
"Our community volunteers advocate for the best interest of children, making a real difference in their lives," says Greene County Juvenile Court CASA Director Greta McKenzie.

After undergoing a background check, 33 hours of comprehensive training and in-court observation, CASA volunteers are appointed by a judge to advocate for children in abuse or neglect cases. "CASA volunteers are so important in the courtroom," says Judge Amy Lewis of Greene County Juvenile Court. "They spend a lot of time with the child and gather a multitude of information, ultimately making recommendations to the court about what would be best moving forward. They do this through a lens of what would be best for the child."
