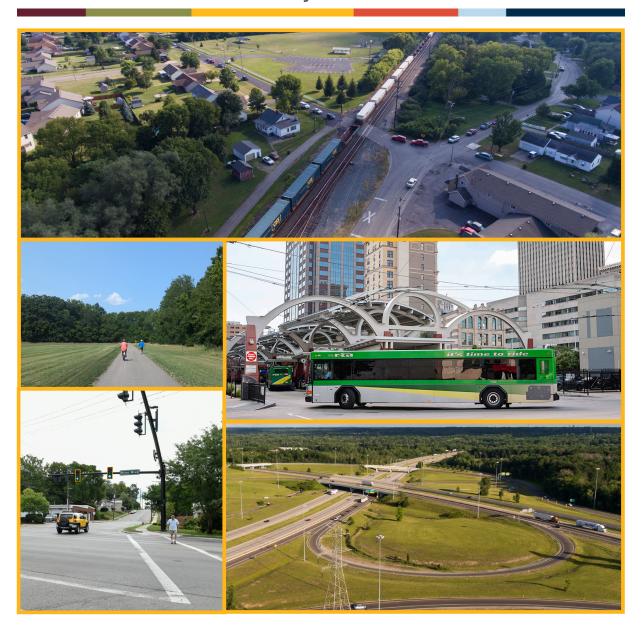

RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE SFY2026-SFY2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) by the Governor acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation in cooperation with locally elected officials for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties and the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC's Board of Directors serves as the policy and decision making body through which local governments guide the MPO's transportation planning process for the Dayton Metropolitan Area; and

WHEREAS, federal and state directives require that a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) be developed and updated by Metropolitan Planning Organizations in cooperation with state and local officials; regional and local transit operators; grant recipients under Section 5307, Section 5310 or other sections of Title 49, U.S.C.; and other affected transportation and regional planning and implementing agencies; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program developed by the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC), as the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Dayton Metropolitan Area, is consistent with the 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan and its policies; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program is fiscally constrained; and

WHEREAS, the SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program was developed consistent with MVPRC's Public Participation Policy and has been reviewed and accepted by the Technical Advisory Committee and has been coordinated with regional and local transit operators and with adjacent transportation planning agencies (OKI and CCS-TCC) as well as local community officials; and

WHEREAS, the conformity process completed for Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties in the Dayton/Springfield Air Quality Region meet the Clean Air Act and Transportation Conformity rule requirements for the 1997 ozone standard; and

WHEREAS, significant TIP projects in Franklin, Carlisle, Springboro and Franklin Township have been included in the regional emissions analysis for the Cincinnati Region and found to conform to the 2008 and 2015 8-hour ozone standards; and

WHEREAS, the MVRPC's SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program and 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan conformity determination is made consistent with the April 2012, U.S. EPA Transportation Conformity Regulations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT,

- (1) The MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission adopt the SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program.
- (2) The MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission hereby concur with the advancement to SFY2026 of all delayed projects initially scheduled in SFY2025.
- (3) MVRPC assures that the SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program and 2050 Long Range Transportation Plan contain no goals, directives, recommendations or projects which contradict any requirements or commitments of Ohio's State Implementation Plan.

RESOLUTION 25-13 ADOPTION OF SELF-CERTIFICATION OF THE METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING PROCESS

WHEREAS, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Dayton Urbanized Area (Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties and the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County) by the Governor of the State of Ohio, acting through the Ohio Department of Transportation, in cooperation with local elected officials for the Urbanized Area, and as evidenced in the Agreement of Cooperation, Number 38476 between ODOT and the MVRPC; and

WHEREAS, the federal regulations published as 23 CFR 450.336 requires MVRPC, as the MPO for the Dayton Urbanized area, to self-certify through its Board of Directors (MVRPC's policy board) in conjunction with the Transportation Improvement Program update, that the transportation planning process is addressing the major issues in the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with the following applicable requirements:

- (a) 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, and this subpart;
- (b) In non-attainment and maintenance areas, sections 174 and 176 (c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506 (c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
- (c) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
- (d) 49 U.S.C. 5332, prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, creed, national origin, sex, or age in employment or business opportunity;
- (e) Section 1101(b) of the FAST Act (Pub. L. 114-357) and 49 CFR part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in DOT funded projects;
- (f) 23 CFR part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on Federal and Federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- (g) The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. 12101 et seq.) and 49 CFR parts 27, 37, and 38;
- (h) The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 6101), prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving Federal financial assistance;
- (i) Section 324 of title 23 U.S.C. regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- (j) Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. 794) and 49 CFR part 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the MPO members of the Board of Directors of the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission certify that the Metropolitan Planning Organization's metropolitan transportation planning process complies with the metropolitan planning requirements as set forth above.

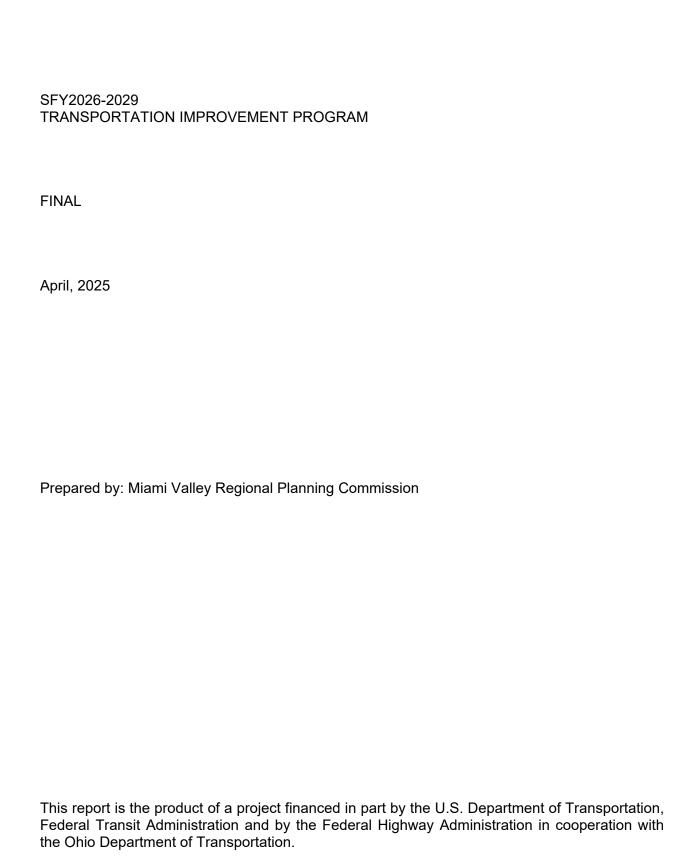

SECTION 1

SYNOPSIS

The Transportation Improvement Program, often referred to as the TIP, is a four-year implementation schedule for transportation projects within Greene, Miami, Montgomery, and northern Warren Counties. The locally developed State Fiscal Year 2026 through State Fiscal Year 2029 TIP shows planned projects for which one or more phases will begin within the next four years. It includes highway, bikeway and transit improvements within a reasonable estimate of available funds.

Included within the TIP document are federal and state financed transportation improvements as well as other regionally significant transportation projects that are also shown for coordination and air quality analysis purposes. This multi-modal program was developed by the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) in cooperation with local and state officials, other agencies and transit operators. It was reviewed and recommended by the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). The TIP development followed MVRPC's <u>Public Participation Policy</u> (available at www.mvrpc.org). Appropriate public notices, news releases or press releases stating the meeting time and location as well as announcing the availability of the TIP for public review were prepared and distributed (see public participation summary document). Following the public review, the TIP was then reviewed and approved by elected officials acting through the Metropolitan Planning Organization's transportation policy board - the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission's (MVRPC) Board of Directors.

Highway, bikeway and other projects are shown in Section 4 of the report. Basically, each of these projects must go through three stages of project development: 1) Preliminary Engineering (ENG); 2) Right-Of-Way Acquisition (ROW); and 3) Construction (CON). Each stage is funded separately and requires program approval from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) if funded with federal funds. Prior to approval, FHWA requires that each stage be included in the TIP. Once the specific project phase receives federal approval for federal funds that specific project phase is no longer identified in the TIP even though the actual work may remain incomplete.

