

# G-393 MITIGATION FOR EMERGENCY MANAGERS

**Course Description:** This free course is designed to enable the non-technical emergency worker to acquire skills in the use of Mitigation. The course provides training in how to perform Mitigation activities fundamental to reducing and eliminating long-term risk from hazards. It addresses the important roles of the Emergency Program Manager (or other local government representative) in Mitigation: Motivator, Coordinator, and Monitor in local implementation of the National Mitigation Strategy.

The secondary audience includes Federal emergency management personnel and employees of federal, state, and local governments who work in the emergency management field.

**Recommended Prerequisite:** Completion of IS0393.b, Introduction to Hazard Mitigation.

**Enrollment:** Students must enroll via the Department of Public Safety Training Campus website: <https://trainingcampus.dps.ohio.gov/cm/cm710/pstc/pstc.html>. Course registration will generally close 10 working days prior to the course start date. You can check enrollment/approval status via the Department of Public Safety Training Campus website.

**Course Costs:** This course is free to participants; meals, per diem and mileage costs are the responsibility of the student or their parent organization.

**Lodging:** Ohio EMA will provide no-cost lodging if the student is an Ohio resident or works in the state of Ohio. Federal and private sector employees are not eligible for no-cost lodging provided by Ohio EMA and must fund their own lodging. Ohio EMA only provides no-cost lodging for eligible students commuting 45 miles or more away from their home and office to the training location.

If either the student's home or office is less than 45 miles from Ohio EMA or the training location, Ohio EMA will not provide no-cost lodging.
