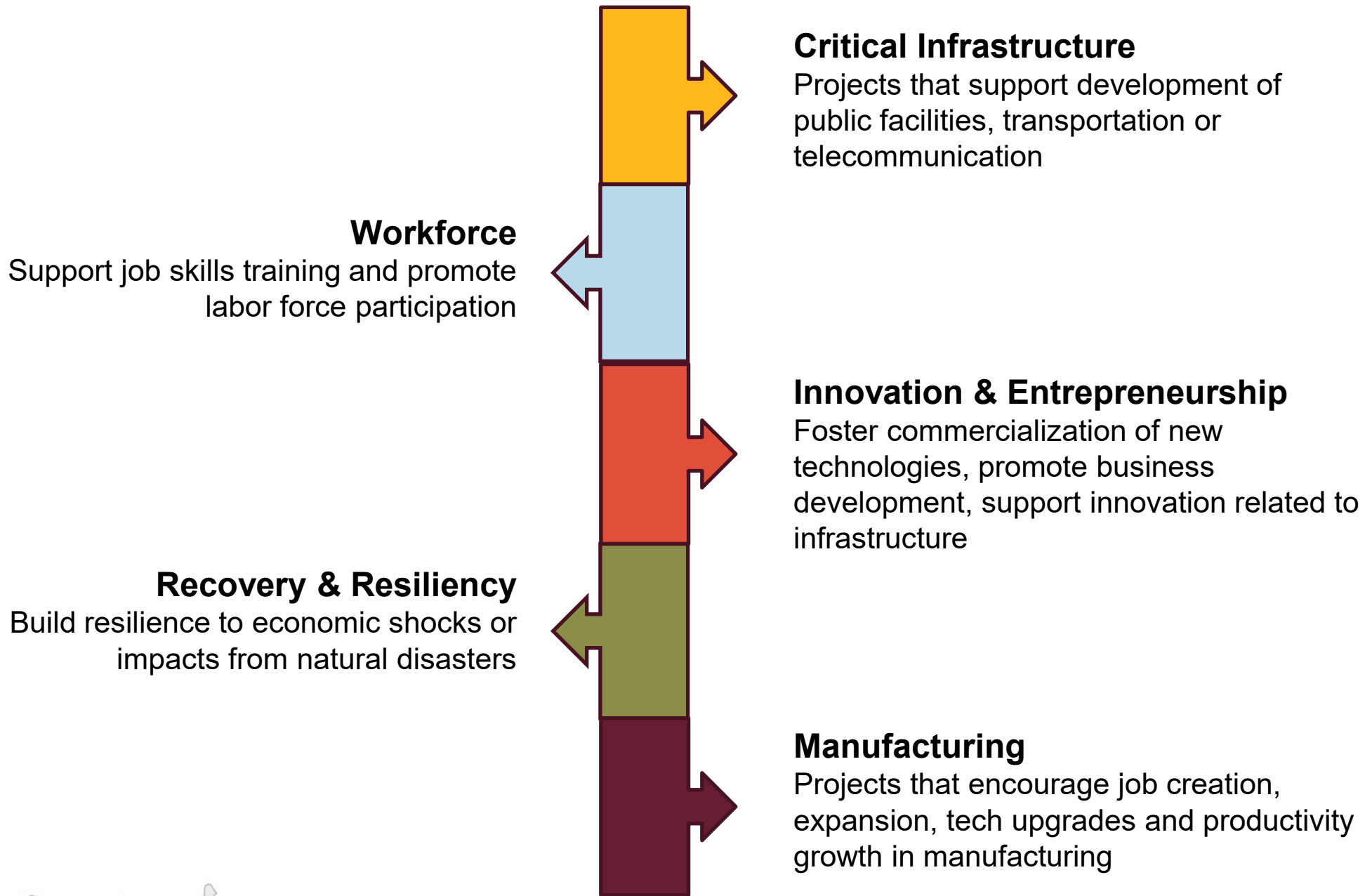

# Calendar Year 2026 CEDS Revision



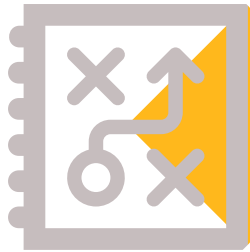

**WHEREAS**, the CEDS revision process will include regional partners in the business community and economic development organizations to mitigate unemployment impacts and workforce challenges through job skill development and training, industry diversification, business expansion, employment alternatives and synergy between retention and outside investment strategies; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC is requesting funding from the Economic Development Administration to assist in the revision of the CEDS in collaboration with The Dayton Development Coalition (DDC) as a partner on the award request; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC and DDC have committed technical expertise from their respective professional staff to collaborate in the leadership of the CEDS revision, contributing in-kind hours to satisfy the required 40% local match, with these resources not conditioned or encumbered in any way that would preclude their use consistent with the requirements of the award; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC Executive Director is the authorized representative to sign the EDA award application, sign award documents and commit matching share funds; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's request to the U.S. Economic Development Administration has the full support and cooperation of the MVRPC Board of Directors and that the local contribution required for the revised scope of work will be committed to the project for the period of performance.

