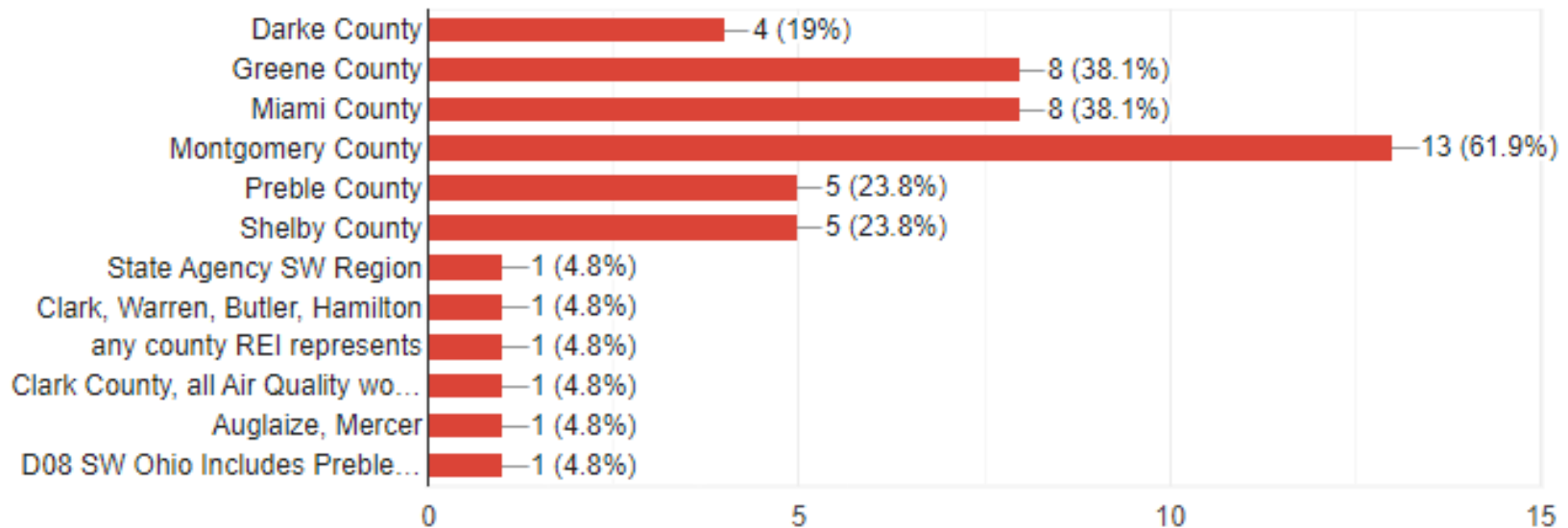

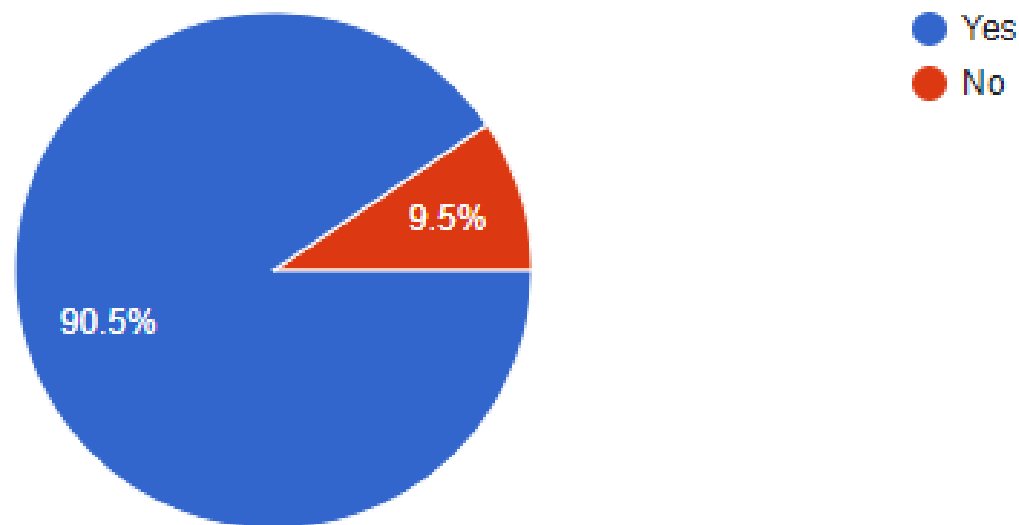


# FEMA Definition of Resilience

# Suggested Edits to FEMA Definition

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- Not just recover - thrive in the future
- Add: Together we stand strong.
- Ensuring all communities with the region - despite of inequitable vulnerabilities in low-income communities - are able to resist and adapt to the shocks and changes which come with these disasters.
- Additionally helping the Community coordinate response between agencies regardless of political or economic gain.
- FEMA definition is an action. Resilience is a noun. The capacity or ability to do the action.

# Background Information

The Miami Valley  
Region received  
disaster recovery funds  
as a result of the 2019  
tornadoes.



Individual Recovery  
work wrapped up in fall  
2021 with property  
recovery estimated at  
90%.



A grant fund is set up to assist local governments with public property recovery.





**RETREET is assisting with tree plantings for the next few years.**



As a part of long term community recovery, the Region committed to developing a Pre-Disaster Recovery Plan (PDRP).



MVRPC is developing  
the PDRP for a  
6-county area: Darke,  
Greene, Miami, Montg.,  
Preble, and Shelby.



PDRP will recommend actions to take before a disaster that will facilitate resource sharing, mutual aid, and cost recovery after a future disaster.



The participating counties and agencies already have plans and documents in place that will contribute to the PDRP.



PDRP will focus on the full scope of disaster recovery: Relief, Response, Long Term Recovery, and Resiliency.



The PDRP will make  
the **relief** and  
**response** stages  
stronger.



The PDRP will be structured around the 6 Recovery Support Functions:





- RSF 1: Community Planning and Capacity Building (CPCB)
- RSF 2: Economic
- RSF 3: Health and Social Services
- RSF 4: Housing
- RSF 5: Infrastructure Systems
- RSF 6: Natural and Cultural Resources
