MVRPC 2020 Census Participants Statistical Areas Program (PSAP) Interested Parties Review

As part of the efforts to prepare for the 2020 Census, MVRPC is participating in the Census Participant Statistical Areas Program (PSAP), an effort by the U.S. Census Bureau to update the boundaries for Census block groups, tracts, and Census Designated Places. The goal of this program is to update the boundaries so that they reflect changes in population and, when possible, the needs of local Census data users. MVRPC staff is coordinating this effort for the counties of Darke, Greene, Miami, Montgomery, and Preble.

MVRPC will be holding an open-house style workshop to gather information from interested parties on how these boundaries should or should not be changed. No formal presentations will be made at this workshop and interested parties are invited to arrive any time during the designated three-hour period. The meeting will be held as follows:
