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CHAPTER I

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION OVERVIEW

Overview

MVRPC’s integration of a more proactive approach in transportation planning is accomplished through the public participation process. The process is made up of multiple components, including consultation with the TAC and MVRPC Board of Directors, the LRTP sponsors and stakeholders, and general outreach to the public. Additionally, community outreach efforts were expanded in an attempt to reach vulnerable populations.

As per the IIJA, a MPO needs to develop and use a documented public participation plan that defines a process for providing citizens, affected public agencies, representatives of public transportation employees, freight shippers, providers of freight transportation services, private providers of transportation, etc. with reasonable opportunities to be involved in the metropolitan transportation planning process. MVRPC last updated its *Public Participation Policy* in May 2024. The policy details the LRTP public participation requirements and complies with current planning regulations and the IIJA statutory provisions. MVRPC made an extensive public outreach effort to solicit input from the general public and special interest groups in order to increase public participation in the 2050 LRTP update process. The policy’s key items include an expanded public participation notification list, use of technology to enhance communication with the public (website applications and social media), and efforts to reach vulnerable populations.

Public participation is conducted both in-person through in-person meetings and comment cards and in a virtual environment using Zoom meetings and relying on plan2050.mvrpc.org to communicate information.

For the May 2026 Update of the 2050 LRTP, MVRPC created a webpage solely dedicated to the update effort and promoted its use through public notices, advertising, and social media as a one-stop shop for all items related to the Plan update. The webpage launched in July 2025 and was available throughout the update process and included the update timeline, information presented at various meetings, comment card, and an interactive map with the ability to comment on individual projects on the map. Figure 11.1 depicts the various webpage features including the ability to view website content in Spanish by using an online translator.

Public Participation Meetings

Beginning in August 2025, the public was involved in each step of the 2050 LRTP update process through the use of various tools. Virtual public participation meetings were held to present the latest information pertaining to the update and MVRPC staff was available at the meetings to answer questions. Comments received at the meetings were recorded and reference was made to the online comment cards. MVRPC's website was updated frequently to provide the latest information and an online version of the comment card was made available to receive comments 24/7 on any of the information provided. The same information was also made available at MVRPC's offices during the comment period for each meeting.

The first phase of the public participation process involved hosting one virtual public participation meetings in August 2025 to provide transportation-related background information used in the development of the LRTP, most notably incorporating the results of the 2020 Census. The second phase included presenting the draft list of multimodal transportation projects in a virtual public participation meeting and an open house public participation meeting in October 2025.

Finally, the last phase of public participation took place in April of 2026, through a virtual public meeting format, to present the final draft 2050 LRTP including the findings of various LRTP analyses. Comments received at each meeting were presented to the TAC and the Board of Directors prior to action on LRTP related items.

MVRPC's 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan – Public Participation Summary report provides comprehensive information and documentation regarding the public participation process, including all the public outreach materials used to promote the meetings, a listing of information presented at the meetings, and all the comments received. Table 11.1 provides a brief summary of each meeting. Community Outreach and Public Participation

In accordance with federal law, Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPO) are responsible for facilitating dialogue, record input received and incorporate the thoughts and concerns of the public into the development of major MPO planning documents and in various aspects of the MPO planning process. Extensive outreach efforts throughout all areas of the region are conducted in order to assemble a broad cross-section of input into the decision-making process, including traditionally underserved areas. MVRPC's outreach efforts in these areas will continue to provide these residents with an opportunity to voice their opinions and concerns.

These efforts included:

- Expanding the mailing list to include vulnerable populations (low-income, minority, elderly, and disabled);
- Adapting advertising for ease of understanding, including special articles and flyers;
- Expanding advertising to online platforms (e.g. YouTube, Spotify) to reach a more diverse population;
- Adapting public meeting times and locations for accessibility;
- Advertising at GDRTA Hubs and public libraries;

- Purchasing public notices in Dayton Weekly, a minority distribution newspaper;
- Offering an English-to-Spanish translator on MVRPC's website; and
- Posting information about upcoming meetings on social networking sites such as Twitter/X and Facebook.

Participation in Other Public Outreach Efforts

During the 2050 LRTP update cycle, MVRPC staff actively participated and/or attended numerous public participation meetings pertaining to studies and projects on progress throughout the Region. These meetings ranged from stakeholder meetings to public hearings related to various transportation studies, as well as Comprehensive and/or Land Use Plans being developed by member jurisdictions. By attending the meetings, staff members were able to gain a better understanding of the projects and studies and to listen to any concerns that the general public might have regarding the project or study. MVRPC staff were also able to answer any questions that arose in relation to MVRPC's planning activities and the 2050 LRTP.