For this reason, project implementation and progress in implementing the <u>2050 Long Range Transportation Plan</u> (LRTP), available at <u>www.mvrpc.org</u>, is monitored through the TIP process. Section 3 of the report summarizes past progress which has been made in implementing the LRTP, major projects from the previous TIP that were implemented and also any significant delays in the planned implementation of major projects.

The final SFY2026-SFY2029 TIP also includes information regarding the Region's air quality status and documentation of the TIP conformity analysis is included in Section 2 of the report. Transit and transportation demand management (TDM) projects listed in Sections 4 and 5 will also help to improve the air quality of the three plus-county region.

Transportation efficiency and demand reduction projects are contained in both the highway and transit programs. A discussion of these activities is included in Section 6. Recent airport trends as well as scheduled capital improvements during fiscal years 2026-2029 are also documented in Section 7.

SECTION 2

INTRODUCTION

ORGANIZATION FOUNDATION

The Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission is responsible for ensuring comprehensive and coordinated development of the regional transportation system serving the designated MPO area including Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties and the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County.

The transportation planning program is carried out under the direction of the members of MVRPC's Board of Directors that represent jurisdictions/organizations located within the MPO Boundary. The breakout is as follows: forty-four representatives (and forty-four votes) from jurisdictions located within Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties, four representative (and four votes) from the cities of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro, and Franklin Township in Warren County, six representatives from "Other Governmental/Non Governmental Members" (six votes), the three local transit authorities (three votes) and two ODOT representatives (two votes) for a total of 59 MPO members and votes.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the TIP is to ensure a closer relationship between the urban transportation planning process and the program of projects advanced for implementation with federal and state assistance and other regionally significant projects funded with other sources.

Because the TIP spans several modes of transportation, it is extremely important to properly review and coordinate the program development with other agencies, governmental units and transit operators for all federal, state and other regionally significant projects. The enclosed program for SFY2026-2029 was developed with input and assistance from various state and local officials. The resulting four-year Transportation Improvement Program is consistent with the region's needs and priorities.

REQUIREMENTS AND REGULATIONS

The MVRPC transportation programs comply with both the transportation conformity provisions resulting from the Clean Air Act and subsequent Amendments as well as the current Surface Transportation Reauthorization Bill, the "Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act" (IIJA), signed into a law by the President on November 15, 2021. This section provides a summary of applicable elements of these regulations and laws.

PLANNING BOUNDARIES

The planning regulations require the boundaries of the metropolitan planning area to include the existing urbanized area plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within the 20-year planning period. Additionally, boundaries may be extended to encompass the entire combined statistical area or to include the entire non-attainment or maintenance area for ozone, carbon monoxide, or particulate matter. The Clark County-Springfield Transportation Coordinating Committee (CCS-TCC) serves Clark County and MVRPC serves Greene, Miami, Montgomery and northern Warren Counties. MVRPC officially expanded its transportation planning boundary to include the jurisdictions of Franklin, Carlisle (July 2003), Springboro (May

2006) and Franklin Township (July 2017) in Warren County, however for transportation conformity purposes the areas within Warren County are considered part of the Cincinnati Air Quality Region. To coordinate the activities required by the metropolitan planning process, including conformity, MVRPC maintains planning agreements with both CCS-TCC and OKI - the adjacent MPOs.

FINANCIAL CAPACITY

The planning regulations require a financial capacity determination, which realistically assesses available implementation funds for improvements.

Consistent with the 3-C planning process (continuing, cooperative and comprehensive), data was provided by all of the major planning partners (local project sponsors, ODOT and the transit providers). ODOT inflation factors are applied to all highway/bikeway projects and the transit providers apply inflation factors to all transit projects shown in the TIP. Thus the amounts shown from Federal, State and Local funding sources are shown in year-of-expenditure dollars.

The STIP (State Transportation Improvement Program)/TIP must be fiscally constrained, as such, MVRPC's and ODOT's highway fiscal analyses are included in Tables 4.7 and 4.8. For the Highway/Bikeway Program, the fiscal constraint will take ODOT's encumbrance based annual allocation into account. Table 4.7 - MVRPC'S Funding Plan shows a fiscal analysis for MVRPC's controlled funding sources. Table 4.8 summarizes all Federal, State and Local Match funds scheduled to be expended during SFY2026-2029. The ODOT STIP addresses the fiscal constraint for projects included in the TIP, financed with ODOT controlled funding sources. Fiscal analysis for transit is shown in the fiscally constrained transit tables (See Section 5) for each individual project sponsor. Consistent with federal regulations for Transportation Management Areas (TMA's), MVRPC limits projects shown in the first two years of the TIP to those with funds available or committed.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Public participation is a key component in the IIJA with increased emphasis on visualization techniques, electronic availability of information, and expanded participation lists. One of the main purposes of the ODOT Project Development Process (PDP) is to ensure that the social, economic, and environmental effects of projects are identified early in the planning process in order to provide some of the information required for selecting the most beneficial alternative. Central to the success of the PDP is the early participation of private citizens, public officials, and interested agencies that represent a wide range of disciplines and areas of expertise. Specific project proposals are publicized through the early coordination and Intergovernmental Review process. Affected segments of the community are identified and tentative problems and/or issues concerning the projects are defined. These problems and issues are continuously refined as project development progresses. The PDP involvement is solicited through public meetings held on proposed projects, meetings with affected property owners, and circulating and/or advertising the availability of the draft environmental document. Formal public hearings may also be held in accordance with applicable local, state, and federal laws. Transit projects follow a similar public participation process.

In addition to the public participation conducted on individual projects, the Board of Directors has adopted the *Public Participation Policy*. This document describes MVRPC's proactive and ongoing public participation procedures for all major transportation planning activities, including the TIP.

The TIP public input process includes one public input meeting during the TIP development process described in MVRPC's <u>Public Participation Policy</u>. The public meeting for the TIP was held on March 27, 2025. All comments received were replied to if requested and the comments and replies were forwarded to MVRPC's TAC and Board for their consideration.

To increase the participation of citizens and organizations in the transportation planning process, MVRPC has developed and will maintain a mailing list notifying various groups and individuals of scheduled public participation meetings approximately three weeks before the meeting date. The goal of this mailing is to include groups not directly involved through the current structure of MVRPC's policy board. The list includes interested private citizens, transportation organizations/agencies, economic development interests, private transportation providers, freight representatives, environmental protection, cultural-historic resources, media outlets, and other pertinent groups identified by the IIJA legislation. In addition to groups identified by IIJA, MVRPC will add any interested party requesting placement on the mailing list.

The MVRPC TIP is part of ODOT's State Transportation Improvement Program (STIP) and as such will also made available as part of the state public participation process. STIP public participation meetings will be conducted for projects located in the MVRPC planning area. Comments received through this process will be documented in the STIP.

It is MVRPC's goal to make public participation accessible to all residents in the region irrespective of race, color, sex, age, national origin, disability, or language barriers. To that end the following efforts are incorporated into the public participation process:

- Expanding mailing list to include vulnerable populations such as low income, racial and ethnic minorities, older adults, and individuals with disabilities.
- Adapting advertising for ease of understanding including special articles and flyers.
- Submitting press releases to all local newspapers, television and radio stations approximately 65 media outlets.
- Advertising at GDRTA Hubs via English and Spanish posters and providing posters to Greene CATS Public Transit, Miami County Transit, and all public libraries.
- Printing a public notice in Dayton Daily News, social media advertisement on La Mega Nota (a Spanish media company)'s social following on Facebook in Spanish, Advertisement in Dayton Weekly News, a predominately urban-based target audience.
- Offering an English-to-Spanish translator on MVRPC's website.
- Posting public meeting announcement on social networking sites Facebook, Instagram, X and LinkedIn including paid boosted posts through Meta on Facebook and Instagram.
- Both English and Spanish posters are also distributed to the Latino Connection, an East Dayton neighborhood-based outreach group which assists Hispanics in a variety of capacities.
- Posting the information being presented at the meeting, on the MVRPC website along with an online comment card and making this same information available for review at the MVRPC offices in downtown Dayton.

