I. INTRODUCTION

Chair Gruner called the meeting to order. Self-introductions were made.

II. APPROVAL OF OCTOBER 15, 2015 MEETING MINUTES

Mr. Ecklar made a motion to approve minutes. Mr. Burkholder seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

III. Public Comment Period on Action Items

None

IV. MPO (METROPOLITAN PLANNING ORGANIZATION) ACTION ITEMS

A. Recommended Adoption of Amendment to MVRPC's SFY2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 4 of the mailout explaining that numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects has resulted in the need for a TIP amendment. He referred to the project tables for each county as well as the statewide line item projects, noting an additional handout for a Greene Co. project on Grange Hall Rd. Mr. Arnold stated that staff does recommend adoption of this TIP amendment, and referred to a resolution on page 14 of the mailout. Mr. Conway made a motion to recommend adoption. Mr. Spitler seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

B. Recommended Adoption of Proposed list of 2040 Long Range Transportation Plan Congestion Management Projects; Summary of Public Participation Meetings (October 20-22) and Financial Analysis.

Mr. Arnold explained how the 2040 LRTP's 25 year forecasted revenues were determined by considering two main funding sources: the TIP and local funds. The TIP includes funds from the Ohio Department of Transportation as well as other MPO-controlled funds. Local jurisdiction funds include Ohio Public Works funds, and Local ED/GE grants, in addition to local revenues. He reviewed how the revenue forecast was completed by identifying the actual expenditures in each funding source and using those as a base to calculate the year 2040 revenue forecast. Therefore, the 25-year time period was separated into two increments. Mr. Arnold stated that the first increment is from SFY2016 to SFY2019 and includes the actual programmed expenditures for that time period in the current TIP. The second increment includes the remaining 21 years in the period and is further sub-divided into three additional increments (2020), (2021-2030), and (2031-2040).

Mr. Arnold explained how the first step was to determine annual average TIP expenditures for the past three years (2013-2015); the annual average was then used to calculate available revenues in the remainder years of the Plan. A similar process was used for the locally funded project expenditures, MVRPC's annual survey data on local jurisdiction's actual expenditures on transportation improvement projects in previous years were used to determine the annual average expenditures. Based on annual expenditures identified, total expenditures for the time period of SFY2016-2019 were calculated. Similarly, the annual average was multiplied by 1 and 10 to determine the remaining 21-year revenue forecast. He reviewed how the forecasted revenues for the entire 25 year were determined by adding actual TIP and local expenditures to the projected figures of the remaining 21 year forecasts from both TIP and local sources. Mr. Arnold reported that the next step in the revenue forecasting process was to determine how much of the total revenue will be available for the maintenance/reconstruction versus operational/safety/capacity improvements type of projects. On average, the region is expending approximately 62% of its roadway budget on maintenance/reconstruction and 38% on operational/safety/capacity projects. The forecasted revenue for the operational, safety, and capacity projects shown in the table below will be used to demonstrate the financial constraint for the transportation plan congestion management projects.

Ms. Ramirez reviewed the process for the development of the congestion management project solicitation and development of the proposed project list. She reported that staff conducted three Public Participation meetings in Miami, Montgomery and Greene Counties. A summary of public comments received was included in the mailout. Ms. Ramirez explained that the next step is to conduct the technical analysis which includes air quality conformity; plan evaluation, community impact assessment and environmental mitigation. Ms. Ramirez stated that staff does recommend adoption of the Resolution on page 48 of the mailout. Mr. Steeber made a motion to approve. Mr. Ecklar seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

V. INFORMATION ITEMS

A. Proposed new projects requesting MVRPC's STP and TA Funds

Mr. Arnold referred to a memo on page 49 of the mailout. The memo provided a table showing the funds requested and total project costs for both funding categories. He reported that a public involvement meeting was held on November 25, and a summary of all comments received is included in the mailout, as well as project tables that provide more details for each of the project applications that were submitted.

After each proposed project is evaluated and ranked, a final list of recommended projects will be reviewed by the TAC in January or February and forwarded to the Board of Directors for final approval in February or March.

B. "Taking Care of What We Have – Transportation Asset Management Plan (TAMP)"

Mr. Parrill presented information on ODOT's "Asset Management – Taking Care of What We Have" Program. Transportation Asset Management is an agency wide commitment and represents the highest form of "Excellence in Government" and applies to all Departments, Divisions and Districts within ODOT. As such, the purpose of the Transportation Asset Management Plan (TAMP) is to follow a strategic direction in regards to managing our Assets through collection of good data and leveraging Technology. He reviewed that this is a three-pronged approach that includes State of the Art Technology for Improved Decision-Making; Aggressive Preservation Treatments; and, More Collaboration. The TAMP will include two years of Operations activities and a six year Capital Program that addresses system preservation needs.

Mr. Fluegemann explained that a \$14B financial gap exists between needs and resources (based on historic trends). Freight volumes and tonnage are increasing, and funding is not adequate to maintain the condition of infrastructure assets, such as pavements, bridges, and culverts. He explained that the performance-based decision process recommended under MAP-21 legislation, and the Department's efforts at developing a Transportation Asset Management Plan, have found that to meet the goals outlined in Access Ohio 2040 and to lower the life cycle cost of maintaining these assets, preservation treatments should be used more effectively throughout the system. The increased use of these treatments will reduce the cost of maintaining pavements, bridges, and culverts without sacrificing conditions.