**RESOLUTION 25-28**  
**REVISING THE SFY2026-SFY2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

**WHEREAS**, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties including the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

**WHEREAS**, all Federally funded transit and highway improvements within Greene, Miami and Montgomery County must be included in the region's Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) prior to the expenditure of Federal funds; and

**WHEREAS**, the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program was adopted on May 1, 2025; and

**WHEREAS**, MVRPC, ODOT and GDRTA have made numerous changes to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP revision; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed revision is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

**WHEREAS**, this TIP revision is consistent with the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP; and

**WHEREAS**, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP revisions such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, this revision will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, that the MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopt **Revision #4** to the SFY2026-SFY2029 Transportation Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

## MVRPC Publishes the Community Health Mapping Application

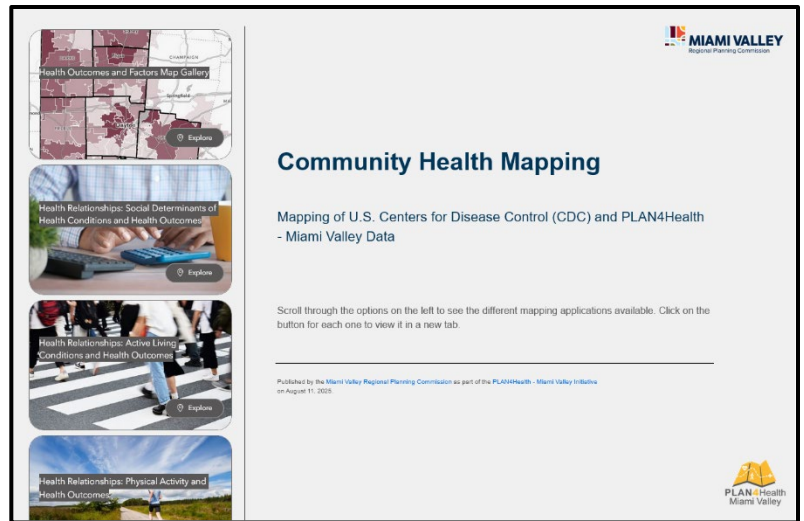
MVRPC is pleased to announce the release of the [Community Health Mapping](https://arcg.is/1LmzaP3) (<https://arcg.is/1LmzaP3>) application. Published as the seventh project from the [PLAN4Health - Miami Valley](#) Initiative, this application features five interactive map galleries, providing data and information on health factors and conditions, health outcomes, and the relationship between them in the Miami Valley.

The application uses data from the PLACES Data Portal provided by the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and the Social Determinants of Health Conditions and Active Living Conditions measurements developed by MVRPC as part of the [PLAN4Health - Miami Valley](#) Initiative.

We hope the data and information provide helpful insights on our current health conditions. In addition, we hope the information would facilitate planners and public health professionals making informed decisions as we work together to create environments that promote healthy behaviors, improve health outcomes, and achieve healthy people and communities.

MVRPC's [PLAN4Health – Miami Valley](#) Initiative was launched in the Spring of 2021 to explore how planning can impact health outcomes. The PLAN4Health - Miami Valley Initiative is a multi-year effort with a focus on projects and programs intended to:

- Promote and advocate for “Health in All Plans and Policies”
- Convene and engage partners to improve conditions that are known to be key determinants of health
- Advance planning efforts aimed at creating conditions for healthy people and communities

## Certification Review

The United States Department of Transportation (U.S. DOT) is conducting a Certification Review of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's (MVRPC) Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process on **Wednesday, September 24, from 8:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m.**

The current federal transportation legislation, known as the IIJA, defines the stewardship role of the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) in the implementation of the mandated Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process. As a result of the planning requirements, the federal agencies are required to review and certify, at least every four (4) years, that the Transportation Planning Processes of the Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs), such as MVRPC, are in compliance.