TIP ADA COMPLIANCE

Ohio MPOs actively incorporate the transportation provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 into their urban transportation planning programs. The purpose of ADA is to ensure that pedestrians with disabilities have opportunity to use the transportation system in an accessible and safe manner. An integral component of the ADA planning process is for local government, transportation infrastructure owners, to prepare and implement ADA Transition Plans that inventory accessibility conditions and define strategies and schedules for implementing fully accessible pedestrian networks.

MVRPC is incorporating ADA Transition Planning into regional transportation planning programs, as follows:

- Surveying member local governments to establish and determine whether they have active ADA Transition Plans.
- Reviewing local government transportation improvement project funding requests for consistency with ADA accessibility standards.
- Coordinating discussions between ODOT District staff and MVRPC Technical Advisory Committee members regarding ADA Transition Plans and educational opportunities.

COMMUNITY IMPACT ASSESSMENT

Title VI of the 1964 Civil Rights Act states that no person shall, on the grounds of race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age, or income status, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any programs or activity receiving Federal financial assistance.

As a recipient of Federal transportation funds, MVRPC provides assurance of compliance (https://www.mvrpc.org/sites/default/files/assurance_of_compliance.pdf) with U.S. Department of Transportation requirements in regards to Title VI and civil rights. MVRPC's Title VI program is described in a document entitled *Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission Title VI Program Procedures Description*

(https://www.mvrpc.org/sites/default/files/final mvrpc title vi program plan and procedures description.pdf), which includes instructions on how to file a complaint and as well as a complaint form. As recipients of Federal funds, MVRPC and their contractors, subcontractors, material suppliers, vendors, and consultants must:

- Ensure nondiscrimination in all of their programs and activities, whether those programs and activities are Federally funded, or not. The factors prohibited from consideration as a basis for discriminatory action or inaction include race, color, national origin, sex, age and disability.
- Provide Equal Employment Opportunity by not discriminating in employment based on race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, or disability.

MVRPC analyzed the distribution of TIP projects with respect to vulnerable populations deemed of interest to the transportation planning process using data summarized at the Traffic Analysis Zone (TAZ) level. All SFY 2026-2029 TIP projects, with the exception of area-wide programs and projects, or projects with uncommitted funding in the construction phase, were overlaid on top of the region's six vulnerable population maps for analysis. TAZs with an above or equal to county average population threshold for each vulnerable population were identified as focus

areas. The analysis was conducted to assure that the focus areas are receiving a proportionate share of TIP project funds relative to the region's general population. Table 2.1 displays the allotment of total TIP project costs and project distribution throughout the Region.

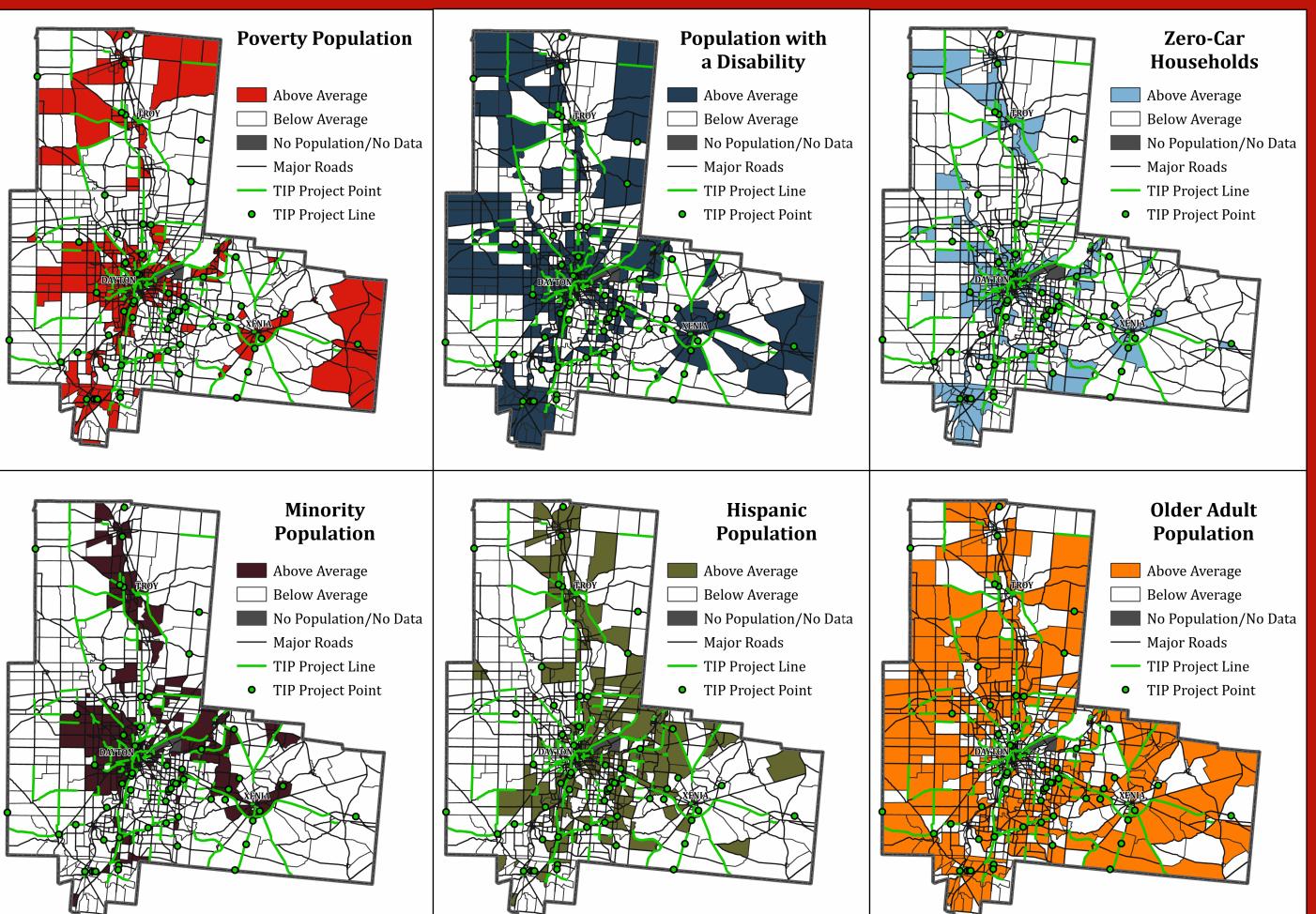

Between SFY 2026-2029, 209 TIP projects will be constructed. Areas with above average poverty rates will receive the fewest projects and least cost allocation, while areas with an above average population of persons at or over the age of 65 will receive the greatest number of projects and highest cost allocation. Areas with above average poverty, fewer in number and smaller in size, are concentrated in the Region's urban centers, thus having the least geographic coverage and smallest proportion of the Regional population residing within them. Areas with above average populations of persons at or over the age of 65 are more evenly distributed throughout the region, consequently achieving a larger geographic coverage, a larger share of the Region's population distribution, and a larger share of TIP projects. The areas for each vulnerable population will benefit from greater proportions of total projects and total cost allocation than the proportions of the Region's population residing within them. In summary, there is no disparate impact on vulnerable populations. Maps displaying the distribution of projects over each vulnerable population are included in Map 2.1.

TRANSPORTATION PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) continues to place emphasis on the performance management approach first specified in the Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act (MAP-21). It requires state DOTs, transit agencies, and MPOs to establish performance and outcome-based programs in several national priority areas, which are:

Freight Reduced Environmental Infrastructure Congestion System Movement & Safety Project Condition Reduction Reliability Economic Sustainability **Delivery Delays** Vitality

While the various rules have different deadlines, generally, after a state DOT or transit agency adopt targets for a particular rule, MPOs have 180 days from the date targets are established to adopt their own targets or support the states' or transit agencies'. To date, MVRPC has decided to support the ODOT's targets for all applicable measures and has adopted the Region's transit agencies' targets.