Mr. Fluegemann stated they are implementing this program to achieve the following:

FOSTERING more consistency across Districts.

BUILDING a collaborative project-selection process built on optimized investment strategies.

HELPING to ensure statewide goals are achieved.

REDUCING annual and life cycle costs once steady-state conditions are achieved.

REMOVING artificial distinctions between "Capital Projects" and "Maintenance Activities."

COORDINATING preservation activities through Planning.

USING performance data to guide funding allocations.

He also explained that the benefits of the program are; Improved consistency in practices across Districts; increased use of preservation treatments; more cost-effective use of available funds; and reduction in pavement and bridge life cycle costs by 25 to 60 percent.

Mr. Steeber asked if this plan includes assets other than pavement such as guardrail and lighting. Mr. Parrill explained that there is an asset management team that will be working on this plan, and what will be included in Tier I further into the process. Mr. Martin asked if the GAP projects will come through Ellis and the TIP. Mr. Fluegemann explained that these will be included in the TIP.

VI. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Mr. Martin reported that a new Federal Funding bill is due on December 4th, and we are optimistic that this will happen.

He referred to his November report on page 62 of the mailout that provided some additional information on the federal funding, some recent grant opportunities as well as a list of upcoming meetings.

VII. ADJOURNMENT

Mr. Anderson made a motion to adjourn. Mr. Donnelly seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

WHEREAS, MVRPC, ODOT and GDRTA have made numerous modifications to the programming documents for various projects resulting in the need for a SFY2016-SFY2019 TIP amendment; and

WHEREAS, the proposed amendment is consistent with the Region's long-range transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, this TIP amendment will not affect the regional air quality emission analysis of the SFY2016-SFY2019 TIP; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC Public Participation Policy for Transportation Planning process allows for minor TIP amendments such as this to occur without separate public involvement meetings; and

WHEREAS, this amendment will result in a TIP that is in reasonable fiscal constraint

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby adopts **Amendment #7** to the <u>SFY2016-SFY2019 Transportation</u> Improvement Program as shown on the attached TIP Tables.

Advocacy Committee (PDAC) Projects

The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is working with other organizations throughout the Miami Valley to identify projects that may be eligible for funding. This group, the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee, has developed a process for soliciting projects for consideration of funding through the legislative process. Through a committee decision, the top projects are forwarded on to elected officials for deliberation.

MVRPC is the lead agency for Transportation projects, which include any surface, air, rail, transit, and pedestrian transportation-related projects. Five FY2017 PDAC Transportation project applications, requesting \$125 million, were received by the deadline of November 13, 2015 (see attached Exhibit 2 and Exhibit 3).

MVRPC is also the lead agency for Government Services projects, which include any emergency services, criminal justice, first responders, community and neighborhood infrastructure and K-12 education-related projects. Six FY2017 PDAC Government Services project applications, requesting \$7.9 million, were received by the deadline of November 13, 2015 (see attached Exhibit 5 and Exhibit 6).

The Transportation and Government Services projects were evaluated by a review panel on January 13, 2016. The MVRPC Review Panel reviewed and concurred with the staff categorization of the proposed projects. The criteria used to categorize the Transportation and Government Services applications can be found at: http://mvrpc.org/transportation/financing/pdac.

The MVRPC Review Panel is recommending Five Transportation "Traditional" (Roadway)/"Non-Traditional" (Bikeway) projects and Six Government Services projects for submittal to the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee in categorized order (see attached Exhibit 1). A resolution endorsing these recommendations is attached for your consideration.

The list of recommended priorities is now being sent to the MVRPC Board structure for final review and adoption and submittal to the Dayton Region Priority Development and Advocacy Committee.

Springfield Downtown Streets Conversion

The project will convert four (4) streets in the Springfield central business district from one-way to two-way operation. The conversion will consist of milling and filling the pavement, removal of existing pavement markings, installation of new pavement markings, replacing and upgrading signage, and replacing and upgrading traffic signals. The project limits are Limestone between High and North, Fountain between High and Main, and Main and High between Yellow Springs and Spring.

I-675 at Grange Hall Road

The proposed I-675/Grange Hall Road interchange project consists of the modification of the existing interchange from a partial interchange to a full interchange. This includes a Conceptual Alternatives Study (CAS) and an Interchange Modification Study (IMS). This upgrade is needed to address congestion and safety issues on the local roadways and interstate from people trying to arrive and leave from WPAFB, WSU, Soin Medical Center, and surrounding businesses in this regional business center.

I-675 at Wilmington Pike Interchange

This project provides interchange modifications to increase the capacity of Wilmington Pike and the existing I-675 ramps. Development of a hospital and medical campus is complete with anticipated future expansion. With the initial phase of major retail, commercial and residential development complete; preliminary planning continues for additional phases adjacent to the interchange. The transportation infrastructure will require expansion to protect the health, safety and welfare of all users.