Consultation Requirements in IIJA

The IIJA mandates that the MPO consult, as appropriate, with State and local agencies responsible for land use management, natural resources, environmental protection, conservation, and historic preservation concerning the development of the transportation plan. MVRPC's Public Participation contact list has been expanded to include agencies with an interest in the areas of land use management, environmental resources, environmental protection, conservation, and historic preservation. As a result the list now includes nearly 400 agencies and individuals.

All contacts are notified and given the opportunity to comment on any transportation program that requires action by the MVRPC Board of Directors, such as the Long Range Transportation Plan and the Transportation Improvement Program.

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

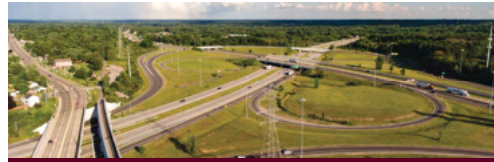

Search Begins for 2025 Dayton Holiday Festival Tree



The Dayton Holiday Festival tree will be lit on Courthouse Square during the annual Grande Illumination on Friday, November 28.

We're still a few months off from the holiday season, but it's time to start decking the halls! The Downtown Dayton Partnership (DDP) is looking for the perfect tree to be the centerpiece of the 2025 Dayton Holiday Festival. Once lit, the tree will remain on the Courthouse Square stage throughout the holiday season.

Thousands of lights will adorn the tree before it's officially lit for the first time during this year's Grande Illumination celebration on

Friday, November 28. Crews will cut down the selected tree, remove the stump, and transport the tree to Courthouse Square at no cost to the tree owners. The tree's owners will also be recognized during the official tree-lighting ceremony.

Trees should meet the following guidelines:

- The ideal tree should be stand at approximately 40-50 feet tall
- The ideal tree should be full with minimal bare spots
- Colorado green spruce or blue spruce trees are preferred, but other grand and stately evergreens will be considered
- The tree must be lo-

is designed to provide a quick, reliable and affordable transportation option for people looking to experience all the attractions the museum has to offer.

Route X6 will run seven days a week from 8:45 a.m. to 5:15 p.m. to coincide with the Air Force Museum's hours of operation and will have a frequency of less than 40 minutes.

It will travel through the downtown corridor making stops at the recently opened hotels before traveling along Main Street and hopping on State Route 4 to the museum. From there, it will travel along Harshman Road before turning onto Airway Road and heading to Wright State University. It will also connect with RTA's Routes 1 and 6 at the intersection of Woodman Drive and Airway Road making for easy transfers.

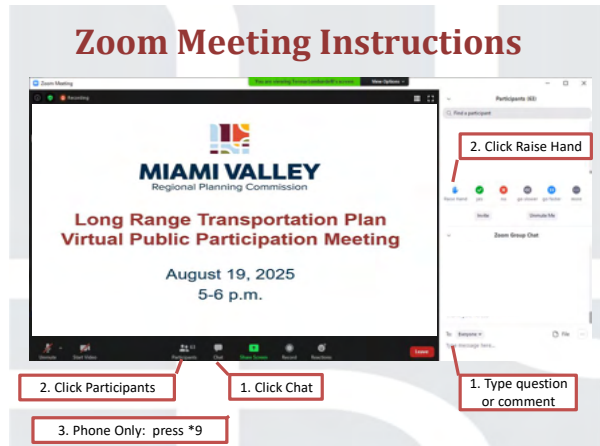
Plan 2050 Timeline

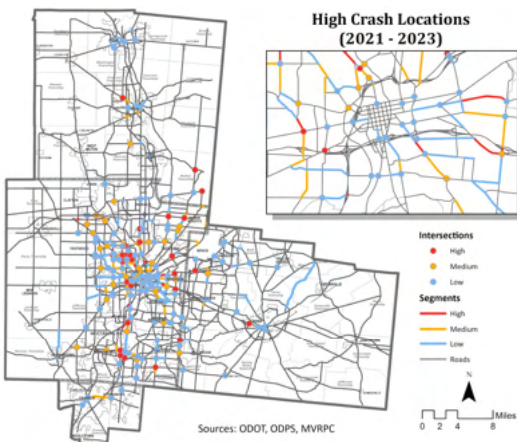


Distracted Driving Crashes

Alternative Transportation Modes (Passenger and Freight)





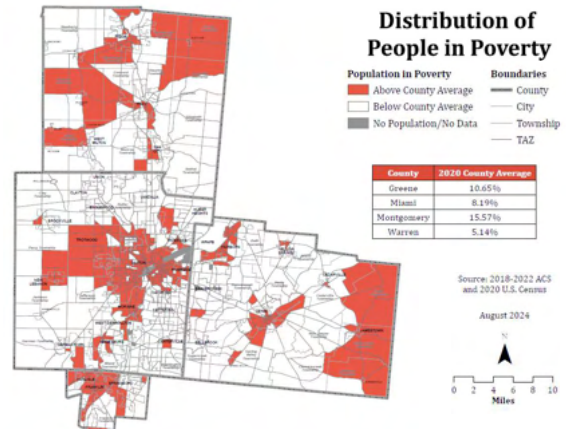
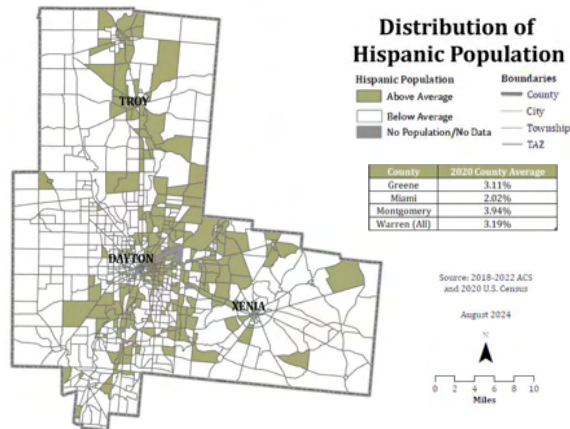
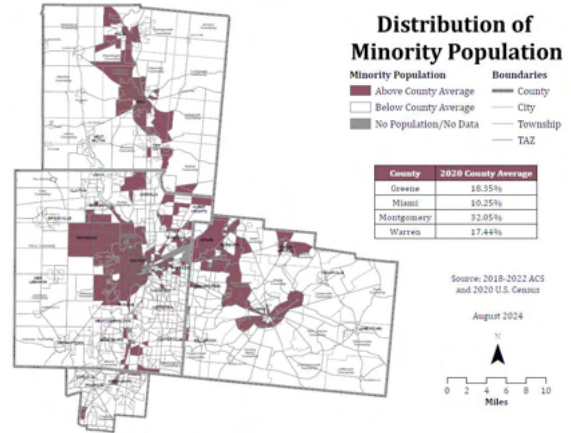
Community Impact Assessment

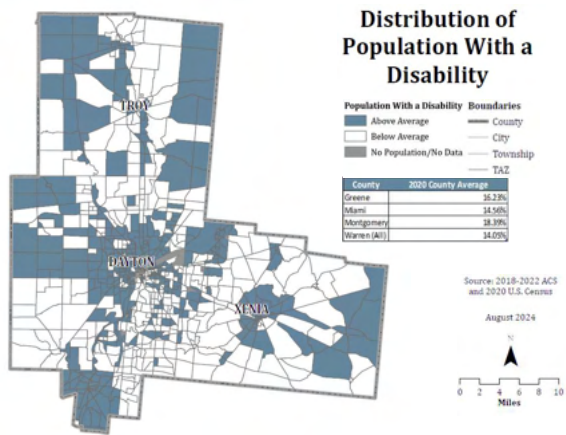
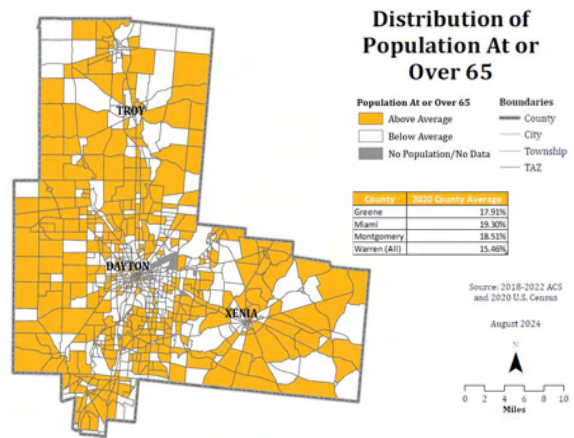
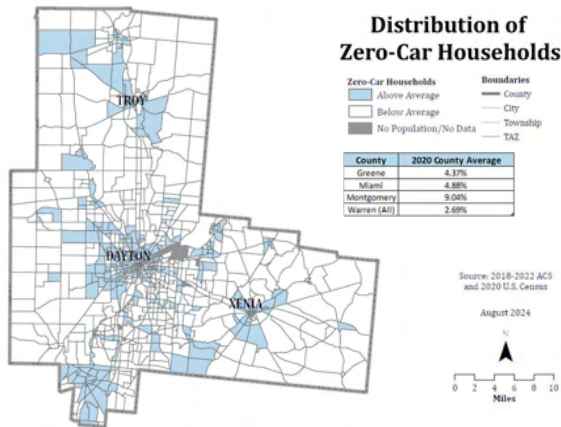
Overview

The goal of MVRPC's Community Impact Assessment is to consider the needs of vulnerable populations in the transportation planning process. This initiative entails various quantitative analyses using Geographic Information Systems (GIS). The Community Impact Assessment initiatives began in 2001, as part of the 2025 Long Range Transportation Plan, with data from the 1990 census. The most recent Community Impact Assessment incorporates the latest data from the 2020 Census and 2018-2022 American Community Survey.

MVRPC's Approach

In addition to racial and ethnic minorities and persons in poverty, MVRPC has traditionally expanded its definition of vulnerable populations to include other traditionally disadvantaged groups, including persons with disabilities, the elderly, and households without automobiles.





Land Use & Socioeconomic Projections

Land Use

Land development throughout the Region has been largely concentrated along major highways, namely I-75, I-70, and I-675. As of 2018, over 60% of the Region's land was classified as agricultural or open space. Residential land constituted the next largest percentage (24.3%), followed by institutional and commercial land (3.6% and 3.4%, respectively).

Residential development throughout the Region is spread fairly even throughout the urbanized area, with high concentrations in eastern Montgomery County and western part of Greene County and along I-75 in Miami County.

Commercial development is spread somewhat less evenly, with concentrations around three suburban malls and in the Dayton CBD. Additional commercial areas are found along the major transportation routes. As a result, most parts of the Region are well served by retail and service facilities.

Industrial development in the Region generally follows the I-75 corridor, which parallels the Great Miami River and provides access to factories and office clusters stretching from the City of Piqua in northern Miami County down to southern Montgomery County. The most important concentration of employment outside of the I-75 corridor is located along the Greene/ Montgomery County border near the intersection of I-70 with SR 4 and along I-675.

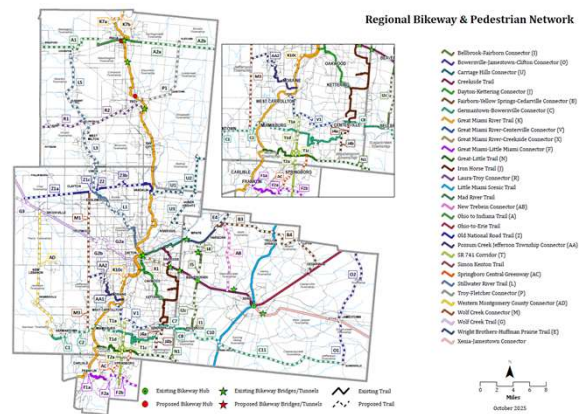
Draft Transportation Projects Overview



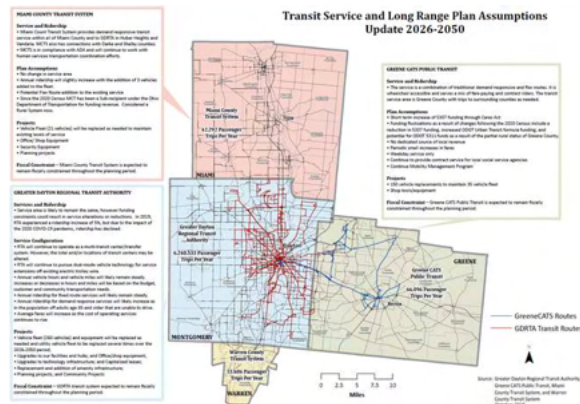

Some of the recent additions to this road (like the flashing lights to get to and from the park) are great, and I hope future work is of a similar quality. A dedicated path for bikes and pedestrians I would support, walking or biking along the road shoulder without some barrier I wouldn't. Generally speaking, I hope that projects across the region prioritize bike and pedestrian connections, especially getting people connected to already large regional trails (like the Little Miami Trail).

he's become too big for Meagan to lift in and out of their standard vehicle. As a result, "every appointment, errand, and outing has become unsafe for both of us," she explained. "I worry that one wrong move could lead to an injury for him or for me."

That's why they moved forward with a fundraising campaign for an accessible van with the trusted nonprofit Help Hope Live.

Miguel and Meagan's loving community has already raised over \$2,700 in Miguel's honor.

An accessible van means "less fear, less strain, and more freedom" with the flexibility to enjoy family gatherings and the community—plus access to the critical therapy appointments and doctor visits Miguel needs to stay healthy.

Insurance won't cover the cost despite the medical necessity.

Defense: Flynn's constitutional rights violated

The defense team in a murder case involving a beloved Tipp City mother, coach and educator is again asking a judge to issue a gag order and to block public access to court documents, saying the accused's constitutional rights have been violated.

Caleb Flynn, 39, was indicted on one count of aggravated murder, three counts of murder, two counts of felonious assault, three counts of tampering with evidence and two misdemeanor counts of intimidation of an attorney, victim or witness in a criminal case.

His wife, Ashley Flynn, 37, was shot and killed

early Feb. 16 at the couple's Cunningham Court home. The homicide initially was reported by Caleb Flynn as a home invasion and shooting, according to 911 records.

Caleb Flynn's bond was increased from \$2 million to \$3.5 million during his Thursday arraignment in Miami County Common Pleas Court.

The case has received heightened publicity on a national and even international level.

Flynn, a former worship pastor, is represented by Dayton attorney L. Patrick

Mulligan of Moermond & Mulligan.

"Mr. Flynn moves this court for an order prohibiting all parties, witnesses, law enforcement and attorneys from disseminating any police reports, video, audio recordings, lab reports, photos, written statements or any other evidence or discovery to the press or public until this case has been fully adjudicated," a motion filed recently states.

The document also alleges that the state violated Ohio statute and Flynn's constitutional rights because the state Public Records Act indicates that any portion of body-worn or dashboard camera recording may only be released if it will not be used in connection with a

probable or pending criminal proceeding.

"The dissemination of video discovery, police reports, and any other evidence to the public and the press greatly jeopardizes Mr. Flynn's Constitutional right to a fair trial. Evidence intended to be shown to an unbiased jury at trial has already been released to the public and shared online garnering thousands of views and comments," the motion states.

"Any further disclosure of evidence will substantially and materially prejudice the jury pool and any adjudicative proceedings." The prosecution has not yet responded to the motion filed Wednesday. However, it requested the court deny a

similar motion filed March 3 in Miami County Municipal Court, which no longer has jurisdiction over the case.

The response stated that open access to court records is a valued public policy in Ohio.

"In order to restrict public access to court files, there must be clear and convincing evidence of the need... The defendant has not set forth any assertions or evidence as to the basis for the court to restrict public access." Gag orders and restricted court access to documents in high-profile cases are common. They are often seen as a protection against unfair trials, but can also create an appearance of secrecy.

Ashley Flynn coached seventh grade girls volleyball at Tiptecanoe Middle School and worked as a substitute teacher for Tipp City Schools. She also worked as a teacher for LifeWise Academy in Tipp City, a nonprofit that provides weekly Bible-based lessons to public school students off campus. The Tiptecanoe High School graduate also formerly worked as a teacher for Tipp City Schools.

Caleb Flynn is a former worship pastor and "American Idol" contestant.

The couple were parents to two elementary-aged daughters.

Caleb Flynn is next due in court Monday for a pretrial hearing before Miami County Common Pleas Judge Jeanine Pratt.

Erosion closes Great Miami River trail at Crains Run Park

A section of the Great Miami River Recreation Trail in Franklin closed for several days beginning Tuesday so crews could repair erosion damage.

The roughly two-mile section runs south from Crains Run Park to Jackson Street in Franklin.

"We understand this is a heavily used section of the trail and that this closure is disruptive," said Sarah

Heppensteel Hall, manager of communications for the Miami Conservancy District. "However, addressing erosion quickly is critical to public safety, protecting the trail and surrounding infrastructure."

That section of trail can see between 50 and 75 people a day during good weather, according to the Conservancy District.

Heppensteel Hall said recent high water events over the last several weeks likely contributed to the

erosion, prompting the district to make emergency repairs.

Conservancy District crews will repair a section along the riverbank near a wooden fence. Signs will be posted above and below the closed section of the trail to give bikers and hikers time to turn around.

There is no official detour for the closed area.

The trail will be completely closed when trucks and other heavy equipment are moving on the trail.

Heppensteel Hall said several large dump trucks worth of materials will need to be brought onto the trail itself to make the repairs.

She said weather and other factors could impact the project timeframe, but said it will last "a minimum of a couple days."

Crains Run Nature Park is a 34-acre park featuring woodlands, hiking trails, a four-acre fishing pond and picnic areas with views of the Great Miami River.