To track progress related to performance management, MVRPC has created a <u>Performance Management Webpage</u>. This page provides an overview presentation of the performance management approach and lists milestones and adoption documentation related to the various performance rules. To date, MVRPC has adopted/supported targets related to transit asset management and safety as well as highway safety, pavement and bridge conditions, system reliability, CMAQ emissions, Peak Hour Emission Delay, and Non-Single Occupancy Vehicle Travel.

The System Performance Report (<u>Chapter 8 of the LRTP</u>) provides an in-depth look at the performance management approach and an overview of each highway and transit performance measure including baseline conditions and future targets.

Table 2.2 provides a summary of the anticipated effect the TIP programs and projects have in helping achieve the various rules' targets.

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF EXISTING TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

The TIP is required to demonstrate that existing transportation facilities are being adequately operated and maintained by showing the operation and maintenance funds. Section 3 Accomplishments includes a discussion on how the region's existing transportation system is being adequately operated and maintained. We estimate that the region overall is spending 90.15% of the total local roadway expenditures on system preservation type projects. This is consistent with the previous TIP analysis that estimated approximately 86.56% of total local roadway expenditures were for system preservation type projects. System preservation projects are essential to the long-term viability of the region's transportation system.

AIR QUALITY

Ozone Standard

In April 2004, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) issued final designations regarding the 1997 8-hour ozone standard. The 1997 8-hour standard is violated when the 3-year average of the annual fourth highest daily maximum 8-hour ozone average concentration exceeds 0.08 ppm (parts per million). All four counties (Clark, Greene, Miami, and Montgomery) in the Dayton/Springfield Region (D/S Region) and Warren County in the Cincinnati Region were designated as basic non-attainment for ozone. The D/S Region was designated to attainment/maintenance for 1997 ozone in August 2007 and the Cincinnati Region was designated to attainment/maintenance for 1997 ozone in May 2010. The Cincinnati Region is also designated as maintenance for the 2008/2015 ozone standards.

On March 6, 2015, U.S. EPA published the final rule for the Implementation of the 2008 NAAQS for Ozone: State Implementation Plan Requirements, 80 FR 12264, effective April 6, 2015. The final rule revoked the 1997 ozone standard for all purposes including transportation conformity but on February 16, 2018, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit on the South Coast II Court Case held that transportation conformity determinations must continue to be made in those areas ("orphan areas"). As an ozone orphan area and consistent with U.S. EPA's November 29, 2018 guidance and interagency consultation, MVRPC will advance a qualitative Long Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) and new SFY2026–2029 TIP transportation conformity determination as documented in Table 2.3.

Fine Particulate Standard

In December 2004, the U.S. EPA issued air quality designations regarding the 1997 fine particulate (or PM 2.5) standard. The Clark, Greene, Montgomery, and Warren Counties were designated non-attainment for the annual PM 2.5 standard. The annual standard is exceeded if the 3-year average of annual mean PM2.5 concentrations is greater than 15 micrograms per cubic meter. The D/S Region was re-designated to attainment/maintenance for PM 2.5 on September 26, 2013 and the Cincinnati Region was designated to attainment/maintenance for PM 2.5 in 2011. In August 24, 2016, U.S. EPA published the final rule for the Implementation of the Fine Particulate Matter National Ambient Air Quality Standards: State Implementation Plan Requirements, 81 FR 58010, effective October 24, 2016. The final rule revokes the 1997 PM 2.5 standard for all purposes including transportation conformity.

With the revocation of the PM 2.5 standard, areas that have already been re-designated to attainment no longer have to demonstrate conformity.

STATUS OF MAJOR PROJECTS IN SFY2024-2027 TIP

Table 3.4 in Section 3 includes SFY2024-2027 projects that experienced significant delays. The table shows the anticipated construction year and reason for delay. Most of the projects were delayed due to slow project development and a decrease of available funding.

ANNUAL LISTING OF PROJECTS

Table 3.6 in Section 3 includes a listing of projects for which federal funds are anticipated to be obligated during SFY2025.

CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS (CMP)

The planning regulations require urban areas with a population over 200,000 to address congestion management through a process that provides for safe, effective, integrated management of the multimodal transportation system. A Congestion Management Process summary report is published by MVRPC approximately every 4 years, providing an overview of the multimodal system performance and regional congestion management strategies. The results and recommendations of the latest analysis were incorporated into the 2021 update of the Long Range Transportation Plan.

TIP PRIORITIZATION PROCESS

MVRPC's *Policies and Procedures for Considering Major New Capacity Projects (TRAC Projects)* were last published in April, 2024. In September of 2024, the Board of Directors adopted updates to the *MVRPC Suballocated Funding Policy*. Both policies are continually updated to address IIJA issues as well as changes in Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) regulations. The underlying data behind the Project Evaluation System (safety, congestion, etc.) is also updated periodically.

MVRPC Policies and Procedures for Suballocated Funding and Major New Capacity programs are available at www.mvrpc.org. These policies and procedures state that all projects must be consistent with one or more of the 10 factors required by the Federal legislation prior to being evaluated for inclusion into the TIP. Some smaller projects, such as system preservation projects, may not be specifically listed in the LRTP but they are considered consistent with the LRTP's goals and objectives. All projects listed in the TIP are consistent with the LRTP.

MVRPC CONTROLLED FUNDING SOURCES

MVRPC originally developed the <u>Project Evaluation System</u> (PES) for the 2004 LRTP in order to advance transportation projects that are consistent with regional transportation priorities. The PES was based on the common themes and transportation values identified by the 2003 visioning process *TransAction 2030*. Since then, PES has been used to prioritize projects seeking MVRPC controlled STP/CMAQ/TA & CR funds, TRAC funds and Federal Earmarks. In 2019, MVRPC staff worked with a PES Update Committee, comprising 15 TAC or Board members representing MPO member agencies and communities, to undertake a major review of the PES. Following an analysis of the projects funded over the previous decade, the motivation for the 2019 update was to better align the criteria with the type of projects that are currently being funded, and to incorporate equity criteria and a performance management approach for project scoring and selection.

The PES is available on the MVRPC website (www.mvrpc.org) along with all relevant information and the MVRPC staff works with participants to ensure a full understanding of the process, including hosting a seminar for project sponsors. Project Evaluation Forms are unique to the mode of the project (highway, bikeway/pedestrian, transit).

The PES is made up of two different project ranking categories, first being the Basic Project Evaluation System (PES) score and the second being the Project Readiness/Other score.

The first category, the *Basic PES* score, measures 20 indicators from categories including Regional Context/Cooperation, Transportation Choices, Transportation System Management, Land Use, Economic Development and Environment. A maximum total of 70 points is possible under the Basic PES scoring system.

The second category, *Project Readiness/Other*, is made up of ranking criteria that are designed to measure project maturity and fairly and equally evaluate all traditional and non-traditional projects. A maximum total of 30 points is possible under the project readiness/other score.

The final project score is a combination of the Basic PES score (maximum total of 70 points) and the Project Readiness/Other score (maximum total of 30 points) for a maximum combined score of 100 points.

Once all Project Evaluation Forms are received, MVRPC staff confirms that potential capacity projects are consistent with the 2050 LRTP and the most recent Transportation Conformity Determination and then reviews them for consistency, accuracy, and completeness of data for each individual project. A cross-examination of all projects is also conducted to ensure that the evaluation remains equitable.

ODOT CONTROLLED FUNDING SOURCES

ODOT has a standard project selection process for each type of program that they administer. Information about the various programs and ODOT's project selection processes can be found at www.dot.state.oh.us. Once ODOT has selected a project within the MVRPC region for funding, the project is first reviewed for consistency with the LRTP and then presented to MVRPC's TAC and Board for final approval and inclusion in the TIP.

CONSISTENCY WITH THE LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN AND CONFORMANCE WITH STATE IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

MPO's are required to review and approve all projects recorded in the TIP (both MPO funded and ODOT funded) and demonstrate the project's consistency with the LRTP.

MVRPC's transportation goals and objectives were redefined in 2003 as a result of a community-based visioning process known as TransAction 2030. The objective was to identify the collective transportation values of the communities in the Region and develop a shared transportation vision, along with measurable criteria that could be applied to potential projects to gauge their consistency with the vision. TransAction 2030 involved soliciting input from stakeholders in the Region by applying various tools and methods. Based on this input, transportation goals were identified and incorporated into the MVRPC Strategic Plan. In May of 2007, MVRPC revised the Plan's goals and objectives to incorporate "security" into its transportation system management objective as per SAFETEA-LU requirements.

The Board of Directors reaffirmed the goals and objectives for use in the 2021 LRTP update in October 2020.

Regional Stewardship

 Develop Regional Priorities — Continue to address regional transportation needs that further the shared social, economic, transportation and environmental goals of the Region.

Vibrant Communities

- Transportation Choices Encourage a stronger multi-modal network in the Region to ensure that people and goods reach their destination safely, efficiently, and conveniently.
- Transportation System Management Continue to maintain and upgrade the regional transportation system by providing safety, security, aesthetic, and capacity improvements as needed.
- Transportation and Land Use Incorporate regional land use strategies into the transportation policy and the investment decision making process.

Vigorous Economy

 Transportation — Continue to address regional transportation needs to enhance economic development in order to attract and retain businesses in the Region while improving the quality of life of its residents.

Sustainable Solutions

• Clean Air — Encourage the pursuit of alternative fuels to reduce emissions and our reliance on petroleum-based products.

In order to document that all projects in the TIP have been reviewed and approved for their consistency with the LRTP, every project shown in Tables 4.1-4.6 has been assigned a LRTP Goal number based on Table 2.6 below:

<u>CERTIFICATION OF THE METROPOLITAN PLANNING PROCESS</u>

The final planning regulations require the Secretary of Transportation to certify the metropolitan planning process for TMA's at least every 4 years. A joint FHWA/FTA certification review was conducted on September 8, 2021. Based upon their findings, FHWA/FTA jointly certified the MVRPC transportation planning process for the Dayton urban planning area on November 10, 2021.

In addition, the regulations also require the State and MPO's to biennially certify to the FHWA and FTA that the planning process is addressing the major issues facing the area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable federal requirements. A separate resolution self-certifying conformance with applicable federal requirements will be submitted with the final TIP.

SECTION 3

ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Biennially, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission prepares and updates the TIP in cooperation with state and local officials, local and regional transit operators and other affected transportation and regional planning and implementing agencies. As a result of this cooperative effort, the TIP acts as the primary mechanism for implementation of the LRTP, which was adopted by the MVRPC Board of Directors on May 6, 2021. The area's progress in implementing the highway and transit elements of the LRTP is summarized in this section along with other highway improvements and State Fiscal Year (SFY) 2023-2024 highway expenditures.

2050 LONG RANGE TRANSPORTATION PLAN PROJECT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The LRTP serves as a guide indicating when various projects, that are required for optimal functionality of the regional transportation network, could be implemented given realistic funding availability. The implementation of the LRTP is a cooperative and continuous process that involves MVRPC's Board of Directors, local jurisdictions that are directly involved in project implementation, the Ohio and U.S. Departments of Transportation, and citizens of the region.

HIGHWAY ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The MVRPC Board of Directors adopted the <u>2050 Long Range Transportation Plan</u> in May of 2021. As Long Range Transportation Plan highway projects receive funding, they are entered into MVRPC's project monitoring database (Web-TELUS) where project details can be found by entering the Long Range Transportation Plan project number. As projects are completed, they would be shown on the required Annual Listing of Obligated Projects found on the MVRPC website (<u>www.mvrpc.org</u>).

Table 3.1A and 3.1B list 186 highway projects sold, completed, or under construction in CY2023 and Table 3.2A and 3.2B lists 154 highway projects sold, completed, or under construction in CY2024.

TRANSIT ACCOMPLISHMENTS

The MVRPC Board of Directors adopted the <u>2050 Long Range Transportation Plan</u> in May of 2021. As Long Range Transportation Plan transit projects receive funding, they are entered into MVRPC's project monitoring database (Web-TELUS) where project details can be found by entering the Long Range Transportation Plan project number. As projects are completed, they would be shown on the required Annual Listing of Obligated Projects found on the MVRPC website (www.mvrpc.org).

REVIEW OF SFY2023-2024 HIGHWAY EXPENDITURES

Since the Board's adoption of the SFY2024-2027 TIP, several revisions have been made with amendments or deletions initiated by local jurisdictions, MVRPC or ODOT.

Table 3.3A, *SFY2023 Highway Expenditures* and Table 3.3B, *SFY2024 Highway Expenditures*, show the amount of expenditures which occurred in 2023 and 2024 within all the funding categories as shown in the Explanation of Abbreviations table preceding Table 4.1.

In 2023 the total amount expended on highway projects in the three-county area totaled \$428,164,283. Federal expenditures accounted for \$300,586,695 (70.20%) of the total expenditures in the region. State funds accounted for \$26,937,039 (6.29%) of the total funds expended. Approximately \$50,207,959 (11.73%) in local funds was also spent in combination with State and Federal funds. An estimated additional \$50,432,590 (11.78%) was also spent by local governments on roadway improvements.

The 2024 total amount expended on highway projects in the MVRPC MPO area totaled \$257,965,210. Federal expenditures accounted for \$151,125,189 (58.58%) of the total expenditures in the region. State funds accounted for \$15,623,234 (6.06%) of the total funds expended. Approximately \$52,233,422 (20.25%) in local funds was also spent in combination with State and Federal funds. An estimated additional \$38,983,365 (15.11%) was also spent by local governments on roadway improvements.

SFY2024-2027 TIP STATUS

In order to improve the use of the TIP as an effective management tool, the FTA and FHWA TIP guidelines require the TIP to note those projects whose implementation was delayed. In compliance with those guidelines, Table 3.4 includes SFY2024-2027 projects that experienced significant delays, or were upgraded from plan status to project status. It also shows the anticipated construction year, and reason for delay or change in status.

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF EXISTING TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

The TIP is required to demonstrate that, the existing transportation facilities are being adequately operated and maintained, by calculating the percent of total TIP expenditures for operation and maintenance projects. Annually MVRPC surveys all jurisdictions within the MPO boundary in order to compile a database of highway projects completed during the previous calendar year (See Table 3.1A and 3.2A). Expenditures for these projects are then summarized in Table 3.3A and 3.3B. From this information, MVRPC is able to generally track the type of projects and the amount of expenditures being used within the region. As part of our annual local jurisdiction project survey, we request each jurisdiction to estimate the amount of funds they spent on operation and maintenance versus capacity improvements, in the previous calendar year. Table 3.5 summarizes the results of our survey. The analysis for 2023 showed that 89.35% of total local roadway expenditures were for system preservation type projects. The analysis for 2024 showed that 91.29% of total local roadway expenditures were for system preservation type projects. As reflected above, the total local roadway expenditures for system preservation type projects were similar from 2023 to 2024. System preservation projects are essential to the long-term viability of the region's transportation system.

SECTION 4

THE HIGHWAY, BIKEWAY AND OTHER IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Contained within the SFY2026-2029 TIP are transportation improvements resulting from the continuing, comprehensive and coordinated transportation planning program. Shown in this section are highway, bikeway and other projects with anticipated federal, state or local fund usage for the SFY2026-2029 time period.

Since the TIP is a realistic, staged four-year capital improvement program, it was developed with recognition of a reasonable estimate of available federal/state/local funds and priority needs. The program for the MVRPC MPO area lists projects for which some phase of work utilizing federal, state or local funds will be initiated.

For the highway, bikeway and other projects, all Federal funding sources were analyzed and considered in developing the program. ODOT, through periodic reviews of the current TIP, provides project updates/amendments covering all State/Federal funding sources for highways. Covered in the State's program are improvements to be financed with Federal-Aid Interstate Maintenance, National Highway System, Surface Transportation Program, Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation, Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality and other highway funding sources.

PLAN COORDINATION

Projects advanced for implementation within the TIP were derived by these methods:

- 1. The need was established in the LRTP; or
- 2. The project resulted from inputs received from various agencies in the area and was consistent with the LRTP.