Piqua Great Miami River Trail Pedestrian Replacement Bridge

FY2017 REVIEW PANEL GOVERNMENT SERVICES PROJECT SUMMARIES

Airport Infrastructure and Vehicle Enhancement

The project will upgrade surface conditions and replace vehicles at the Wilmington Airport. The first portion will sawcut and replace runway panels in the touchdown zone, as well as sections of Ramp B near the taxiway and maintenance/repair operations building. This project will also purchase a tandem axle truck with snow plow; replace four property maintenance vans, purchase two used airport snow plows, and purchase on tow-behind snow broom.

Dayton International Airport Energy Systems Efficiency Upgrades

The project upgrades the Airport's terminal Mechanical Systems and develops a Micro-Grid Pilot Project. Many of the mechanical systems were installed in the 70's and 80's and have reached the end of their useful life. In addition, the micro-grid pilot enhances the Airport's resiliency and includes battery storage supplementing our power generation capabilities, allowing for the continued safe and secure operation of the airport in the event of a catastrophic power outage.

Multi County Flood Prevention Emergency Equipment

A backup generator and portable pumps are critical operational disaster readiness & response equipment needed during major high-water events with power failure. Without reliable power generation and pumping capability, MCD's emergency response activities (flood gate operation; monitoring dam/levee conditions and reacting to potential failure modes; operating automatic and manual pumps to remove water from low lying areas; and securing levee openings or breaches) become nearly impossible.

Regional Flood Protection Levee Armoring

MCD safeguards local communities against flooding. Levees are a key part of averting a flooding disaster. MCD oversees 55 miles of levees spread over 4 counties: Miami, Montgomery, Warren, and Butler. This project upgrades the aging infrastructure of our region's flood protection system and safeguards lives and properties in cities along the Great Miami River. The armoring protects levees at areas where high river flow velocities could cause serious erosion and potential levee failure.

Neil Armstrong Airport Modernization and Safety Project

The project will modernize and improve safety at the Neil Armstrong Airport with the construction of a new terminal and safety equipment storage building at the airport in New Knoxville, Auglaize County, OH. The airport's role as a gateway to industry in the region has been increasing steadily as the airport has become a hub for businesses such as Honda, Crown, Minster Machine, Setex, Dannon and Parker Hannifin.

Wilmington Air Park Aviation Improvements recommended by FAA/ODOT

This project will relocate the airport service road for the primary runway safety area, acquire land for the runway protection zone, acquire and install 100LL self-service fuel pumping station, and perform cracksealing and repair of runways and taxiways.



Statewide, Nine deaths over Thanksgiving Weekend

Provisional numbers released 12/1/15 by the Ohio State Highway Patrol show fewer motorists were killed on Ohio's roadways this Thanksgiving Holiday than in recent years. Nine people were killed during the five day reporting period from seven crashes Wednesday, November 25 through Sunday, November 29. This is a decrease from the past three years when 23 were killed in 2014, 17 were killed in 2013, 12 were killed in 2012.

The Patrol made 498 arrests for OVI, 688 for aggressive driving and issued 1,651 citations for not wearing safety belts – all three increased from last year.

"We are always pleased to see a decrease in lives lost on Ohio's roadways. However, we can't settle until the number of fatalities is zero," said Colonel Paul A. Pride, Patrol superintendent. "The

Grants/Community Brownfield Funding Resources

ODNR Ohio Recreational Trail Program Grant. This is a reimbursement grant program that provides up to 80 percent project funding. This grant program is federally funded and is administered by the Ohio Department of Natural Resources (ODNR) in cooperation with the FHWA.

Eligible projects include development of urban trail linkages, trail head and trailside facilities; maintenance of existing trails; restoration of trail areas damaged by usage; improving access for people with disabilities; acquisition of easements and property; development and construction of new trails; purchase and lease of recreational trail construction and maintenance equipment; environment and safety education programs related to trails.

Who can apply: Cities and villages, counties, townships, special districts, state and federal agencies, and nonprofit organizations are eligible.

Deadline: All 2016 grant applications must be post marked by February 1st, 2016.

Ohio Abandoned Gas Station Cleanup Grant. Ohio Development Services Agency, in partnership with Ohio EPA and the Department of Commerce, Bureau of Underground Storage Tank Regulations (BUSTR), announced a resource to help clean up abandoned gas and service stations throughout Ohio. The Abandoned Gas Station Cleanup Grant will provide funding to assess and clean up BUSTR Class C sites (underground storage tanks with documented petroleum releases).

Eligible activities include up to \$100,000 for assessment and up to \$500,000 for cleanup. Other eligible activities include costs to empty or remove underground storage tanks, abatement of asbestos, lead or other contamination, demolition and site clearance. Priority will be given to vacant gas or service station projects where cleanup provides the greatest environmental, community and economic impact.

<u>Who can apply</u>: Local government entities who own the eligible property or who have an agreement with the landowner may apply. The applicant and property owner cannot have contributed to the prior release of petroleum or other hazardous substance on the site.

Deadline: Applications open in January 2016.