Each highway, bikeway or other transportation improvement is specifically identified within the TIP. Project air quality status, limits, cost, letting type, funding source, phase of work, schedule and project sponsor are shown in TIP Tables 4.1, 4.2, 4.3, 4.4 and 4.5. The same information for projects utilizing statewide line items in MVRPC's region is shown in Table 4.6. This table is provided for information only. Specific projects in this table are not included in the TIP and are not subject to TIP Amendments.

Bikeway and pedestrian projects are included in the TIP as part of proposed highway projects or as separately funded projects. Bikeway or pedestrian projects being proposed as separate projects are identified in the TIP tables. In addition, many local communities are implementing bikeways and pedestrian projects with local financing.

The resulting TIP list represents a realistic look at all aspects of transportation planning and is based on the best available information.

<u>FEDERAL-AID SFY2026-2029 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM</u> (HIGHWAYS, BIKEWAYS AND OTHER)

A realistic short-range program showing the region's priority projects for highways, bikeways and other projects has been developed in cooperation with all local governments, various agencies and transit operators, and has been endorsed by the area's elected officials acting

through MVRPC's Board of Directors. Included within the TIP is a list of improvements for which some activity will be initiated during SFY2026-2029.

The MVRPC and ODOT recommended SFY2026-2029 Transportation Improvement Program for Highway, Bikeway and Other projects is shown in Tables 4.1 (Greene County), 4.2 (Miami County), 4.3 (Montgomery County), 4.4 (Warren County jurisdictions) and 4.5 (Areawide/Statewide line items and MVRPC Planning Studies).

Table 4.6 provides the current list and descriptions of projects utilizing statewide line items in MVRPC's region for SFY2026-2029. **This table is provided for information only. Specific projects in this table are not included in the TIP and are not subject to TIP Amendments.** Projects not considered to be of appropriate scale for individual identification in a given program year may be added to the STIP by statewide line item. When utilizing a statewide line item, the following criteria are followed:

- Projects considered for statewide line item usage must meet the following criteria:
 - o Not regionally significant (23CFR 450.216(h), 40 CFR 93.101)
 - Air Quality status of exempt
 - o Environmental document type of CE 2 or below
 - o Non-capacity adding
 - o Consistent with ODOT and MPO transportation plans
- In addition, MVRPC requires that projects utilizing statewide line items:
 - Do not have a total project cost of over \$3,000,000
 - o Do not utilize MVRPC funding sources
 - Lead agency must not be a Local Project Sponsor (this requirement may be waived based on concurrence from MVRPC and the project sponsor)
 - Must not be a potentially controversial project

The format of Tables 4.1 through 4.6 follows ODOT's guidelines. A terminology explanation chart of key abbreviations used in tables 4.1-4.8 precedes Table 4.1. A separate map showing the project locations appears after each table.

ODOT has a project management system called ELLIS that tracks highway project development milestones and helps establish dates when projects will require federal funding authorizations through the STIP/TIP. Projects are entered into and tracked through ELLIS by establishing a Project Identification (PID) number. ODOT tracks programmed projects to ensure that project development milestones and completion dates are met and that the STIP/TIP allocates federal funding as needed for preliminary engineering (ENG), right of way acquisition (ROW) and construction (CON) activities, or operating costs. For this reason, the TIP must list by year and individual line item, all federal and state funded highway, transit, pedestrian and bicycle projects for which any of the above funding events are to be initiated within the term of the TIP.

ADVANCE CONSTRUCTION

ODOT utilizes advance construction for the management of fund appropriations and obligation limitation provided by FHWA. Advance construction allows the department to gain federal authorization to begin federally eligible activities without obligating funding. At the time of authorization, FHWA is confirming that ODOT has followed all requirements necessary to execute a federal agreement. By placing the funds into advance construction, FHWA is not guaranteeing funding for the project but is indicating that the activities would be eligible.

ODOT places most of its projects in advance construction at the time of authorization. There are some exceptions based on the expiration of funds and legislative requirements. The advance construction is placed into two groups. The first group is identified as short term. This group is used for projects in which the funding will be converted as project expenditures take place and are exhausted by the completion of the federally eligible activities. By utilizing advance construction, ODOT can convert its appropriations and obligation limitation for costs that are currently being incurred and maintain a balance throughout the federal fiscal year. The second group is identified as long term. This group is used primarily for GARVEE bonds and MPO or CEAO SIB (State Infrastructure Bank) loans that are utilized and managed by ODOT. The GARVEE bonds are retired utilizing future federal funding received through the active and future highway authorization bills. Prior to the bond sale, the entire amount of the bond is put into advance construction on the projects being funded with its proceeds. These amounts are then converted over an 8 to 12 year period to retire the bonds. These payments are made on either a level principal or level interest payment schedule depending on the bond structure. The SIB loans are loans taken out by a local sponsor, which are being paid off utilizing federal MPO or CEAO funding. These loans have a typical repayment term of 10 years and are paid down using a level principal amortization schedule. These loans typically have two annual payments due. At the designated payment dates, advance construction is converted in the amount of the federal participating principal and interest due.

The short term advance construction rises and falls throughout the federal fiscal year based on ODOT's needs for each program utilizing federal funds. At the beginning of each federal fiscal year (October 1), the balance is typically at its lowest of the year. Agreements are consistently authorized throughout the federal fiscal year with the advance construction balance typically peaking in June. ODOT also consistently converts advance construction to obligated funds throughout the federal fiscal year for costs as they are incurred. In June the amount being converted begins exceeding the amount of new advance construction. This is based on the peak of construction season and the requirement to use obligation limitation prior to the close of the federal fiscal year. The long term advance construction balance is based upon the sales of bonds or the establishment of a new SIB loan. The bonds are typically sold every 12 to 18 months based on ODOT's needs. The long term advance construction peaks in bond sale year and is reduced as the bond retirement payments are made.

 - o Do not utilize MVRPC funding sources
 - Lead agency must not be a Local Project Sponsor (this requirement may be waived based on concurrence from MVRPC and the project sponsor)
 - Must not be a potentially controversial project

FISCAL CONSTRAINT

The STIP/TIP must be fiscally constrained. As such, MVRPC's and ODOT's highway fiscal analyses are included in Tables 4.7 and 4.8. For the Highway/Bikeway Program, the fiscal constraint will take ODOT's encumbrance based annual allocation into account. Table 4.7 - MVRPC'S Funding Plan shows a fiscal analysis for MVRPC's controlled funding sources. Table 4.8 summarizes all Federal, State and Local Match funds scheduled to be expended during SFY2026-2029. The ODOT STIP addresses the fiscal constraint for projects included in the TIP, financed with ODOT controlled funding sources. Consistent with federal regulations for TMA's, MVRPC limits projects shown in the first two years of the TIP to those with funds available or committed.

OVER PROGRAMMING

This section establishes a reasonable assumption for the funds that become available throughout implementation of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) and Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). This assumption is not based on increased revenue, rather the increased availability of existing revenues due to projects coming in under the programmed amounts at the time of bid, projects being delayed, and/or projects being cancelled due to shifting local and regional priorities over the life of the 4-year TIP. A review of the previous five years (2020-2024) by the Office of Statewide Planning and Research found that the MPO and Large City program encumbered a range of -5% to -23% of the original State Fiscal Year programmed total, with an average of -14.3% over the five-year analysis period.

In accordance with this analysis, MPOs and Large Cities are being encouraged to increase the annual programming of MPO and Large City Program project funding commitments up to 15% over the documented available budget through the current four-year S/TIP period. Due to the time it takes to get transportation projects ready, over programming within a reasonable threshold will aid in the timely spending of existing available revenues. The Office of Statewide Planning and Research will update the five-year trends analysis with the development of each S/TIP cycle.

Based on the data provided in Table 4.7, MVRPC is currently overprogrammed by 1.74% which is within the acceptable maximum limit of 15% stated above. MVRPC will continue to manage the capital program in an annual basis by utilizing inter-MPO loans and SAC budget transfers to ensure that projects have the available financial resources to be implemented.

GREATER DAYTON REGIONAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY (GDRTA) PROJECTS:

OVERVIEW OF GDRTA'S FINANCIAL PICTURE:

The RTA cash flow (see table) describes the RTA's projected financial picture for the 2025-2029 time frame, which covers the SFY 2026-2029 TIP.

The following paragraphs provide a summary of the assumptions in the cash flow analysis and TIP tables:

Overall Financial Picture:

- The cash flow analysis reflects current and future FTA allocations as anticipated when the cash flow document was prepared
- The cash flow analysis reflects when grant revenues are actually spent (not the FY in which they are allocated)
- CY2025 begins with a cash balance of \$116.6 million and CY2029 ends with a cash balance of \$26.9 million; net of debt, the balance at the end of CY2029 is \$26.9 million

The total CY2025-CY2029 five-year expenditures (operating + capital) are \$669.8 million

Operating Expenses:

- Total operating expenses (not including debt service) over the CY 2025-CY 2029 timeframe are \$439 million
- Operating expenses increased by 9.1% (from \$84.2 million in CY 2025) over the CY 2025-CY 2029 five-year period

Operating Revenues:

- Passenger revenues are assumed to increase by 5% each year over the five-year period of CY2025 to CY2029
- Sales tax revenues are assumed to increase by 10.4% (from \$49.9 million in CY 2025) over the five-year period
- Annual State special fare assistance is assumed to be \$0 per year

Capital Expenditures:

Capital improvements total \$230.3 million over the CY2025-CY2029 five-year period

Capital Revenues:

• The annual Section 5307 formula fund allocations are assumed to grow slightly and then remain constant over the five-year planning period. The annual Section 5337 formula fund allocations are assumed to decline over the five-year planning period.

Debt Service:

During the CY2025-CY2029 five-year period, the RTA will pay \$0 debt service

SECTION 6

TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM MANAGEMENT AND OPERATIONS

INTRODUCTION

In an effort to alleviate the pressures of increasing costs of maintaining and building transportation systems, communities are seeking better and less expensive ways of providing their citizens with efficient and safe transportation facilities. As a result, a planning process known as Transportation System Management (TSM) has become an important part of regional transportation planning. TSM is a planning approach designed to improve transportation systems by moving people and goods more efficiently and effectively. By improving the existing transportation system, it may be possible to reduce delay and/or eliminate the need to develop new expensive transportation facilities. Also, with increased concerns about energy consumption and air pollution, improving the existing transportation system is a viable method of addressing these issues.

As the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Dayton Urbanized Area, the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission (MVRPC) is responsible for the Transportation System Management planning process in Greene, Miami and Montgomery Counties and the jurisdictions of Carlisle, Franklin, Springboro and Franklin Township in Warren County. The Ohio Department of Transportation, the Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority, Greene County Transit Board (Greene CATS), Miami County Transit, and officials and staff from local jurisdictions, citizens and the private sector aid the Commission in this planning process. This report summarizes TSM activities undertaken or completed in CY2023 and CY2024 and highlights TSM activities proposed for CY2025 and CY2026.

TSM PLANNING PROCESS

By implementing the TSM planning process, the transportation system within the region is looked at as a single entity. The planning process is then applied to this single entity in an effort to improve the efficiency and cost effectiveness of the total system through low cost improvements and strategies to reduce overall system demands.

Generally, there are three approaches to TSM planning. The first approach is low cost operation or spot improvements, which are designed to improve roadway efficiency and safety at specific problem locations. Examples of spot improvements are the addition of a turn lane at an intersection and improvements in traffic signalization.

The second approach is a corridor area access control study. This is a comprehensive analysis of transportation problems along roadway corridors like the US35 corridor in Greene County, which is experiencing rapid development. As a part of the TSM planning process, transportation problems are identified and solutions are generated to address them.

The third TSM planning approach involves Travel Demand Management (TDM) activities. These activities have regional impact and ease pressures on the entire transportation system by reducing vehicle trip demand, especially for commuting purposes. These activities involve reducing the use of single occupant vehicles and/or altering the time of travel to less congested time periods or locations. Such activities

include ridesharing, transit service improvements, bicycle improvements, pedestrian improvements, controlled growth and land use development, flexible work schedules, telecommuting, coordination among social services agencies and public transit systems.

TSM ACTIVITIES

Usually, TSM improvements do not require great outlays of money and can be put into place within a short period of time. The desired result, then, is an improvement of traffic flow, ease of pedestrian movement and enhanced transit and bicycle travel. Since TSM improvements vary from highly visible intersection improvements to minor changes in traffic signal timing, some TSM improvements go unnoticed. These relatively unnoticeable changes are important parts of the TSM planning process.

During 2023 and 2024, area communities implemented a variety of TSM spot improvements. These projects are expected to result in decreased congestion, reduced overall vehicle delay, and improved safety.

Another MVRPC TSM planning emphasis is transportation demand reduction activities, which have regional impact and help improve the entire transportation system. Ridesharing is a TSM strategy that encourages the sharing of rides among people who live in the same general area and commute to similar destinations. MVRPC sponsors a program called RIDESHARE! that promotes and facilitates this activity.

Transit is another TSM strategy with regional impact. Greater Dayton Regional Transit Authority (GDRTA), Miami County Transit, and Greene County Transit Board (Greene CATS) conducted a wide range of TSM activities in 2023 and 2024 and plan for more for 2025 and 2026.

Table 6.1 is a listing of TSM improvements, which were completed or implemented in 2023 and 2024. The list is categorized by highway/bikeway, RIDESHARE and transit projects. Table 6.2 is a listing of proposed TSM improvements, which are to be implemented in 2025 or 2026. This table is also categorized by highway/bikeway, RIDESHARE and transit projects. Please note that the highway category also includes bicycle and pedestrian improvements.

SECTION 7

THE AIRPORT IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

(Source: City of Dayton Department of Aviation)

The Dayton International Airport spans over 4,500 acres in both Montgomery and Miami Counties. The airport encompasses approximately 5 miles of runway and has more than 650 acres of non-aeronautical readily developable land. Even with recent mergers, the Dayton International Airport is fortunate to be served by four major commercial airlines. There are approximately 29 daily arriving and departing flights from the Airport. They leave from 12 active airline gates that provide nonstop service to 12 destinations and one-stop service to all major U.S. cities and beyond. It goes without saying that the Dayton International Airport is the region's key component in growing and preserving our economy. According to State of Ohio data, the Dayton International Airport has a \$1 Billion economic impact on the regional economy.

The Past 5 Years

Progress on the Airport Terminal Modernization Program continues. In the past 5 years, the airport completed the Public Circulation Enhancement project (Phase IIa). It widens the checkpoint and extends the modern look of Phase I with the terrazzo flooring, updated energy efficient lighting and new finishes passed the check point inside the terminal. The project also enlarged the windows in Concourse "A" to enhance the natural lighting in step with our Sustainability Plan.

The Airport Terminal Modernization Program delivers a fresh environmentally friendly design to present a more modern front door to the airport. The design creates an open configuration with greater daylight and a brighter feel, while still providing good protection of people and vehicles at the curb. New wide expanses of glazing (glass) along the exterior facade brings natural light into the terminal and improves visibility of transportation arrivals and departures. New brighter and energy efficient lighting enhances the customer experience and saves energy. The sidewalk has been re-graded, removing the curb to make it more ADA accessible. It is easier to load and unload passengers and their luggage and helps alleviate congestion. The Airport continues to implement an Airport Sustainability Master Plan. The goal is to maintain and enhance the Dayton International Airport as a vibrant asset that serves the needs of the Dayton-Miami Valley residents and businesses, promote economic growth in the region, and operate in an economically and environmentally sustainable manner. By doing so, we conserve natural resources and protect the entire airport environment.

Maintaining the Airport Infrastructure is vital to the sustained viability of the airport. At a cost of Over \$15 Million dollars, we completed Phase IV of the Terminal Apron Rehabilitation project. The project included the demolition and replacement of approx. 54,000 square yards of the Terminal center apron concrete. An unintended benefit of the Covid19 slowdown was the contractor could take larger areas out-of-service without impacting the operation. They were able to complete the project in fewer phases and record time. Originally scheduled for three years, the project took just over one year to complete.

In 2024, Terminal Drive was rehabilitated with new asphalt and repairs to the concrete traffic loop servicing the Airport Terminal. This project complemented the Ohio Department of Transportation 2019 investment to repave the Airport Access Road between I70 and the City of Dayton Corporate Limits, as well as the current investment in upgrading US 40 (National Road) between Airport Access Road overpass to Union Airpark. This project directly contributes to the immediate and long-term economic viability of the Airport. It allows for a welcoming, smooth, and easy access to the facility, enhancing customer experience.

The Future

Design is underway for the next phases of the Airport Terminal Modernization Program as we continue to enhance the passenger experience. These next phases include the following:

Concourse B Modernization - DAY received \$2 million from the State of Ohio to modernize Concourse B, including updating the common areas, infrastructure, HVAC, lighting, windows, and more.

Passenger Boarding Bridge Replacement - DAY received an Airport Improvement Program grant to replace six passenger boarding bridges, the project is anticipated to start in the summer of 2025 and finish in 2026.

Escalator Modernization -After 20 years of continuous service, the escalators in both Concourse A and B are undergoing modernization with a process that will completely rebuild each unit with new components. When complete, the escalators will offer a smoother, quieter operation as well as energy savings and increased reliability.





Airport Master Plan

The Airport Master Plan, which evaluates the future of the airport as a whole, (not to be confused with the Terminal Master Plan described above) has been completed! An Airport Master Plan is a technical document from an airport management and operational perspective to guide future growth and development of the Airport. It provides a road map for meeting aviation demand through the foreseeable future while preserving the flexibility necessary to respond to changing industry trends. To supplement the master plan document, an Airport Layout Plan (ALP) is used to graphically depict the existing and proposed conditions of an airport, as required by the FAA.

This Master Plan update looked at the last 14 years and into the next 20 years to determine what the airport will look like and how it will function. It includes a review of prior planning efforts conducted for the Airport and analyzed market conditions and future facility requirements. This update reflects the actual conditions today and determines what facility upgrades are needed for the Airport of tomorrow. Dayton International Airport and Sinclair Community College Aircraft Mechanic Training Center

The Dayton International Airport and Sinclair Community College, in conjunction with PSA Airlines, collaborated to develop and renovate a hangar at the airport to create the Sinclair Aircraft Mechanic Training Center. The project renovated ~14,000 square feet for the Aviation Maintenance training center and labs, and ~2,800 square feet for the classrooms and administrative office. It contains two classrooms and two lab spaces. The labs have access to the airfield side of the airport which provides valuable hands-on learning opportunities for students to work on commercial and cargo aircraft through PSA Airlines. The Training Center is dedicated to aircraft mechanics and aviation service maintenance, in-demand career fields.

The training center provides significant financial benefits to the region. Graduates of this program are well-positioned for high-paying mechanic and maintenance jobs with many airline and aviation companies, including PSA Airlines and SNC, thus strengthening the viability of the Dayton region's air travel economy.

SNC's New Aerospace Maintenance Facility

The Airport's Defense and Aerospace Campus development continues as the Sierra Nevada Corporation, or SNC, continues to expand their campus. They established themselves as a prominent member of the Airport community with their first aerospace maintenance facility specifically designed to accommodate very large aircraft (i.e., Boeing 747 and Lockheed C-5 aircraft). This first 90,000sqft hangar is located on a six-acre site on the north side of the airport.

In the fall of 2024, the Airport celebrated SNC's ribbon cutting to open the SNC Aviation Innovation & Technology Center (AITC), their second 100,000-square-foot aircraft maintenance, repair, and overhaul (MRO) facility at the Dayton International Airport. That same day, they broke ground on the third and fourth hangars, set to be built to accommodate a \$13 billion Air Force contract to update the Survivable Airborne Operations Center aircraft.

We are proud to be the home of the SNC Aviation Innovation & Technology Center (AITC). SNC is the first private-sector company to do maintenance, repair, and modification work on military aircraft in Dayton since the World War II era.

Economic Development

Economic Development around the airport continues to flourish. Nearly 14 years ago, Proctor and Gamble opened a 1.8 million square foot distribution center adjacent to the airport, which employs up to 1,400 people. This development sparked continued growth in the immediate area.

In 2016, Chewy opened a 700,000 square foot fulfillment center, growing to 1,200 new jobs today.

In 2019, on lands immediately adjacent to the airport, Crocs entered the region with a new 550,000 square foot warehouse and distribution building. The following year, they expanded into a second building and now employ 1,200 people in more than one million square feet of space.

Other companies that moved into this area include Spectrum Brands, Pratt Industries, ALPLA, Purina Mills, and General Pet Supply. Combined, these industries have created 2,700 new jobs, with plans to add more.

In 2021, the same developer that invested in most of the new warehouse facilities for the companies referenced above, purchased lands northeast of the airport to develop an additional 500,000 square foot facility that is expected to bring in 400 additional jobs. Two other developers are building large industrial facilities near the airport. One building will be 1.2 million square feet with 700 employees. Another building is 55,000 square feet and is occupied by Fast Track It, an online auctioneer. In the City of Union, located just west of the airport, Amazon has constructed a new 630,000 square foot fulfillment center, which is expected to bring in 1,500 additional jobs.

In 2022 and 2023, Three more facilities were added to the airport environment. Infinity Global moved into a new 499,000 sqft facility on North Dixie Drive. They share this facility with SNC, for temporary storage of aircraft parts.

Amazon's "Last Mile" 141,360 sqft delivery hub was established to support the nearby fulfillment center. Diakin Applied Distribution Center and Spectra Precision located in a new 260,000 sqft facility on Logistics Lane on the west side of the Airport. Together, these developments add over 500 additional jobs.

American Airlines is the largest single passenger carrier, as shown in Table 7.2, at the airport. The number of carriers at the airport has varied over the years mostly due to airline mergers. A joint effort by the City of Dayton; the Dayton Chamber of Commerce, the Dayton Development Coalition, and Jobs Ohio continues to market to prospective passenger airlines in an effort to attract more service.

As shown in Table 7.3, during 2024, total passenger enplanements at the Dayton International Airport were 645930. That is an increase of approximately 16.6 percent from total passenger enplanements in 2021. This increase continues to illustrate the recovery from the Covid-19 pandemic, where Dayton saw a 62.2 percent drop in enplanements in 2020. In addition, the airline industry continues to see pilot and staffing shortages, along with fuel prices, that are slowing the recovery.

O&D passengers indicate the true measure of an airport's ability to attract local passengers. This data eliminates the influence of connecting passengers.

AIR CARGO FORECAST

The airport's air cargo witnessed a 1.4% increase in weight in 2024 compared to YE-2023. FedEx cargo weight has fluctuated throughout the post pandemic years as it deals with the supply chain/recovery of the pandemic aftermath.

AIRPORT CAPITAL PLAN

A copy of the Airport Capital Improvements Program (ACIP) is attached and shows a listing of the anticipated Airport Improvement Program (AIP) projects for FY 2025-FY2034. As the future evolves, this list is subject to change.

The ACIP is a grant-based funding program provided by the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). It is a FAA/Airport Match program through which the FAA invests 90% of the eligible cost of an Airport improvement with a 10% Airport (local) match. The program utilizes the following types of federal funding.

The Entitlement funding is based on enplanements. This is the number of people that travel on aircraft from the Airport. The funding is guaranteed for projects that meet the FAA's requirements.

In addition to the entitlement funds, the airport is eligible for AIP discretionary grants. These grants can only be received if the airport is completing the highest priority projects from the FAA's perspective. They are competitive grants, and the Dayton International Airport competes with other airports for this money.

Additionally, the FAA has offered Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act funding distributed as the Airport Terminal Program (ATP) and the Airport Infrastructure Grant (AIG) funding program. The ATP is a very competitive program, and the Airport competes with other airports around the country for this very competitive source of money.

Similar to the Entitlement funding, the AIG funding is made available to Dayton International Airport at a pre-determined amount, based on enplanements. The planned funding is identified in the attached ACIP spreadsheet.

Additionally, the airport also utilizes passenger facility charges to fund projects when available and appropriate. Furthermore, the Airport seeks additional funding sources through various State. local, and other Economic Development programs when appropriate.
